Eventually, this reached her respiratory system and she passed from respiratory failure at 12:34 pm this

for the boats in the middle! Adults only!


#### Thanks to the AED crew

### Fleet Captain's Gibe #15 by J. Patrick McGann

unday morning I woke up to a lake that looked like glass. Great for the water-skiers types like Stewart Spratt, Bob Baucus, but not so great for us sailors. I would like to thank Vic Jones and Phil Vitale planning to set the marks, and Bad Patty and her Committee Boat ladies, for standing by if needed.

With the outlook for sailing very poor I delayed the race until noon and decided to go attend the catholic mass at Camp Eberhart's Outdoor Chapel with the delightful Fr. Rich Conyers, CSC. It is located in a beautiful outdoors setting just off the lakeshore of Corey Lake with lots of very large old Oak and Hickory trees strewn about the benches, no kneelers (these old knees like that) and two little Brazil-Brown buildings to house the gathering, bell tower and the PA system, and new bathroom building called "The Lieu" honoring former Birch Laker and Eberhart staffer, and frequent attendee, the beautiful Anne O'Brien Abernathy, Sarah Petty's (north shore) mom who was taken from us at much too young of age. Just after communion when everyone sat quietly, meditating, the silence
was pierced by a flock of four or five
geese that flew over the chapel just

setting to worship in, I felt compelled
to share the experience in my article,
since I knew I would not have much



# ~Birch Lake Recipes~





### Shrimp and veggie-stuffed zucchini


#### Ingredients

- 1 extra large zucchini
- 1/4 cup olive oil, divided
- · 6 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 shallot, finely chopped
- 1/2 pound large shrimp shelled, deveined, and cut in half
- 1 large tomato peeled, seeded and diced
- 8 cremini mushrooms, quartered
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 8 leaves fresh basil, torn
- ullet Ground black pepper to taste
- · Kosher salt to taste
- · Garlic powder to taste
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese, divided

#### Directions

Preheat the oven's broiler and set the oven rack about 6 inches from the heat source. Grease a baking sheet.

Cut the zucchini in half the long way, and scoop out the seeds and pulp, leaving a thick shell of flesh. Brush both halves of the zucchini with about 1 tablespoon of olive oil, and place them, cut sides down, onto the prepared baking sheet. Bake until the zucchini are



hot and beginning to release beads of moisture, 5 to 10 minutes. Remove the zucchini from the oven.

Reduce the oven heat to 450 degrees F (230 degrees C).

Heat 2 tablespoons of olive oil in a skillet over medium-low heat, and cook and stir the garlic and shallot until translucent, about 5 minutes. Remove from the heat and let cool.

Place 1 tablespoon of olive oil, the shrimp, diced tomato, mushrooms, 1/4

cup of Parmesan cheese, basil, and the cooked garlic and shallot into a bowl, and stir to mix. Season to taste with black pepper, salt, and garlic powder. Stuff the mixture into the zucchini halves, and sprinkle each zucchini with about 2 tablespoons of Parmesan cheese.

Bake the stuffed zucchini in the preheated oven until the cheese is browned and the filling is cooked through and hot, about 20 minutes.


Leigh Stoffer is our customer relations manager. She started in April of



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- **4. South Shore**, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

### IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.


