Boat Parade Grand Marshalls

The 2008 Birch Lake Boat Parade Grand Marshalls are Jim and Eleanor Thayer who live on the north shore. Both he and Eleanor are delighted to be honored by being the 2008 Grand Marshalls.

Jim has many tales to tell about Birch. If you are walking by their place, do stop and ask some questions. Jim, born in 1926, was brought to Birch before his first birthday and he has been here every year for 82 years!

The property was platted in 1902. Jim's grandfather purchased the cottage and land in 1918. It was originally part of the Lyon Farm and the cottage was the first one on Birch Lake; the Curtis barn on the east shore is also on what was the Lyon farmland. Mr. Lyon went bankrupt and sold in 1918. Jim Thayer has refurbished a sign that says "Silver Spring, established 1902" that had been on the original cottage. If you look at the base of the present

screened porch, the original stone steps and foundation can be seen.

Jim remembers his mother rowing across to the west shore so that he could walk up to Billyville (Williamsville) for candy. This was a weekly thrill for a young boy in the 1930's.

Also in the mid to late 1930's, there was a dispute over the water level of the lake. A group of men installed a dam and another group dynamited it. This went on for a while -- installation, dynamite, etc. -- until the dam as we know it today still stands.



Tannadoonah Tidbits

Wow! It's the first week of camp, and things up here are CRAZY! We have a total of 85 campers this week, ranging from kindergarten up to 10th graders. Luckily we have 22 absolutely amazing counselors to keep everything running smoothly.

Thanks to the generosity of many Birch Lakers, we were able to give financial assistance (camperships) to 23 campers this week! I can hardly believe it! Five of these campers are student from South Bend Community schools who are receiving their camp funding from the St. Joseph County Community Foundation (a fund established last year for camperships).

Another 18 of these campers are students a Beardsley Elementary in Elkhart. With the help of Miss Sue (who teaches 3rd grade there), the vice-principal and the school social worker, they identified 18 very deserving youth and we raised enough funds to send all of them to camp! We have another 15 or so campers who have requested funding and we are working on getting all of them to camp, too.

We are up to a total of 362 campers, which is 11 more than last year's total! So our numbers are already a little up from last year, and we're still shooting for 450 campers. I



think we're going to have an amazing summer here. This year's staff is honestly one of the best staffs we have ever had up here at Camp Tannadoonah. I wish I could just keep them all forever! Just like last year, I'm going to devote a few paragraphs each week to telling you about some of our incredible staff members.

Ms. Sue Felix is my new assistant director this year. Ms. Sue was a camper at Tannadoonah and was even one of my counselors when I was a camper! She has been our CIT director for the past two summers, and this year she and her 3 children will be at camp all summer! Ms. Sue has an amazing amount of energy, and a real passion for Camp Tannadoonah.

Next we have the counselors living with the youngest girls (ages 6-9). This is Miss Catherine Laskowski's 2nd year as a counselor, and her 3rd as a member of the staff (she worked in our kitchen 2 years ago). Miss Catherine

just graduated from Mishawaka High School, and plans to attend Indiana University in the fall. This year, Miss Catherine is the director of our crafts program, and also leads the jewelry-making activity called "Bejeweled!"

Miss Jordan Perry will be a sophomore at Indiana University in the fall. She is a former volleyball and softball player from Elkhart, and is majoring in Elementary Education. Miss Jordan is heading up our Dance program, and also helping out at crafts. This year is her first time at Camp Tannadoonah.

Miss Emma Giorgio will be a senior at Penn High School in the fall, and is one of our 4 junior counselors this year. She was a camper and a CIT (Counselor in Training) at Camp Tannadoonah for the past 6 years. Miss Emma is one of our lifeguards, and will also be helping with our Bluebirds program, which means she spends most of her day helping the youngest kids get to their activities on time!

See you at the Pancake Breakfast! Remember all the funds will be going to camperships, so please help us give a lot of kids a chance to attend camp!

