Here is Brian's response: Thanks for sending the photos! *The fish in the picture is a common carp*. The state record carp is 61.5 pounds. The carp in Birch Lake is a big one, but I do not think it would be a new state record (yet). Although common carp are not native to Michigan, they are widespread due to stocking in the late 1800s and early 1900s.

The call of the loon

have partnered with the Michigan Loon Preservation Association (MLPA) as part of a statewide Loonwatch Program, currently monitoring over 500 Michigan lakes. Their mission is to conserve the loon population through research, habitat protection and public awareness. Each Ranger submits a report of their observations at the end of the summer season.

Loons normally make Southwest Michigan a temporary stopping point during spring migration as they head further north, the most common area for loons to nest. It is unusual and fortunate that Birch Lake has become a summer home for the loon. Loons often return to the same territory each year. A pair of loons spotted here in early spring could easily mean they are nesting nearby (ground nests near shoreline).

In 1987 the Common Loon was categorized as "threatened" under the Michigan DNR Endangered Species list. Therefore, laws are in place to protect this rare bird and ensure they will be able to continue to survive here. The hunting, harassing, wounding, trapping or killing of the loon is punishable by law.



There are a few things we can do to provide a safe haven at Birch Lake. Not just for the loon, but other waterfowl and wildlife as well:

Stay at least 150 yards away from loons or a nesting area. Loons are easily stressed. They have difficulty walking on land due to the posterior position of their legs. They are expert divers and use their webbed feet to propel quickly underwater. If they are forced to abandon their nests, the eggs become vulnerable to predators, lack of warmth and protection. Caution should be taken while boating, canoeing, kayaking or fishing. Chicks swimming with their parents cannot dive for safety.

Check your shoreline and dispose of, any fishing line, hooks, and lead fishing weights (lead poisoning occurs in waterfowl and fish if ingested). Do not feed waterfowl, bread or any other food. This is harmful to the normal



diet of all wildlife.

If you spot a loon nesting site, please contact me so that I can get an MLPA nest warning buoy put into place. If you think a loon has been injured, it is imperative that it be treated as quickly as possible, and I will alert the appropriate DNR officials.

Enjoy our visiting loons from a distance and listen for their lovely call ... you will be rewarded!

Slow Cooker Moroccan Chicken

"Tasty, easy, and impressive! Serve with couscous or rice. Throw it in and go jump in the lake."

Ingredients

- 1 pound skinless, boneless chicken breast halves - cut into 2 inch pieces
- 4 cloves garlic, chopped
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 (28 ounce) can diced tomatoes
- 3 fresh peaches peeled, pitted, and sliced
- 1 (15 ounce) can garbanzo beans, drained
- 1 cup chopped dried apricots
- 2 teaspoons ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground coriander
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 2 cups chicken broth
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 1 tablespoon water
- 3 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
- 1/3 cup slivered almonds, toasted



1. Place chicken in the bottom of a slow cooker. Add the garlic, onion, tomatoes, peaches, garbanzo beans, dried



apricots, cumin, ginger, cinnamon, coriander, and cayenne pepper. Pour in the chicken broth. Cook on Low for 5 hours. 2. Remove the chicken and keep warm. Mix the cornstarch and water in a small bowl. Stir the cornstarch mixture into the slow cooker. Cook on High until the sauce has thickened, about 15 minutes. Return the chicken to the slow cooker and heat through. Top with fresh cilantro and almonds before serving.



First campers arrive Sunday

t's been a busy week of staff training and getting camp prepared for our first group of campers! The staff have been spending lots of time working on teambuilding, learning policies and procedures, setting up their cabins and activity areas, and practicing how to handle many different situations that may arise during the summer.

We've been wrapping up a bunch of different projects this week. The Welcome Center project is nearly complete, and we hope to be all moved in there by early next week. 
class (which will include a escape room activity on the last day), and an evening program called Spies and Smugglers. It should be an interesting and exciting week!



- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrilator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
