GOOD NEIGHBOR / GOOD COMMUNITY

Please make sure you review the map in The Barker showing locations for AEDs (Automatic External Defibrillators) that have been installed around the lake. The Homeowner's Association initiated the idea and the BLYC agreed to join forces. We've moved a step forward in helping to safeguard our lake community in the event someone suffers a heart attack. With our remote location, emergency response times can be slow and we're hopeful that having access to an AED can bring peace of mind to our residents and guests. The AEDs are installed in

alarmed cabinets, so please make sure to curb your curiosity (or your kids' curiosity) and don't open to take a peek. The AEDs are simple to use, with fully automatic operation and guidance, advising the responder verbally and visually on the appropriate use. We will be having CPR training and review of operating the AEDs in the future. Please stay tuned for future articles from the AED Committee.

With all of the rain we've been receiving, the lake is high (as I'm sure you've noticed). Please be aware of this as you're boating this weekend and watch the wakes you make. If you notice high wakes are causing issues with piers or the shoreline, please consider slowing down.

Please be a responsible pet owner. This means leashing your dog when walking, ensuring they stay in their yard as walkers/joggers/bike riders go by, and picking up after them. I'm sure there are folks thinking I'm being ridiculous for writing this. Trust me; I'm dismayed that I even need to mention it. I love our lake dogs and am delighted to see them...I'm simply reminding owners to act responsibly.

King family get together



Te would like to take this opportunity to thank Harold Cramner for his faithful past service in placing and keeping to large marks for our Sunday races. He is retiring this year and is turning the marks over to Tom Cassidy who has generously offered to take on that job. Thanks to Tom also.

A special thanks to The Eagle Lake MC and Laser Fleets for sponsoring and inviting the BLYC sailors to their 2-day training seminar at Eagle Lake. The instructors were Ted Keller and Pete Comfort, professional sailors from Melges Boat Works in Zenda, Wisconsin, the manufacturer of many one design Scows (flat bottom) sailboats including the 16 ft. MC Scow, one of boat classes that we sail here on Birch along with the smaller 14 ft. Sunfish boat class. The larger MCs start first and do a somewhat longer course than the Sunfish boats who start three minutes after the MCs and do a shorter course. Birch Lake sailors are in the boat prep mode and tuning their boats for the upcoming weekend racing season. I have heard that some new sailors are planning on joining the weekend races this summer and some others may not sail as much. Please encourage your young ones to crew for someone or to take up sailing themselves. To that end we are having some sailing classes this summer at the McGann's A-Frame cottage on the east side. It will be for

Once again our racing season will begin on Memorial Day weekend with a mini regatta Sunday May 27 and Monday May 28 with the best of three or five races. Three on Sunday and two, plus makeup(s), on Monday if needed. So, wax up those boats, fix up those lines and be ready to rock and roll. Points will double for regattas this year and count towards the season totals. If anyone needs help rigging their boat post a request for help on our Facebook page Birch Lake Lovers or contact me and I will post it. The racing season will end on Labor Day Weekend on Monday September 3, 2018 with another regatta as in the past. 

Water Quality Report -

s you are probably aware, Birch Lake is a member of the Michigan Lakes and Stream Association. Through that organization we participate along with many other lakes in a testing program through the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program. This is a State funded group and testing program using volunteers for each lake participating. The data collected provides a major statewide database on what is happening in Michigan's lakes as well as the yearly snapshot regarding our lake in particular. Thus, we test for phosphorous in the spring and late summer (a primary nutrient in the lake), chlorophyll on a monthly basis (an indicator of algal growth), rate of loss of dissolved oxygen in the water column (also a measure of lake productivity and ability to sustain life), and water clarity on a weekly basis. The phosphorous, chlorophyll, and water clarity measurements make up what is called our trophic index which is really a measure of the aging of the lake. Aging will occur, but we want it to occur as slowly as possible so as to maintain a body of water that is great for living on as well as playing in however we choose to do so (Swim, boat, fish, kayak, etc.).

The monitoring program also has an exotic plant watch component and a shoreline development component. We participated in the exotic plant watch a couple of years ago, but also have the lake evaluated for invasive species as part of our Eurasian milfoil program from an outside company. Currently we only have Eurasian milfoil, curly leaf pondweed, and purple loosestrife. The milfoil is treated annually and you will hear more on this later. The curly leaf pondweed has not been a problem needing

to be dealt with. Late each summer, Bruce Wagner and crew locate, and then manually pull, all the purple loosestrife along our shoreline. We are however on the watch for especially starry stonewort, an invasive in nearby lakes and very difficult to deal with, in addition to other exotics which are making their way into Michigan's waters.