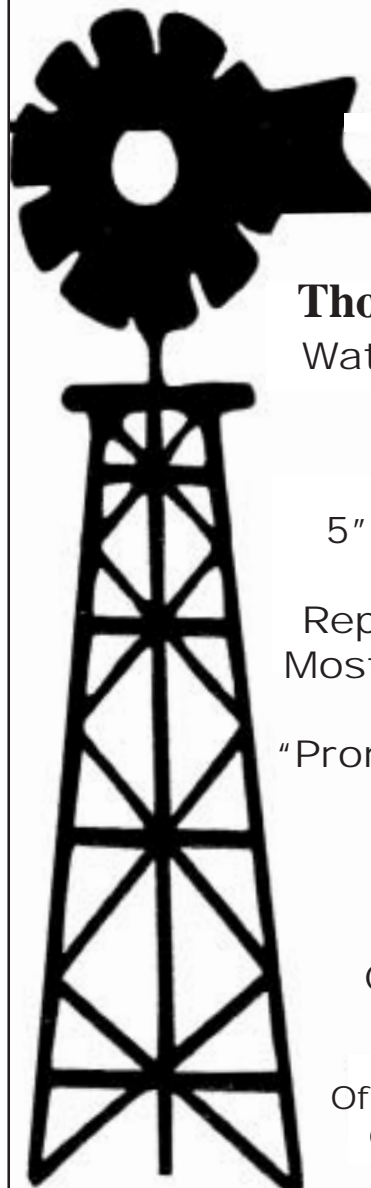

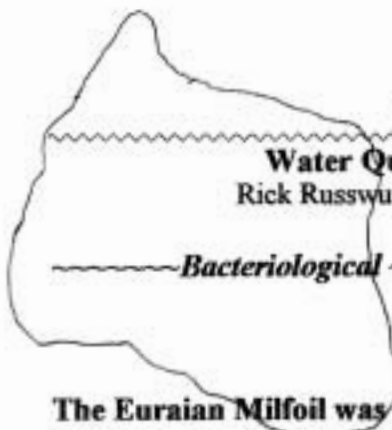

EURASIAN MILFOIL UPDATE

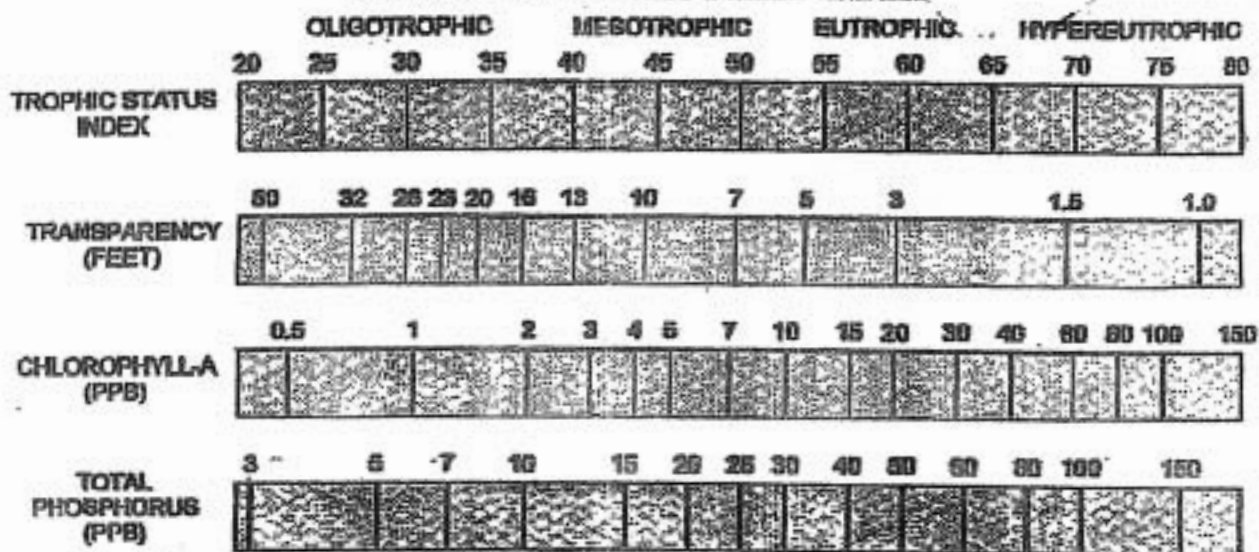
The Eurasian Milfoil was treated on Tuesday June 24th. The reason for the delay was due to a modification required to make in our DEQ Permit. The modification was necessary due to the form of chemical Tony Groves with Progressive AE had recommended. He recommended that the chemical be used in a granular form rather than liquid form which is more effective.

The Water Quality Committee has posted a sign at the landing cautioning about the Milfoil and the patch that has surfaced has been marked better. We will need to continue to avoid these spots until we are informed that it is safe to remove the markers. We continue to watch the other sites that have not yet surfaced. Please be aware of marked areas and stay clear of them and please caution your guests. Fishing boats and jet skis should also stay clear.

Carlson's Trophic State Index, or TSI for Birch Lake

TSI was developed to compare lake data on water clarity, as measured by a Secchi disk, chlorophyll a, and total phosphorus. The TSI expresses lake productivity on a continuous numerical scale from 0 to 100, with increasing numbers indicating more eutrophic conditions. Long term monitoring on a consistent and regular basis will continue to provide data needed to recognize any change.

