

DNS (Did Not Sail) does not count against season score, however sailor must complete 2/3 of races to qualify for season; DSQ (Disqualified) scores as one place worse than last place (if 5 boats finished, you would have finished 6th, will be scored as 7th place); DSQ not counted toward minimum number of races needed; DNF (Did Not Finish), scored as last place; CB - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total; Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.); Season Place = total season points/number of races attempted; Crew - Counted toward completed races, Points go to skipper of boat.

- 1/2 cup sour cream


Directions

After School programs in full swing

just launching our first After School program at Good Shepherd Montessori School in South Bend. This year, as we go into school year, we will have two programs, one at Good Shepherd, and one at Cassopolis' Sam Adams Elementary. Some people have asked what we do at the After School programs. One of the things that sets Camp Fire After School programs apart from other after school programs is that we have a defined set of goals and outcome measurement. We aren't there to provide babysitting, or to just supervise the kids while they play in the gym or on the playground.

All Camp Fire programs (across the 50 councils nationwide) use a framework to develop our programs called Thriveology, which was developed in partnership with the Thrive Foundation for Youth. There are four main components of Thriveology: finding sparks, developing a growth mindset, learning goal management strategies, and reflection.

Starting with sparks, we teach kids that your Sparks are the things you are excited and passionate about. We want kids to not only be able to identify their sparks, but also help them explore new things and find

sparks they didn't know they had. At camp, and at after school, we introduce a variety of different activities and programs for kids to try, so that hopefully they will be able to find a new spark and share it with others. We call our after school staff "Spark Champions," instead of teachers or leaders.


Next is growth mindset. A person with a growth mindset believes that they can improve and develop their skills through effort and practice. By contrast, a person with a fixed mindset tends to believe that they are born with a certain skillset and that they cannot change it. We teach our staff to use language that encourages kids to be persistent and keep working on things that they find challenging. If a child says, "Tm just not good at math," one of our staff might say "You're not good at math, yet! But you can be if you keep practicing."

We also teach goal management skills. One of the things that youth struggle with is setting manageable goals, and then knowing how to readjust their plan if they get off track. So we work with youth to set a goal that isn't so huge that it's too overwhelming to get started, and then teach them how to monitor their progress, and get back on track if they go off course.

The final component is reflection. We leave time at the end of every activity for a brief period of reflection. This might be as simple as asking kids questions about what they liked about the activity and what they didn't like. Or what went well and what they would change next time. Or we might try to dig deeper, and talk about how the activity made them feel frustrated and how they can use that frustration to motivate them.

There are a list of indicators of thriving, and each of our 6-week curricula centers on a different indicator, including connections, character, grit, skills, confidence, etc. In a typical week, on Mondays we do a project focused on one of the traditional Camp Fire "trails" (trail to knowing me, trail to the environment, trail to creativity, trail to the future, trail to family and community). Tuesdays we focus on STEM (science, technology, engineering, or math), Wednesdays are a seasonal art project, Thursdays are project-based-learning, and Fridays are outdoor education. We provide a snack every day, and some outdoor or gym time, reading and homework time, and kids' choice time, in additional to the daily planned activities. So that's a week at After School!



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- **4. South Shore**, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.