We would like for you to actually to look up and read the CLMP report. This is done in an educational format and provides not only the data for 2017 but a retrospective of the last number of years for comparison. A good way to find the report is to go mymlsa.org and click on the MiCorps Cooperative Lake Monitoring Program box. From here look at featured content and go to Individual Lake Reports where you can find the information for Birch Lake in the Cass County section. You can also look up any other lake that has participated in the State of Michigan. Instead of listing a lot of facts now, let us just say that the testing program for 2017 demonstrated improved results in lower phosphorous and chlorophyll than in the previous few years. This is a great trend that we hope to see continue. Our trophic index actually places us in the oligotrophic standing, which is great. We have been borderline for the last number of years. The only sort of negative is our rather poor standing on Score the Shore which is somewhat understandable due to the level of development on the lake. We will talk about this section more in ensuing issues.

One note at this time is that the reduction in clarity of the lake as the summer ensues, is not much of a function of algal growth. Algal growth does occur, but a good deal of clarity loss is probably due



to the precipitation of calcium carbonates [marl] with the warming water. We get a grayish rather than really greenish water. Although we do not have an analysis as to why our water quality parameters are improving, we can speculate. We are an aging lake in terms of residents and use. Just look at the number of pontoon boats versus active ski etc. boats. Thus, the overall disturbance of the lake possibly has been reduced leading to less bottom upwelling and phosphorous distribution. Additionally last year was a calm storm year so less runoff from the shoreline. Thus far this year with all the rain, if anything is around the lake it will get into the lake. Please do not make runoff easier to get to the lake. Plant margins by the shoreline, pick up ashes from any burning you do on the road or near the lake. Thank you.



Slow cooker barbecue ribs

Ingredients


- 4 pounds pork baby back ribs
- · salt and pepper to taste
- · 2 cups ketchup
- · 1 cup chili sauce
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 4 tablespoons vinegar
- · 2 teaspoons dried oregano
- 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- · 1 dash hot sauce

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C).
- 2. Season ribs with salt and pepper. Place in a shallow baking pan. Brown in oven 15 minutes. Turn over, and brown another 15 minutes; drain fat.
- 3. In a medium bowl, mix together the ketchup, chili sauce, brown sugar, vinegar, oregano, Worcestershire sauce, hot sauce, and salt and pepper. Place ribs in slow cooker. Pour sauce over ribs, and turn to coat.
- 4. Cover, and cook on Low 6 to 8 hours, or until ribs are tender



Happy summer from Camp T

appy Summer! Hard to believe it's the start of another summer here at Birch Lake.

We're gearing up for another busy season at camp. As of today (May 22), we have 820 campers registered for camp, with a goal of 990 for the season. Last year we had about the same number on this date, and ended the season with 960, so we're pretty much on track to hopefully make our goal.

We've had a really busy off-season for Camp Fire this year! In the fall, we started a brand new after school program at Good Shepherd Montessori School in South Bend, and in January we started another after school program site at Cassopolis' Sam Adams Elementary. Both programs run from the end of the school day until around 6 pm every afternoon, so it sure keeps us on our toes.

Last fall we made a few changes to the staff structure here at Camp Fire. Since 2011, I have been serving as both the Executive Director and the Camp Director. As we have grown, playing both roles has become increasingly difficult. Last summer we realized that with the new programs starting, and everything else we were working on, that we needed to split those positions.

So as of October 1, I am the Exec-

utive Director, and Miss Michelle, who has been my assistant director at Camp for the past two summers, was promoted to the role of Camp Director. Her title is actually Program Director, as she is the Director for both Camp Tannadoonah, and also oversees the two after school program sites.

In June, we will be bringing on a new Assistant Program Director, who will work with us year-round, as both the Assistant Camp Director and the Assistant Director at the after school sites. We are hoping to have a 3rd after school site starting next fall.


This spring we also took on a new project for Camp Fire. As of May 1, our council is in charge of the online Camp Fire store for all of the councils across the countries. That means we are the source for Camp Fire beads, badges, apparel, books, and other Camp Fire items. So far this month we've already had around 20 orders, so it looks like this will turn out to be a great new opportunity for us.

We've been working on a number of facilities improvements and changes this winter / spring as well! If you have been up to camp at all, you will have noticed the new building that we are constructing along the driveway near

the Archery range. We're calling it the Welcome Center, and it will be the place where parents and campers come when they arrive at camp, a meeting space for our board and staff, a year-round office for our full-time staff, and the site of the online Camp Fire store (in the basement). We're so excited for this building to be completed in the next few weeks!

Over the winter we also completely renovated the Wallace cabin, are in the midst of a renovation of the Camp Store, added a few new "9 Square" game locations around camp, and are improving the staff bathrooms in Main Lodge. In March, we hired a new Facilities Manager, who has been getting lots of projects done around camp this spring! Ranger Bryson will be experiencing his first Michigan winter this winter – he comes to us from a Scout camp in Texas and has never lived somewhere where it's cold! He got a little taste of it in March and April this year, though!

We do plan to have the pancake breakfast at camp as always, on the Sunday morning following the fireworks on the lake. We hope you will all come up and check out all the great stuff that's been going on at Camp Tannadoonah! See you all on the lake!

There are currently four (4) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake.

The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- Call 911 and report the emergency and the location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, take it to the patient and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrilator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
