Water Quality Report -

In last week's first printed Barker of the year report, we mentioned the real need for both diligence and funding.

It is a true credit to the Birch Lake community that, so far, the supply of both diligence and funding has been sufficient. This is of particular note when considering that they have been obtained solely as a result of voluntary donations in terms of time and money.

As to diligence and time ... members of the Water Quality Committee (WQC) past and present have given enough not only to monitor Birch's ever changing status but also, particularly over the last decade or so, to look out for and respond to threats of invasive species. Since the composite hair color of most of the committee members is somewhere between gray and white, it would be nice to have a few more of the next generation sign on, watch, and learn so that they may someday seamlessly take over the reins as the current herd is eventually put out to pasture. This is where we all clap for young Peter Soldato, who has agreed to do just that. If any others wish to join Peter in his apprenticeship, please speak up.

As to funding and money ... Birch Lake enjoys many blessings, including but not limited to, its water quality and depth, the springs that feed it, the beauty of its surroundings, the kind and generous people that live on or nearby the lake, the Yacht Club, the social life, and last but not least its weekly newsletter the Barker. Cheer, Cheer for Sailor Phil.

Motivated by all these positive influences, Birch Lakers are relatively highly educated in what's going on around here and very willing to respond positively when warranted.

To provide a contrast ... Over the last 9 or 10 years at least a few members of the present WQC have attended dozens of regional and/or statewide Michigan Lakes and Streams Associations meetings, at which we've heard what's going on at hundreds of member lakes. The shared stories collectively in-

clude the following:

1) Essentially all of them need and regularly spend money to combat challenges, typically some kind(s) of invasive species.

2) Virtually all of them do have voluntary organizations, which raise and collect donations for such purposes

3) And yet only two (Birch and one other) of which we have heard in the entire state have been able to fully sustain their needs via donations.

4) All of the other lakes that we know of have had to beg their local townships to create and maintain "Special Assessment Districts" (SADs) in which the township(s) ultimately determine what gets done and when, who pays and how much, and the township's costs get added to the tax bills of those determined to be in the "district." Not being subject to



these constraints is just one more huge reason why life at Birch, God's favorite lake, is grand, and very hard to match.

Only two of 100 to 200 known Michigan Lakes enjoy this SAD-free status. This borders on miraculous! Thank you, thank you and congratulations to all community members that help make this possible.

While we are getting along fine now, please make sure to keep up the good work by continuing to donate generously to the Water Quality and Invasive Species funds. You might even consider bumping up your gifts. Unfortunately, we never know when the next "invasion" will come!

Traveling at light speed

rowing up, Lost in Space was one of my favorite TV shows. For the benefit of those who didn't experience their formative years in the 1960s, Lost in Space was a "Gilligan's Island" version of a story involving a group of space castaways stranded on a planet orbiting Alpha Centauri and being constantly foiled by the bumbling Dr. Zachary Smith. The utter ridiculousness of it all almost rivaled Flipper. But not quite.

How the Robinson crew ever got to Alpha Centauri in the first place is unclear, but one might very well wonder if inter-stellar travel is in any way possible. Well, guess what? It isn't. At least not for us Earthlings stranded here in the 21st century. You heard it here first.

When discussing the possibility of interstellar travel, there is something called "the giggle factor." Some scientists tend to scoff at the idea of interstellar travel because of the enormous distances that separate the stars. According to Special Relativity (1905), no usable information can travel faster than light, and hence, it would take centuries to millennia for an extra-terrestrial civilization to travel between the stars.

Even the familiar stars we see at night are about 50 to 100 light years from us, and our galaxy is 100,000 light years across. The nearest galaxy is 2 million light years from us. Ordinary intelligence says that the universe is simply too big for interstellar travel to be practical.

(Cultural aside here - a light year is a unit of distance, not time. One light year is the distance that a particle of light can travel in one Earth year. I'm not going to do all the math for you, but start with light traveling 186,000 miles per second and go from there. Light from the moon gets to our eyeballs in about 2 seconds. By contrast, if the sun blinked out right now we wouldn't know about it for about another eight minutes.)

Similarly, investigations into UFOs that may originate from another planet are sometimes the "third rail" of someone's scientific career. There is no funding for anyone seriously looking at unidentified objects in space, and one's reputation may suffer if one pursues an interest in these unorthodox matters. In addition, perhaps 99 percent of all sightings of UFOs can be dismissed as being caused by familiar phenomena, such as the planet Venus, swamp gas (which can glow in the dark under certain conditions), meteors, satellites, weather balloons, even radar echoes that bounce off mountains.

