request for a note in the Barker.

According to the law all dogs must be restrained at all times on a leash and not allowed to roam free. The law also requires that any dog that bites or attacks a human or other dog must be confined for ten days providing the animal has a current, valid rabies vaccination. If there is no vaccination on record, the dog must be confined at the County Animal Shelter or by a veterinarian.

Additionally, the owner of an animal running at large or an animal that bites may be ticketed by the Animal Control officer and fined by the courts.




able to meet a lot of the great people that we are lucky to have here at the lake. I urge everyone to attend BLYC functions and meet your truly amazing neighbors.

DNS (Did Not Sail) does not count against season score, however sailor must complete 2/3 of races to qualify for season.; DNF (Did Not Finish), DSQ (Disqualified) scores as one place worse than last place (if 5 boats finished, you would have finished 6th, will be scored as 7th place).; DNF, DSQ not counted toward minimum number of races needed; CB - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total; SEASON POINTS are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.); SEASON PLACE = total season points/number of races attempted; CREW - Counted toward completed races, Points go to skipper of boat.

### — Water Quality Report — Purple Loosestrife Management Program

he Birch Lake Water Quality Committee started the Purple Loosestrife Management Program in 2000. The program has been very effective. In 2000 we had 10 sites located on all shores of the lake, some of which were very dense. We continue to monitor for Purple Loosestrife each year and remove the plants that we find. The Plants bloom toward the end of July and into September. If you see, or suspect you see, the plant, please call Bruce Wagner, our Water Quality Committee Purple Loosestrife Specialist (Cottage 269-476-2090, cell 574-286-7183) or any other member of the Water Quality Committee to have it checked out. In recent years, purple loosestrife is typically only found in four or five places on the lake, most often along the west shore.

#### What is it?

Purple Loosestrife is a plant that was accidentally introduced to the United States and distributed as an ornamental. It is most easily identified during the flowering season. This spiked-shaped purple pinkish flower can be seen above the water level in ditches, streams, rivers, lakes, and other moist shallow water sites. This plant is an upright hardy perennial four to eight feet tall and most often found in groups. **Effects:** 

Purple Loosestrife invades marshes,

ditches and lakeshores quickly replacing native wetland plants. These plants form dense stands that wildlife cannot use for food or cover.

#### Spread:

Purple Loosestrife will grow from the roots of an established plant, however the plants spread mainly by seed. Having up to 300,000 per stalk, these tiny seeds can live in the soil and water for many years and can be transported great distances by humans, animals and water.

#### **Management (Eradication)**

Once the plant becomes easily evident (in mid-July) but before it goes to seed (in early September), Specialist Wagner will slowly tour the lake in his pontoon boat and with his binoculars search for purple loosestrife, usually about four times per season. Wherever it is seen, he will later return from shore, in his waders, pull each plant (hopefully with its roots), bag, and properly dispose of it.

#### Another Water Quality Action Update

Speaking of slow moving pontoon



boats whose occupants eye the shoreline through binoculars ... a group of Water Quality Committee members are scheduled to be joined by a MiCorps DEQ biologist in order to "Score the Shore (See Birch Barker of 7/1/17) on Tuesday, July 18. We may pass in front of each 1000' long section of shoreline as many as three times at various distances from the shore in order to collect and record data in that 1000' section. If we don't complete the entire lake survey on the 18th, we will probably try to finish up on the next day or two thereafter. Just like with the Purple Loosestrife Patrols, please don't let the seemingly nosy pontoons unnerve or make you feel uneasy.



### Shuffle off to Buffalo ...

### Buffalo Chicken Burgers with Blue Cheese Dressing

"This burger delivers the bold flavors of Buffalo wings minus the mess and calories. Serve with additional hot sauce on the side."

#### Ingredients:

RECIPES

- 1/4 cup light sour cream
- \* 1/4 cup reduced fat blue cheese crumbles
- 1/4 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 1/2 pounds ground chicken
- 1/4 cup hot pepper sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon celery salt (optional)
- 1/4 teaspoon poultry seasoning
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1 pinch cayenne pepper, or to taste
- 1 tablespoon hot pepper sauce
- 4 Kaiser rolls, split
- 4 leaves iceberg lettuce
- 1/2 cup diced celery

#### Directions:

1. Preheat an outdoor grill for medium-high heat, and lightly oil the grate. Stir the sour cream, blue cheese, and Worcestershire sauce together in a small bowl; set aside.

2. Mix the ground chicken, 1/4 cup hot sauce, celery salt, poultry seasoning, paprika, and cayenne pepper together in a mixing bowl until evenly blended. Form into four 3/4-inch-thick patties.

3. Cook the chicken burgers on the preheated grill 6 to 7 minutes until well marked. Spray the uncooked top of the burger with cooking spray, and flip the burgers over. Brush the cooked side with 1 tablespoon hot sauce, and continue cooking until no longer pink in the center and the juices run clear, about 5 minutes more. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 165 degrees F (74 degrees C).

4. To assemble the burgers, place a lettuce leaf on each roll bottom. Top with a burger patty, then spoon on 2 tablespoons of blue cheese sauce, and 2 tablespoons celery. Place the top of the roll on top to finish the sandwich.

#### **Buffalo Chicken Dip**

"This tangy, creamy dip tastes just like Buffalo chicken wings. It's best served hot with crackers and celery sticks. Everyone loves the results!"

#### Ingredients:

-  $2~(10~{\rm ounce})$  cans chunk chicken, drained

• 2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese, softened

- 1 cup Ranch dressing
- 3/4 cup pepper sauce (such as Frank's Red Hot®)
- \* 1 1/2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese
- 1 bunch celery, cleaned and cut into 4 inch pieces

• 1 (8 ounce) box chicken-flavored crackers

#### **Directions:**

1. Heat chicken and hot sauce in a skillet over medium heat, until heated through. Stir in cream cheese and ranch dressing. Cook, stirring until well blended and warm. Mix in half of the shredded cheese, and transfer the mixture to a slow cooker. Sprinkle the remaining cheese over the top, cover, and cook on Low setting until hot and bubbly. Serve with celery sticks and crackers.




