Michigan Boating Laws and Regulations

You need education if you were born after June 30, 1996, and will be operating a vessel in Michigan. Most PWC operators also need education.

There is no minimum age requirement to take this online course.

You do not have to be a resident of Michigan to take this online course.

Age and Operator Restrictions

Persons less than 12 years of age: May operate a boat powered by a

motor of no more than 6 hp legally without restrictions.

May operate a boat powered by a motor of more than 6 hp but no more than 35 hp legally only if they:

Have been issued a boating safety certificate and have it on board the boat and ...

Are directly supervised on board by a person at least 16 years of age.

May not operate a boat powered by a motor of more than 35 hp legally under any conditions.

T hose born on or after July 1, 1996, may operate a boat legally only if they have been issued a boating safety certificate and have it on board the boat.

Those born before July 1, 1996, may operate a boat legally without restrictions

Personal Watercraft (Jet skis)

Those less than 14 years of age may not legally operate a PWC.

Those 14 and 15 years of age may operate a PWC legally only if they have obtained a boating safety certificate and...

He or she is accompanied on board by his or her parent or legal guardian or by a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian or...

He or she is operating or riding the PWC at a distance of not more than 100 feet from his or her parent or legal guardian or from a person at least 21 years of age who has been designated by the parent or legal guardian.

Those at least 16 years of age and born after December 31,1978, may operate a PWC legally only if they have obtained a boating safety certificate.

Those born on or before December 31, 1978, may operate a PWC legally without restrictions.

Michigan law enforcement officers patrol the waterways to make your boating experience safe and pleasant. Cooperate with them by following the laws and guidelines.

Vessel operators who are required to have a Boater Education Card must carry the card on board the vessel and have it available for inspection by an enforcement officer. Not carrying your Boater Education Card when one is required can result in a fine.

Feature House #1, Petty

Sarah Petty's grandparents, John and Nancy O'Brien, bought their cottage on Birch Lake in 1956 for \$13,500. This price included the house, the land and a fully furnished home, which also consisted of booze in the cabinet, swimsuits in the drawers, and fishing gear.

They were the second owners, buying from the original owners who owned a steel company, so the floor is concrete with steel beams. The house is mostly cinder block that is covered in cedar.

In 1975, the O'Brien's added a master suite, which made the cottage a five-bedroom home, and a second screen porch. During this remodel, they also re-tiled the main bathroom using tiles from Camp Eberhart. At the end of the summer the counselors had a ceremony in which each counselor was given a porcelain tile, painted and glazed, usually poking fun at something dumb they had done that summer. The tiles tell stories of another time entirely, including many shenanigans had by the group of then 14-22 year olds in the late 1960's, early 1770's. Visitors still come by to see the tiles.

Around 1984, Sarah's parents, Spike and Anne Abernethy, bought the Echols home four doors to the west of the O'Brien's. Sarah and her sisters enjoyed that cottage for 10 years, and were often seen running back and forth to Grandma's for dinners and sleepovers.

After both of Sarah's grandparents were gone, her uncle lived in the cottage while building his home at the top of the hill. The house was listed, then the market crashed. It sat vacant for about five years. In 2011, Sarah's mother asked if Sarah, and her husband Ken, were interested in buying the cottage. Their honest answer was yes, however, they were hesitant because they weren't sure they could physically manage two homes. Her mother and her siblings offered to let the Petty's try it for a summer and see how it went. The Petty's sons were ages four, six and eight at the time. They fell in love with the cottage, purchased it in the fall, and the rest is history.

They knew they had many improvements to make, and have strived to do one project a year. These include a new roof, a new well, repairing the cedar exterior and adding stone to the bottom facade, replacing the cabinets and flooring in the kitchen, replacing all of the flooring and painting every wall. They replaced the bathroom vanity, but preserved the Eberhart tiles. They constructed a laundry room, a new master bath, and even added Eberhart tiles that were found to the new master shower. This year, they paved the parking area.

The Petty's love being at the lake and spending time as a family. Sarah likes to joke that, WiFi aside, being at the lake is like traveling back in time. The kids are outside all day, swimming, fishing, hunting turtles, playing games... actually being kids. They are now a family of six, adopting their daughter this winter. They can't wait to spend the summer with her at the lake and watch her fall in love with the place they love so much.

Feature House #2, Karceski

Mary and Andy Karceski began their lake-house search looking for a clean lake with a firm bottom that was within a 2-1/2 hour drive from their suburban Chicago home. They searched



the internet and came upon a couple of listings on Birch Lake. They hired a local realtor who knew the area and she kept stressing that Birch Lake was a "quality" lake. They fell in love.

The Karceski's are from Shorewood, Illinois. In fact, they live two streets over from the Kinzler's who, in the summer, live on the west side of Birch Lake. Andy works for the ATF as a special agent and Mary is a prosecuting attorney. They have two children. Their son, Chris, is 14 and is finishing his freshman year. He is into scholastic bowl, marching band, technology club and video games. Rachel is 13 and will be starting the 8th grade. She runs track and cross country and loves playing club volleyball.

