
### The last Barker of the year



DNS (Did Not Sail) does not count against season score, however sailor must complete 2/3 of races to qualify for season; DSQ (Disqualified) scores as one place worse than last place (if 5 boats finished, you would have finished 6th, will be scored as 7th place); DSQ not counted toward minimum number of races needed; DNF (Did Not Finish), scored as last place; CB - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total; Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.); Season Place = total season points/number of races attempted; Crew - Counted toward completed races, Points go to skipper of boat.

## Water Quality Report

Imagine the potential quality of the lake in the absence of us interlopers. Our primary affect on the lake is through the extensive modification of the shoreline and our "improved" land nearby, with the extensive building of impermeable structures, roads, houses, driveways, patios, etc. Additionally, by clearing the path to the lake all the increased runoff from these surfaces makes its way to the lake carrying any debris, dirt, oils, dog poop remains, excess fertilizer and weed killer etc. Ironically, although we love the lake and want it to be as pristine as possible, we are its own worst enemy as well. So let's repeat the mantra that "if it's around the lake it will get into the lake." The extent to which and the speed at which this occurs however and the degree that it will cause an impact is somewhat up to us. For these reasons, we offer a few basic reminders as we get into cleanup time, new landscape time, preparations for winter time, etc:

Do not burn around the lake unless you can be sure to confine the ashes from water runoff, or sweep them up when cold and dispose properly.

Remember, ashes basically represent instant fertilizer and minerals for the growth of algae.

Do not sweep, rake, or otherwise deliberately dispose of leaves or grass clippings into the lake. As it decays, this material also increases the growth of algae. Try to haul leaves etc. to a location outside of the lake basin if possible

If you must fertilize make sure you use a non-phosphorous containing fertilizer, and only use a minimal amount, and as far away from the shoreline as possible. Read the label.

If doing new landscaping, do not add hardscape to the property. Use ground cover where possible that slows the flow of rainwater, construct a dry creek bed where you have distinct water flow, or put in a little rain garden where you see water flow.

Build a little buffer of taller, deeper rooted native plants at the water's edge, (or right above your seawall). Even a foot or two of plantings will sort of hold up the overflow of water and absorb or stop some of the junk in the flowing water before it reaches the lake.

If you have never been here for a big rain you may ask yourself "why the worry?" If so, and you happen to be around when we get a big rain, go outside and you will easily observe the rationale for the comments above.

We have been doing the water testing for phosphorous, chlorophyll, clarity, and dissolved oxygen in the water column all summer and will be submitting all samples for analysis in September. After

we receive the results next Spring, we will ensure that all residents have access to the report that is generated so as to see how we stack up year to year. We on the water quality committee thank everyone for their individual attention to what they can do to help keep the quality of Birch Lake at its highest level so that we can all enjoy these waters for many years to come. If we are smart, that should be a couple of hundred years at the least.

## — Water Quality Report — Purple Loosestrife on Birch Lake

he Birch Lake Water Quality Committee started the Purple Loosestrife Management Program in 2000. The Program has been very effective. In 2000 we had 10 sites located on all shores of the lake, some of which were very dense. We continue to monitor for Purple Loosestrife each year and remove the plants that we find. The Plants bloom toward the end of July and into September.

If you see, or suspect you see the plant, please call Bruce Wagner, our Water Quality committee Purple Loosestrife Specialist (Cottage 269-476-2090 or Cell 574-286-7183) or any member of the Water Quality Committee to have it checked out.

This year Purple Loosestrife was removed from four sites by Bruce and some of the affected property owners. Thank you. We typically find the Loosestrife each year in four or five locations and the volume of plants at each site has diminished.

#### What is it?

Purple Loosestrife is a plant that was accidentally introduced to the United States and distributed as an ornamental. It is most easily identified during the flowering season. This spiked-shaped purple pinkish flower can be seen above the water level in ditches, streams, rivers, lakes and other moist shallow water sites. This plant is an upright hardy perennial four to eight feet tall and most often found in groups.

#### Effects:

Purple Loosestrife invades marshes, ditches and lakeshores quickly replacing native wetland plants. These plants form dense stands that wildlife cannot use for food or cover.

#### Spread:

Purple Loosestrife will grow from the roots of an established plant, however the plants spread mainly by seed. Having up to 300,000 per stalk, these tiny seeds can live in the soil and water for many years and can be transported great distances by humans, animals and water.

#### Management (Eradication)


Once the plant becomes easily evident (in mid-July) but before it goes to seed (in early September), Specialist Wagner will slowly tour the lake in his pontoon boat and with binoculars searching for purple loosestrife, usually about four times per season. You



will recognize his pontoon boat by the Purple Loosestrife banner hanging on the side. If seen, he will later return from shore in waders and pull each plant (by its roots), bag and properly dispose of it.

If you are interested in helping, please give Bruce a call. He would probably enjoy the company.





The coupons were sometimes confusing, and parents often weren't sure which coupon they should use, or they applied multiple coupons. There were different levels of discount (and thus different coupon codes) depending on whether you wanted to pay your deposit or pay in full before the deadline.


In an effort to simplify the process for this year, we've eliminated all the coupons, and also eliminated the need to pay in full to get the discounts. Instead, from Sept. 1 until the end of the year, if you register for camp and make a deposit to hold your spot, you get the 2018 prices for camp. Starting Jan. 1, 2019, when you register and pay your deposit to hold a spot, you get the new 2019 prices. So the early bird rate discount is applied to everyone who registers by the end of the year, and the price goes up after that. We're hoping it makes the registration process easier for everyone!

We have a lot of projects planned at camp for this winter. Every year, we try to focus on a few major improvements during the off season. This year, we are focusing our attention on Morris Lodge, the staff spaces inside Main Lodge, and overall landscaping and beautification of camp. Our new Ranger Bob is excited to get started - he says he can't believe how much he's able to accomplish once things quiet down around here!

In October, we will be installing all new windows throughout Morris Lodge, and replacing and painting all of the exterior siding and trim. Over the winter, Ranger Bob will be emptying out the staff spaces in Main Lodge, and putting up pine paneling on the walls, fixing windows and replacing trim. We want to make our staff spaces more cozy and comfortable for them on their time off! And throughout the year, we plan to clean up areas around camp, clearing out brush and overgrown areas, and making it all look fresh and clean and nice for when campers arrive in the spring. We're all looking forward to showing it off to visitors come spring!


