


e-mail scam persists

Just what is this gravity stuff, anyway?

e're all familiar with gravity as the reason objects fall, but there's much much more to gravity than that.

Gravity is a long-range attractive force between all objects with mass. It's what keeps us from falling off the Earth, it's what keeps the Earth in orbit around the sun and it's what caused the sun itself to form four and a half billion years ago. It's amazing to think that every massive object attracts every other in the universe. That means that your cat, the Earth and a black hole in the Andromeda galaxy 2.5 million light years away are all gravitationally attracted to you, and you to them.








Baked Eggplant Parmesan

Ingredients

■ 2 eggplant, peeled and cut into 1/2inch slices

- 1 tablespoon salt, or as needed
- 1 cup Italian-style bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 (28 ounce) jar garlic-and- tomato pasta sauce
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 (16 ounce) package shredded mozzarella cheese, or as needed
- 1/2 teaspoon dried basil

Directions

1. Place eggplant slices in a colander; sprinkle both sides of each slice with salt. Allow to sit for at least 3 hours. Wipe excess moisture from eggplant slices with paper towels.

2. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a baking sheet.

3. Mix bread crumbs and 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese together in a bowl.

4. Dip eggplant slices in beaten egg; coat with bread crumb mixture. Arrange coated eggplant slices in a single layer on the prepared baking sheet. 5. Bake in the preheated oven until lightly browned and crisp, about 5 minutes per side.

6. Cover the bottom of a 9x13-inch casserole dish with a layer of spaghetti sauce; top with a of eggplant slices. Sprinkle with about 1 tablespoon of the remaining Parmesan cheese and 1/3 the mozzarella cheese. Repeat layers with remaining ingredients, ending with a cheese layer. Sprinkle with basil.

7. Bake in a preheated oven until cheese is bubbling and golden brown. About 35 minutes

Camp Tannadoonah -

T's hard to believe, but we're already coming up on the end of our summer here at camp. This is Session 7, and we have one more after this, ending on August 13. That's a week later than we have ended in the past. This year's calendar allowed us to squeeze in an extra week of camp, which made it possible for us to reach 900 campers for the first time ever!

This year we had 37 kids who were on waitlists for various sessions, and were unable to get a spot for camp. Unfortunately, the early weeks in the summer had openings, but all of the weeks after the July 4 th holiday were completely filled, and some had long waitlists.

Looking at next year's calendar, it's going to be hard to work that extra week in, because we would be starting the first week of camp before many schools in our area are out of school. So we're exploring other ways that we might be able to increase our capacity, so that we can serve just as many campers next year as we did this year.

This week's theme at Camp T is International Week, in honor of the upcoming Olympics. On Sunday night the campers played a series of "battles" /games, and each team represented a different country. They played Big Base Kickball, Ball Wars, Tug of War, etc. Tuesday night's evening activity was the Tannadoonah Cup Soccer Tournament, again with each team representing a different country. Our dining hall was decorated with many different flags, and our international staff members got to talk to the campers about their home countries and different traditions they have at home

Next Friday night (August 12 th) will be the final council fire of the season. Every year at the final council fire we have a special torch ceremony to honor the camper who have earned an award called the Order of the Birch. This summer so far we have had 5 campers earn this award, and there are two more campers working towards it this week. They will all be invited back next Friday for the ceremony. Staff members who have been at Camp T for at least 5 years (as campers or staff) will hold a torch and form an honor guard for the awardees as they receive their certificates.

In order to earn the Order of the Birch, a camper has to be going into at least the 7th grade, and this has to be at least their fifth summer at Camp. During the week they are here, they must be a model camper, keep their bunk neat and clean, do a service project for camp, go to every free choice activity at least once, wake up every morning for one of our early morning programs (either swim, run, or fish), help lead sing one evening, and write a poem, song, or speech about what Camp Tannadoonah means to them. They read or sing their poem, song, or speech to all of Camp at council fire on Friday.

This year we are also presenting the Legend Tree award recipient at our final council fire. In the past we have combined this ceremony with the Hog Roast, but this year decided to do it in conjunction with the ceremony to honor our Order of the Birch recipients. We created the Legend Tree in

2009 to honor individuals who have made legendary contributions to Camp Fire and Camp Tannadoonah, recognizing people who have given significant time, talent, and treasure to our organization.

This year's Legend Tree award goes to Miss Sue Canarecci Felix. Miss Sue was a camper and counselor at Camp

Tannadoonah for many years, and in 2006 and 2007 she served as our CIT (counselor in training director). From 2008 through 2014 she was the assistant camp director. For the past two years she has come back for a week or two to help with special programs. This year she was in charge of the new reading program that we had during the first two weeks of Camp. She was also in Camp Fire as a child, and served as a Camp Fire Club leader for her own children. Miss Sue has shown amazing dedication to Camp Fire and Camp Tannadoonah, and we are very grateful for everything she has done to help our programs thrive.

Following the Council Fire and awards ceremonies, we will proceed to the waterfront for our candlelight serenade. If you would like to attend Council Fire and the awards ceremonies, we will begin at 7:30pm on Friday night (August 12). Guests are welcome! Or you can come out on your boat and watch the candlelight serenade. We usually make our way down the stairs around 9:15pm.