Real estate records don't clearly show when their house was built, but it was sometime in the 1910's. The previous owners remodeled the home in 1995 and took it "down to the studs." They left the original hardwood floors, but updated a lot of the other features. The Karceski's have done some remodeling, as well. They added windows in the interior front of the house so that they could get a better view of the lake from the living area. They also remodeled the kitchen. They moved it from a galley space in the back of the home to an open space in the front. They added some built-in bunk beds in the anterior bedroom along with siding to the exterior. They say that it's definitely been a work in progress!

One of their favorite features of the home is the wrap around screen porch. They spend much of their time there and enhanced it with a sleeping area — which is a great place for naps. They also love the location! The Petty's live just to the east, and the Sandlers live behind them on the top of the hill. It's duck itch season

wimmer's itch, also known as lake itch, duck itch, cercarial dermatitis, and Schistosome cercarial dermatitis, is a short-term, immune reaction occurring in the skin of humans that have been infected by water-borne schistosomatidae. Symptoms, which include itchy, raised papules, commonly occur within hours of infection and do not generally last more than a week.

A number of different flatworm parasites in the family Schistosomatidae are what cause swimmer's itch. These parasites use both freshwater snails and vertebrates as hosts in their parasitic life cycles. Mostly waterfowl are used as the vertebrate host. During one of their life stages, the larvae of the parasite, cercaria, leave the water snails and swim freely in the freshwater, attempting to encounter water birds. These larvae can accidentally come into contact with the skin of a swimmer. The cercaria penetrates the skin and dies in the skin immediately. The cercaria larvae cannot infect humans, but they cause an inflammatory immune reaction. This reaction causes initially mildly itchy spots on the skin. Within hours, these spots become raised papules which are intensely itchy. Each papule corresponds to the penetration site of a single parasite.

The schistosomatidae that give rise to swimmer's itch should not to be confused with those of the genus Schistosoma, which infect humans and cause the serious human disease schistosomiasis, or with larval stages of thimble jellyfish (Linuche unguiculata), which give rise to seabather's eruption. Seabather's eruption mostly occurs in salt water, on skin covered by clothing or hair, whereas swimmer's itch mostly occurs in freshwater, on uncovered skin.

Since it was first described in Michigan in 1928, swimmer's itch has been reported from around the world. Some suggest incidence may be on the rise, although this may also be attributed to better monitoring.

Children may become infected more frequently and more intensely than adults but this probably reflects their tendency to swim for longer periods inshore, where cercariae also concentrate.

To prevent it, don't stand around in shallow, warm lake water. Staying out in somewhat deeper water and/or keeping moving such as when swimming, will usually prevent the parasites from getting you. When you or the kids get out of the water, towel off immediately



with a strong rubbing motion and then shower with soap and hot water.

Swimmer's itch typically clears up on its own within a few days, though in some cases the rash can last up to a week. In the meantime, you can control itching with over-the-counter antihistamines or anti-itch creams, such as those that contain calamine lotion. If the itching is severe, your doctor may recommend a prescription medication.

Orally administered hydroxyzine, an antihistamine, is sometimes prescribed to treat swimmer's itch and similar dermal allergic reactions.





Water Quality Report

egularly, members of the Water Quality Committee receive, typically via the internet, numerous pieces of information, publications, and/or blogs that supposedly are in the realm of water quality. Many of the issues presented could or do affect us directly. Even more are related to conditions we do have or may encounter, or are simply of interest to us.

Many of the articles recommend full or partial solutions to the problems described. Some request membership in, or donations to, their organizations or causes. A few even ask for timely, direct action by their readers (us) to influence those in the halls of power to act in accordance with our wishes.

In most cases this means contacting your federal or state legislators to ask them to vote certain ways on specific issues. Three examples that have come to light over the last few months are:

- 1.) A bill up for consideration in Washington D.C. was going to weaken Michigan's standards on ballast water discharges within the Great Lakes basin.
- 2.) A bill in Lansing sought to give an appointed board of industry representatives control over the enforcement (or non-enforcement) of current and future DEQ regulations.
- 3.) Again in Lansing, (only \$150,000/ annually of) new funding must be appropriated in order to continue Michigan's Cooperative Lakes Management Program, which is regularly used by our beloved Birch and some 300 other lakes

in our state.

The "direct action" requested is typically an email to your legislators. While a few on your Water Quality Committee often follow up on these requests, we think (and hope) that many of you would also so respond if advised and requested to do so. Obviously the more contacts received by our legislators, the more likely we are to be successful and to get our issues handled in the manner we desire.

To this end, we'd like to establish a list of names and email addresses of those who might also be inclined to contact their legislators (or whomever) when requested and deemed important. Volunteering for this list doesn't mean you are obligated to follow up on (or even agree with) the position expressed and action requested. While we hope you will, we understand that you might not respond to every request.

To utilize the broad list currently used by the Barker to announce its new issues, obituaries, and other timely information of common interest, seems a stretch; likely more than most of those who requested inclusion on the Barker circulation list had ever envisioned. Further, our request for action on issues or positions could be considered to be too political for the Barker or the Board.

