## **Birch Lake Notes**

### Water Quality answers question about water cloudiness ...

Why does the lake water seem particularly cloudy and laden with floating matter this season?

Members of the Water Quality Committee share in having made the same observations and experiencing the same concerns. Although we (Terry) are still gathering and turning in samples to the CLMP for analysis and review, the results won't be available to us until late winter or early spring. They will probably not be able to tell us the entire story anyway. So, for now at least, we are down to supposition and guesses.

Ours include:

1) The extreme amounts of sunlight early in the season, coupled with the then relatively clear water, accelerated growth of both more algae and in deeper (larger areas of) water than normal. The volume of algae negatively affects both the turbidity of the water and the amount of material floating upon it.

2) The almost record breaking amounts of rain:

2a) Carry more chemicals (typically including phosphorous, which spikes the growth of even more organics, like chlorophyll and algae in the water) and objects (which usually decay, thereby eventually introducing even more organics) into the water.

2b) Causes the water elevation to become and remain abnormally high for extended periods. This condition, as long as it remains, continues to disturb and wash into the lake even more chemicals, and objects that were previously deposited on the banks of the lake. Waves only acerbate the situation, so please do whatever you reasonably can to minimize the number, size and effect of the waves (wakes) you might create.

## **Baked apples with oatmeal filling**

### Ingredients

Original recipe yields 4 servings (4 apples) •

4 apples

- 1 cup rolled oats
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 cup butter
- Add all ingredients to list

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

2. Core each apple making a large well in the center and arrange apples on a rimmed baking sheet.

4. Bake in the preheated oven until apples are tender and filling is bubbling, about 30 minutes.

# Hard to believe just 2 weeks left

ard to believe we're nearing the end of the summer! After this week, there are just 2 weeks left of camp for the summer. This week is our biggest week of the year, and really, the biggest week we've ever had! We have 148 campers for the session; 146 was our previous biggest week.

This week we wanted to tell you all about our CIT program. The CITs are "counselors in training," and we have a 3-level CIT program. To be a CIT 1, they must be at least 15 years old, and preferably have been coming to camp for at least a few years prior to being a CIT. Some of our CITs have been coming to camp for 10 years before they become a CIT!

CIT 1s come for two weeks, and get to help at activities, shadow counselors, and learn a lot about what the job of a camp counselor entails. The CIT 2s come for three weeks, and for two of those weeks they live in the cabins with younger campers, helping the staff, helping lead activities, and getting a better understanding of the camp counselor role. And CIT 3s come for four weeks, and live in the cabins with younger campers all four weeks, lead more activities, and really prepare for next year when they are old enough to be counselors.

For the first week of the CJT 2 program, we like for all the CIT 2s to live together and get a chance to bond with their fellow CITs, similar to how we have staff bonding time during staff training. This is the first week of the CIT 2 program for 2018, and because the week was so full, we only had a few empty beds scattered all over camp. That wouldn't give the CIT 2s the chance to share a cabin and bond with one another the way we like, so we decided to create a "tent village" for them in the woods, where they could really get to know each other and spend a lot of time working together. They weren't all super excited about this plan, but it seems to be working out better than many of the expected!

Miss Julie, our CIT director, is living out in the tent village with them. We've set up 5 tents so that the 6 CITs could live in pairs, have one tent for Miss Julie, and one tent to store their luggage for the week. Unfortunately, the weather hasn't been ideal for camping out, with last weekend being so wet, and then having rain Sunday afternoon, off and on all day Monday, and drizzle on Tuesday so far. But they're doing a great job staying positive and making it fun.

This week we also have overlapping sessions of CITs so we have a group of CIT 1s, 2s, and 3s here all at the same time! That makes a total of 11 CITs this week, so we decided to put them in charge of the "committee" for the week. Each week we have a committee that plans all of the evening activities for all of camp, leads sing each night (teaching the kids all the songs), decorates the dining hall to fit the theme for the week, and plans the end of the week ceremony. Each counselor on staff is on committee once per summer, and we give one week to the CITs so they can learn how that part of being a counselor works.

It's fun to watch kids who were once 6-year-old campers grow up, move up through all different cabins, and eventually become CITs and then counselors at camp!

## Birch Lake Notes Sixth AED installed on Birch Lake


The Birch Lake Homeowners Association has reported that a 5th Automatic Electric Defibrillator (AED) has been installed at the garage of Scott and Holly Troeger, 63696 Birch Rd., just north of the public landing. The garage is on the east side of the road, across the road from the Troeger home.

The Homeowners Association also announced that the sixth (and final)

AED will soon be installed at the DeYoung home (formerly the home of Jack and Marty Miller) at 63255 Storey Hill St. That unit will be installed on the north face of the garage.

All Birch Lake residents are invited and encouraged to attend the Annual Meeting of the Homeowners Association on Saturday, Aug. 11. In addition to the regular annual business, the meeting will feature a demonstration and training on the new Birch Lake AEDs (automatic electric defibrillator) as well as a CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) training session.

The Annual Meeting will begin at approximately 11 am (after the Birch Lake Yacht Club Board meeting).



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- 5. South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

## **IN AN EMERGENCY:**

 CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
 Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
 An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.

4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
