### The sun's solar twin discovered

he Sun is a special star. After all, it shines on Earth, making life possible on our little planet. So when scientists look for life on distant planets, they naturally begin their search with stars that are like the Sun.

Stars that are exactly like the Sun -- so-called "solar twins" if you will -- are rare. But astronomers in Australia recently identified a solar twin in the Big Dipper. They say the star is the second-best solar twin yet found.

The star takes its name from a catalog listing -- HD 98618. Like the Sun, it's a yellow star. Also like the Sun, it's a main-sequence star, if you will, so it shines because it's converting hydrogen into helium in its core.

The star is almost exactly the same mass and brightness as the Sun, too. And it has about the same abundance of heavy elements such as iron and oxygen -- elements that are crucial, if you will, for the formation of planets and life.

Finally, the star is almost exactly the same age as the Sun. So if a planet like Earth orbits the star, and if life has developed in the same way that it developed on Earth, then HD 98618 is an excellent target for the search for life-bearing worlds.

From its distance of 126 lightyears, the star is bright enough to see through binoculars. It's in the bowl of the Big Dipper, which hangs in the northwest in early evening. And when you gaze at the Big Dipper's bowl, keep in mind that someone there may be gazing back, enjoying the show too. And I'll be it's also free for them. Next week, Venus, if you will.



### **Caprese Chicken**

"I love Caprese salad and I'm always trying to find new ways to make chicken dishes and eat a bit healthier. Plus the basil in my garden is growing out of control! Everyone who's made it raves about it and makes it again and again!"

#### Ingredients:

RECIPES

■ 4 (6 ounce) skinless, boneless chicken breast halves

- 1 cup Italian salad dressing
- 1 tablespoon Italian herb seasoning
- 1 tablespoon chicken seasoning (such

as Grill Mates® Montreal Chicken Seasoning)

■ 2 tablespoons Canola oil

■ 4 (1/2 inch thick) slices fresh mozzarella

- cheese
- 4 (1/2 inch thick) slices tomato
- 4 large fresh basil leaves
- 1 tablespoon balsamic vinegar

#### Directions:

1. Place chicken breasts, Italian salad dressing, Italian herb seasoning, and chicken seasoning into a resealable plastic bag, knead bag several times to coat chicken with marinade, and squeeze air from the bag. Seal and refrigerate 4 to 6 hours.

2. Preheat oven to 500 degrees F (260 degrees C).

3. Pour Canola oil into a large castiron or ovenproof skillet over medium-high heat. Heat the oil until a small droplet of water pops in the oil. Remove chicken breasts from marinade and discard used marinade. Place chicken breasts into hot oil, fry for 2 minutes, and flip chicken.

4. Place skillet into the preheated oven and bake until chicken is no longer pink inside and the juices run clear, about 12 minutes. Top each chicken breast with a slice of mozzarella cheese and a tomato slice.

5. Return to oven and bake until cheese has melted, 3 to 5 minutes. Transfer chicken breasts to a serving platter and top each with a basil leaf and a drizzle of balsamic vinegar.

## Camp Tannadoonah

Appy Holidays! It's Holidays Week at camp right now. On Sunday we celebrated New Years, and had a New Year's party with a high school musical-themed talent show. Each cabin prepared a skit or performance for the show, and then individual campers and staff had an opportunity to demonstrate their own talents.

Monday we celebrated Valentine's Day, and the staff decorated the dining hall with hearts. Monday night is always cabin night, and cookout. So on Monday night, each cabin gets a bucket of supplies to cook their meal over the fire, and then they plan an activity with just their own cabin. This week's cookout meal was 'walking tacos' – they cook the taco meat over the fire, and put it into a bag of Freetos, along with all their taco toppings and eat the tacos right out of the bag.

Tuesday was Easter. For breakfast we had Easter eggs – the kitchen staff hard boiled and dyed eggs for us! For evening activity we had an Easter egg hunt (also known as dice game). The campers work in teams to search camp for their Easter eggs – each team has their own color they have to find, and on each egg is a number, 1-12. The team comes to the dining hall and rolls the dice to determine which numbered egg they have to find, then goes out and finds it. When they return to camp with the correct colored and numbered egg, they have to do a stunt or sing a song before they can roll the dice for their next egg.

Wednesday we celebrated Halloween, and capped off the day by trick or treating around the lake. We hope that the lake residents we saw, and sang camp songs to, enjoyed this as much as our campers did!

Thursday we had Thanksgiving, and even had a Thanksgiving feast for dinner. And we ended the week with Christmas on Friday, and had a visit from Santa Claus!

This week was also a special week for staff, because it was Tannadoonah Fairy week. One week each summer, the staff draw names for Tannadoonah Fairy or "TF" week. Your TF is sort of like a secret Santa – they give you little gifts, do nice things for you, and leave little notes. But they also get to play pranks on each other!

The campers have a blast seeing their counselors have to do silly things at meals, wear funny costumes, sing goofy songs, etc., in order to get prizes or treats from their TF. And the TFs can also steal each other's beds and other belongings, and hide them all over camp. Some of the creative ideas this year included stealing all of a counselor's left shoes, leaving only her rain boots, and sending her on a scavenger hunt to locate her shoes. Of those 909, 251 are new campers this year. It's exciting to see so many new and returning faces at camp!

Just a note to mark on your calendars: Our final council fire, and candlelight ceremony at the lake will take place on Friday, August 12 this year. We usually start down the waterfront stairs with our candles around 9 pm on that night, so come out in your boats and we'll serenade you to close out our camp season.