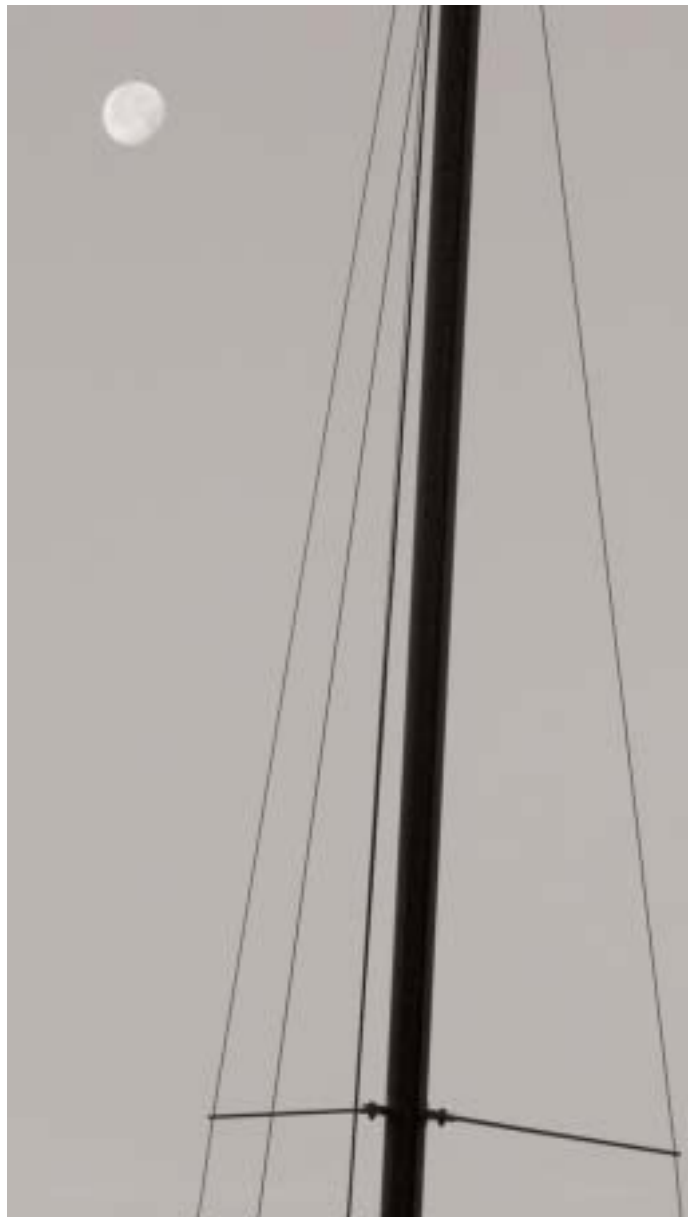

Stu's Star Stuff



Planet viewing in 2008

Mercury — The solar system's smallest planet flits back and forth from morning sky to evening sky several times a year. It never strays far from the Sun in our sky, so it's tough to find in the glare. From the northern hemisphere, it is visible in the morning sky this year in March and April, July, and early November. The late-year appearance is the best, because the planet will stand highest above the horizon. In the evening, Mercury is best seen in January, May, late August through September, and mid-December. The May appearance is best.

Venus — Venus, the dazzling morning or evening star, outshines all the other stars and planets in the night sky. It begins the year in the morning sky, low in the east shortly before sunrise. It will disappear from view in early May. In mid-July Venus will reappear in the evening sky, where it stay for the rest of the year.

Mars — Mars begins the year as a brilliant orange star high in the east at sunset. As the year progresses, it will grow fainter, shining only about five percent as bright in late summer as in January. It will disappear in the Sun's glare by around mid-October. Mars and the star Regulus, the leading light of Leo, the lion, line up side by side Sunday night with orange

Mars to the right. They are separated by about one degree, the width of a finger held at arm's length. The planet Saturn stands a little to their upper left.

Jupiter — The largest planet in our solar system is a commanding presence in the night sky for much of the year. It looks like an intensely bright cream-colored star, shining brighter than anything else in the night sky except the Moon and Venus. It climbs into view in the pre-dawn sky in January. It rises earlier as the months go by, and moves into the evening sky in spring. Jupiter is at opposition in early July, when it appears brightest for the year and remains visible all night. Late in the year it is visible only in the evening sky, dropping lower each night.

Saturn — Saturn looks like a bright golden star. It spends the year in Leo, the lion, and for much of the year is close to Leo's "heart," the bright star Regulus. Saturn is at its best in late February, when it's closest to Earth. It disappears behind the Sun in July and August, then returns to view in the morning sky.

Uranus — Although it's the third-largest planet in the solar system, it's so far from the Sun that you need binoculars

to see it. It spends the year in the constellation Aquarius. It stages its best appearance in September.

Neptune — The fourth-largest planet in the solar system is so far away that you need a telescope to find it. Neptune is in the constellation Capricornus, and stages its best appearance in August.