For these reasons, we are asking you to register for inclusion on our lists of those who have requested information and/or opportunities to take action, should they desire to do so, in accordance with the opinions of certain members of

the Water Quality Committee. Please register for this "BLWQ Action" list by emailing Peter Soldato at psoldao86@ gmail.com, providing your name and email. Please include the phrase "BLWQ Information" in the subject line of the email.

Thank you. We will try to keep the requests for action to a minimum.

If your appetite for things to do with Water Quality hasn't yet been sated, you may also sign up for a second list and we will then forward to you some articles which we have received and think you may find interesting. You will not be tested on the material and again are free to delete any or all of it (even before reading.) The volume at times could seem overwhelming (and maybe even redundant.) Please register for this "BLWQ Information" list by emailing Peter Soldato at psoldao86@gmail.com, providing your name and email. Please include the phrase

"BLWQ Information" in the subject line of the email. Our ability to best protect valuable resources requires that we get and stay educated and share our opinions with those that matter whenever appropriate.

Thank you for your time and consideration in these matters. We hope to see your names on one, or both, of the lists. Spouses, significant others, adult children, in-laws, etc. are welcome to register (and later contact their legislators) individually. After all, the more the merrier. Thanks again.



Root Beer Pork Chops

These are great for outdoor grilling. Simple and very tasty. The glaze at the end gives them a lot of concentrated flavor.

Ingredients

- 4 (1-inch thick) pork chops
- * 3 (12 fluid ounce) cans or bottles root beer
- · salt and pepper to taste
- · 1 cup beef stock
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon chipotle-flavored hot sauce
- 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1 pinch salt, to taste

Directions:

- 1. Place the pork chops in a dish; pour 2 cans of the root beer over the chops. Place in refrigerator to marinate at least 2 hours. Remove the pork chops from the root beer; season with salt and pepper.
- 2. Combine the remaining can of root beer, the beef stock, brown sugar,




hot sauce, and Worcestershire sauce in a saucepan over medium heat; simmer the mixture until it reduces to about 3/4 cup. Set aside.

- 3. Preheat an outdoor grill for medium-high heat, and lightly oil the grate.
- 4. Grill the pork chops on the preheated grill until the no longer pink in the center, about 8 minutes per side. An

instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read 145 degrees F (63 degrees C). Brush the chops generously with the reduction sauce and continue cooking for about 2 minutes more per side. Remove from grill and brush with any remaining sauce. Season with salt to taste before serving



Staff arriving for training

ere we go! It's hard to believe, but our staff start arriving for staff training this week! We start waterfront staff training on Thursday (May 31), and the rest of the staff will arrive next week for the full staff training.

Our waterfront staff come early every year to do their lifeguard training, clean up and set up all the waterfront equipment, and learn how to teach our waterfront classes. We go through each class (canoeing, kayaking, paddle boarding, sailing, swimming lessons, waterskiing, and wakeboarding), and make sure they understand the lesson plans and goals of each class, and most importantly, the safety rules for teaching each class.

This year our lifeguard crew will be led my Miss Audrey Macsuga, who will be the waterfront director for the summer. Miss Audrey was on the waterfront staff two summers ago as a lifeguard, and will now return this year to be the waterfront director. She is from Palm Beach, Florida, and will be a senior at Saint Mary's College in the fall. Miss Audrey is a 2nd Genera-

tion Tannadoonah staff member – her mom, Kara, was on the camp staff in the early 90s!

Also on the lifeguarding staff are Miss Katie (Hartford, MI), Miss Olivia (Eaton Rapids, MI), Miss Alica (Irapuato, Mexico), Miss Mapi (Asuncion, Paraguay), Miss Mia (South Bend, IN), Miss Mary (Jackson, MI), Miss Hannah (Niles, MI), Mr. Tyler (South Bend, IN), Mr. Harvind (London, England), Mr. Tales (Belo Horizonte, Brazil), Mr. Zizo (Cairo, Egypt), and Mr. David (Popayan, Columbia). Plus Mr. Bill (my dad!) who helps drive the boat during the summer.

We are very excited about having such a diverse staff (not just at the waterfront – but in all of camp, too!). We will have counselors from 5 different US states, and 7 different countries this year. Not quite as many countries as we had last year, but it's still a lot of interesting backgrounds and experiences to learn about. It's great for the campers to be introduced to so many cultures and experiences, and fun for the rest of the staff, too.


We're currently at 840 campers, so

we're exactly 150 away from our goal for this year. Last year on this same date (May 29) we had 834 registered campers, so we are on track for similar numbers as last year, though our goal for this year is slightly higher.

We're still a few staff members short for this year — if you know anyone who is looking for a summer job, we have some cabin counselor positions available (must be at least 18, or can be 17 if they've graduated from HS), and a maintenance assistant position (must be at least 16). The maintenance assistant can live at camp, or at home if they choose.

We've gotten so much done at camp this spring. We'd like to offer a special THANK YOU to Tom Mosier, who has donated quite a bit of his time to help us with some projects at camp. He's helped us move the well tank outside of Main Lodge, and also helped move the tank and set up the well at the new Welcome Center. Thank you, Tom!!





- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrilator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
