Carp sighting.



Featured House #3 - Koscielski



The Koscielski family is not new to Birch Lake. All of Matt's now-grown children enjoyed their camper experiences at Camp Tannadoonah for several summers during their adolescent years. The family also rented a cottage on the west side during the summers of 2008-2010. After that, he started to think about a second home on Birch, more specifically a log home. In 2012, Matt purchased his lot from Camp Tannadoonah

The cabin is unique in many ways. For example, while the foundation was being laid, the western red cedar log shell was being constructed in Canada. Each log was individually hand-crafted (not milled) in Chilliwack, British Columbia. When that process was complete, the shell was disassembled and loaded on to trucks bound for Michigan. After they arrived at Birch Lake, with the help of cranes, it took only three days to reassemble the shell! The roof, made of prefabricated insulated panels, was then added.

The finishes in the cabin are also a tribute to craftsmanship, including teak floors, a welcoming front door, hidden support springs to allow for shrinkage and settling of logs, and an inviting kitchen area.

Needless to say, Matt loves his home on Birch Lake!

Featured House #4 - Seyfarth

Sixteen years ago, the Seyfarth's thought they were enjoying their retirement by living at the beach in California,



playing volleyball, and traveling. But, Gordon was told (by his wife, Michelle) that they needed a summer lake house with a yard, where their dog would feel

> like he was on vacation. They purchased their first home on Birch Lake in July of 2002. Five years later, he was informed, again, that they were here to stay for the rest of their lives. They were, therefore, moving across the street to be directly on the lake. Shortly thereafter, over a five day period. they and two neighbors swapped houses. Three

houses changed hands with none of them moving more than two doors.

Before they had even closed on their new home, the previous owners, the Rodriguez's, were kind enough to let them dig a 40-foot hole in what was still their yard, so the Seyfarths could drain their existing pond and move all of its inhabitants into THEIR new home, before it was time for their winter hibernation. Thereafter, a slow transformation took place with hundreds and hundreds of



plants being added along with four more ponds and a stream. Fallen logs were added everywhere and wild areas established to create habitat for insects that would nourish a blossoming amphibian population.

The interior of the house itself began a slow transformation with rooms being remodeled one by one until it was time to tear off the roof and complete the transformation. The original house had no large windows, no sliding doors to the lake, and no lakefront deck. A home design software program was purchased and design ideas were drafted to incorpo-

rate the existing structure but add interest, functionality, natural lighting, and take full advantage of the wonderful lake views. Two massive steel beams were added and the house was built out at the front and rear and an upstairs floor was added.

as well. With the hiring of two talented framers, the major portion of the framing was completed in only two months, but the resulting finish work would take Michelle and Gordon four years of long days. It left the neighbors wondering if they would ever finish. Not only did they have to contend with the ruckus of mating frogs and toads all summer, but now there was the constant sawing of wood.

The Seyfarth's feel they are very fortunate to have found such a beautiful lake with so many wonderful people and have really enjoyed the sense of lake pride, the yacht club functions, and all of the pontoon rides. They believe they are also very fortunate to be surrounded by so much wildlife. They currently have 11 turtles in the pond, a hundred frogs in the yard and, in the spring, 70 turtles sun on their raft, for their own enjoyment, as well as anyone passing by. The turtles are a little bit of tranquility and magic in a changing and chaotic world.



Eurasian Milfoil on Birch Lake

urasian Milfoil is an aggressive tall growing exotic aquatic plant ■from Europe and Asia. It can grow to the surface in up to 10 to 15 feet of water. At the surface, it forms a dense canopy of vegetation over other plants. Many native plants may be reduced in abundance by Milfoil canopy. It also conflicts with many recreational activities. In dense conditions, it is a serious localized and lake wide problem. It is not a significant food crop for waterfowl, other birds or aquatic mammals. It readily regenerates from detached fragments and spreads rapidly. Consequently, this plant can form dense colonies covering much of a lake's shore line out to a depth of about 20 feet.

We began monitoring aquatic vegetation in Birch Lake in 2001. We

were part of a Michigan Lake & Stream program that mapped the aquatic plants in Birch Lake. Howard Wandell provided professional assistance to the Birch Lake Water Quality Committee. The mapping project revealed that Birch Lake had a moderate plant population consisting of a good variety of species none of which dominated. At the time, the survey determined that we did not have Eurasian Milfoil.

In 2007 Eurasian Milfoil was discovered at three sites. Progressive AE provided professional assistance and is still under contract.

For 2018 Progressive AE surveyed the entire lake for all types of invasive species in mid-May. Their survey turned up a total of 1 ¼ acre of Eurasian Milfoil at two sites. One was on the east side in



the usual location and the second was near the boat landing. These locations and areas are consistent with the findings of recent previous years. Professional Lake Management treated the site on Monday June 4, 2018. Progressive AE will do a second [follow-up] survey.

The annual program is important to keep the Milfoil under control and to detect any other invasive species in the early stages to enable us to better control it

recreation and education.







- East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- Call 911 and report the emergency and the location immediately.
- Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, take it to the patient and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrilator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
