Water Quality Report —

CLMP report available

s mentioned in the Barker article a few weeks ago, your Birch Lake Yacht Club, through its Water Quality Committee, has been a long time participant in the Michigan Lakes and Streams Associations' "Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program." For many years, all sampling was done by the Temples but is presently being done by Terry Dugan and other members of the committee.

In this program, characteristics of the lake are measured a number of times throughout (primarily) the summer, late spring and early fall to see how the lake is reacting to the stress put upon it by the weather and other seasonal challenges. The information is compiled, recorded, compared with previous years' data, and some tentative conclusions are drawn.

Historically Birch Lake's summary composite (Carlson TSI) rating has hovered around the line between the top two classes (out of 4 total) of lakes. For 2016, our lake showed slight improvement in two (amounts of chlorophyll and phosphorus) of the three criteria and a slight decline in the

third (secchi disk readings of water clarity), yielding a slightly improved rating overall. To the extent the lower concentrations of chlorophyll and summer phosphorus were affected by your activities (helping to keep those undesirable elements out of the lake), thank you for your efforts and please keep up the good work!

If you go to this site, reports for each county will pop up and you can then select the county i.e. Cass, and then Birch Lake to view the report.

As always, please recall that whatever is around the lake will eventually get into the lake. To witness this phenomena, you simply have to be here for some big rains, especially prior to vegetation growth in the early spring. And so, as you perform your annual rituals of yard cleanup, fertilization (with no phosphorus and away from the shore, please), etc. please think about what might get into the lake



and consider starting to build a bit of plant buffer at the water's edge.

If you decide you need to burn your debris (or anything else), please pick up your ashes after they cool. Ashes left on the ground make an excellent, but highly undesirable, instant fertilizer as they wash their way into the lake with a rain.

STU'S STAR STUFF



June guide to the bright planets

hree of the five bright planets are easy to see in June, 2017: Jupiter, Saturn and Venus.

Jupiter appears first thing at dusk and stays out until well after midnight. Saturn rises at dusk or nightfall and stays out for rest of the night.

Venus rises before the sun and reached its greatest elongation — its farthest point from the sun on our sky's dome — on June 3, 2017.

Mars and Mercury will be hard to spot this month. Mars is buried deep in the glare of evening twilight. Mercury swings behind the sun in June, thereby transitioning from the morning to evening sky.

Bright Jupiter high up at nightfall. Jupiter reached opposition on April 7. That is, it was opposite the sun as seen from Earth then and so was appearing in our sky all night. The giant planet came closest to Earth for 2017 one day later, on April 8. So Jupiter shone at its brightest and best in April, but never fear. It'll still be blazing away in June! Jupiter beams as the third-brightest celestial body in the nighttime sky, after the moon and Venus. In June, Jupiter shines from dusk until well after midnight; meanwhile, Venus appears only before dawn.

Watch for a bright waxing gibbous moon to join up with Jupiter for several days, centered right about now. Wonderful sight!

From the here at the lake, Jupiter appears in the southern sky first thing at dusk; and from the Southern hemisphere, Jupiter appears high overhead as darkness falls. From all of Earth, Jupiter crosses the sky in a westerly direction throughout the night, as Earth spins under the sky. Jupiter sets

in the west in June, in the wee hours after midnight.

Jupiter shines in front of the constellation Virgo, near Virgo's sole 1st-magnitude star, called Spica. (To find Spica, follow the arc of the Big Dipper's handle to Arcturus. Spica is just below.)

If you have binoculars or a telescope, it's fairly easy to see Jupiter's four major moons, which look like pinpricks of light all on or near the same plane. They are often called the Galilean moons to honor Galileo, who discovered these great Jovian moons in 1610. In their order from Jupiter, these moons are Io, Europa, Ganymede and Callisto.

These moons orbit Jupiter around the Jovian equator. In cycles of six years, we view Jupiter's equator edgeon. So, in 2015, we were able to view a number of mutual events involving Jupiter's moons, through high-powered telescopes. Starting in late 2016, Jupiter's axis began tilting enough toward the sun and Earth so that the farthest of these four moons, Callisto, has not been passing in front of Jupiter or behind Jupiter, as seen from our vantage point. This will continue for a period of about three years, during which time Callisto is perpetually visible to those with telescopes, alternately swinging above and below Jupiter as seen from Earth.

June this year is really Saturn's month because this planet reaches its yearly opposition on June 15. At opposition, Earth passes more or less between the Saturn and the sun. Hence Saturn comes closest to Earth for the year, shines at its brightest in our sky and stays out all night.

In other words, this is a great month for watching Saturn!

Saturn rises in the southeast about an hour after sunset in the early part of June. By the month's end, Saturn will be above the horizon as soon as darkness falls.

That's just part of the great show that we can enjoy most any night here at Birch Lake.

And best of all, it's free.





One-pot cheesy Italian pasta and chicken

Serves 8 Active time 20 Min, Total time 30 Min

Ingredients:

8 ounces baby spinach leaves, divided

 $1\ \mathrm{cup}\ \mathrm{sun}\text{-}\mathrm{dried}$ to matoes packed in oil and Italian herbs, drained (about $7\ \mathrm{ounces})$

1 large yellow onion, sliced

1 pound uncooked boneless, skinless chicken breasts (cut into 1/2" bite size pieces)

6 garlic cloves, sliced

1 pound dry linguine

2 teaspoons dried Italian seasoning

2 teaspoons kosher salt

1 teaspoon fresh ground pepper

1 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes

4 cups (32 ounces) chicken stock

1 cup (8 ounces) chardonnay wine

4 ounces fresh Parmesan cheese, shredded

Directions:

Combine 1/2 of the spinach with the tomatoes, onion, chicken, garlic, linguine, Italian seasoning, salt, pepper and crushed red pepper in a 5-quart Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Pour chicken stock and wine over top. Cover and bring to a boil.

Cook 7-9 minutes until pasta is al dente (with a bite to it). Toss pasta with tongs occasionally to keep the pasta from

sticking to the bottom of the pot. You will still have some liquid in the pan when the pasta is done cooking. This is going to makethe base for our delicious cheese sauce.

Turn off the heat and add the cheese to the pasta. Toss pasta with tongs until the cheese melts into the pasta. Toss in remaining spinach. Serve and enjoy!


SIMPLE KITCHEN TIP:

Dried Italian Season-

ing is a fabulous convenience ingredient. If you do not keep it on hand, combine 1 teaspoon dried basil, 1 teaspoon rosemary, 1/2 teaspoon oregano and 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme.

This dish is just spicy enough to make your tongue tingle. For a very mild sauce, reduce the red pepper flakes to 1/2 teaspoon.

I know some people are sensitive to alcohol. The wine adds a fabulous rich buttery flavor and a bright citrus-iness to the pasta. If you can use the chardonnay, I highly recommend it. However, you can substitute with chicken stock, white grape juice, or lemon water (1/2 cup fresh lemon juice and 1/2 cup water).