What is disturbing to a physicist however, is the remaining 1 percent of these sightings, which are multiple sightings, have been made by multiple methods of observations. Some of the most intriguing sightings have been made by seasoned pilots and passengers aboard air line flights which have also been tracked by radar and have been videotaped. Sightings like this are harder to dismiss.

That aside, propellsion systems that are still on cocktail napkins would require incredible amounts of energy to attain the speeds required to navigate the vast distances between galaxies, or even nearby star systems.

Most scientists doubt interstellar travel because the light barrier is so difficult to break. However, to go faster The Moon for this Saturday (At Midnight, US Central time, as viewed from the Northern Hemisphere) Illuminated Fraction: 0.840 3.8 days since first quarter

than light, one must go beyond Special Relativity to General Relativity and the quantum theory. Therefore, one cannot rule out interstellar travel if an advanced civilization can attain enough energy to destabilize space and time.

It's fun to think about. And some awesome stories and movies about such things have entertained us for decades. But for today anyway, it's just not in the cards.

Hmmm ... I wonder if anyone ever said that to Wilber and Orvill.

- 2 (10.75 ounce) cans condensed cream of chicken soup
- 1 cup salsa
- $2 \operatorname{cups} \operatorname{frozen} \operatorname{corn}$
- 1 (15 ounce) can black beans, drained and rinsed
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups water

1 teaspoon ground cumin 1/2 teaspoon dried cilantro 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese

Instructions

Spray your slow cooker with cooking spray. Add chicken to the bottom of the slow cooker.

In a medium sized mixing bowl, mix cream of chicken soup, salsa, corn, black beans, water, cumin, and cilantro. Pour over the top of chicken.

Cook on low for 4-6 $\,$ hours. Remove the chicken and shred with two forks.

Place back into the slow cooker and add shredded cheese. Continue cooking until cheese has melted about 15 minutes. Serve with your favorite toppings.

amp staff start arriving this week! In fact, by the time the Barker arrives at your doorstep, our lifeguard training will have begun. Our first staff members start arriving this week on Wednesday, May 30, and by Friday we will have 10 staff members here for lifeguard training.

We have an incredibly diverse staff this year! We are once again bringing in international staff through the Wildpacks staffing agency. This is the 3rd year we have hired international staff and it's always exciting to learn more about their cultures and share that with the campers. In addition to our international staff, we have a group of international staff, we have a group of international volunteers coming to camp from a program through the University of Wisconsin Madison called AIESEC. They are bringing us 6 volunteers from around the world to assist at camp.

So this year we have counselors and volunteers from the following countries: US (of course!), Scotland, Mexico, the Netherlands, England, China, Kenya, Cyprus, Russia, Ireland, Saudi Arabia, Canada, France, Armenia, Egypt, India, and possibly Malaysia! It will be so exciting to have such a variety of backgrounds and experiences among our staff members. Plus we have campers coming from France, Myanmar, and Singapore.

Our Unit Leaders will arrive Monday for leadership staff training, and then the rest of the staff get here on Wednesday, June 7 for training. We have a lot of exciting activities planned for staff training this year, including an epic scavenger hunt around camp, lots of team building activities (Michelle is calling these activities "BOAT"s – which stands for Building Our Amazing Team), a surprise field trip, setting up camp and planning activities for the summer, and (not as exciting, but just as important) learning the serious stuff like rules, procedures, and emergency action plans.

We extended staff training this year to be a week and a half long, instead of the one week training we've done in the past. We wanted to spend more time on group bonding learning to communicate and work together as a staff team. So the staff will be here for 10 days before the first group of campers arrive on June 18.

We currently have 849 campers registered for the summer, and our goal is to get to 950. We're about 2 weeks ahead of where we were for registrations at this time last year, and roughly 70 campers up from last year on this date. The new cabin is almost complete, and the beds and mattresses will be arriving later this week!

Our Camp Fire Board of Directors has agreed to take on the planning of the Pancake Breakfast this year at camp. We are very grateful to the wonderful volunteers who have coordinated this event in the past – most recently the chairs of this event were Phil and Sandy Vitale and Mike and Amy Lutz. Thank you for all your efforts! They've decided to pass the torch, and our Board Members agreed to be the planning committee going forward.

So we will still have the Pancake Breakfast at camp on the Sunday morning following the Fireworks. This year that date is Sunday, July 2, from 8:30-11 am. We will need more volunteers, so if you're interested in helping out at the breakfast, please contact me by email (amber@tannadoonah.org) or phone (574-387-6095). We look forward to continuing the long-standing Pancake Breakfast tradition!
