

ing session set up to teach basic CPR and to show people how to use the new AEDs that have been installed around the lake.

In the meantime we would like to clear up something of a misconception that has come to our attention. If you are dealing with someone who may have had a heart attack, it is not necessary to take that person to the AED, the units

are very easy to move and take to the person in need of assistance. The first thing to do in such a situation, even before you go to get an AED to bring to the person in distress is to call 911 and get emergency help on the way. Then you can go get the AED, bring it to the person and simply open it up -- a voice will immediately begin guiding you through the procedure to use in an


Flag of Convenience

Though I'd prefer to fly the Stars and Stripes, having no permanent light on the pole, I search for other interesting flags to fly at Birch. The current selection is the Michigan State flag which has, per the Wiki:

[...] a light blue shield, upon which the sun rises over a lake and peninsula, and a man with a raised hand representing peace and holding a long gun representing the fight for state and nation as a frontier state. As supporters, the elk and moose are derived from the Hudson's Bay Company coat of arms, and depict great animals of Michigan. The bald eagle represents the United States which formed the state of Michigan from the Northwest Territory. The design features three Latin mottos. From top-to-bottom they are:

On red ribbon: "E Pluribus Unum" means "Out of many, one," a motto of the United States.

On light blue shield: "Tuebor,"


means "I will defend."

On white ribbon: "Si Quæris Peninsulam Amœnam Circumspice," means "If you seek a pleasant peninsula, look about you." (The official state motto). [...]

Other (which, as with the flag, is easier to explain to many instead of doing so individually): we lost roughly half of our front yard when, on Memorial Day weekend, the temperature soared into mid 90s while the yard was under water (cold spring gush was literally flowing over the seawall). Tickets are priced the same as in years past and will be \$15 pre-sale, and \$20 at the door. Tickets can be bought









FLEET CAPTAIN'S CORNER

Fleet Captain's Jibe #6

last week's non-race that if there was no wind at 11 am on Sunday, we would not delay until noon in order to give people a chance to get on with their Father's Day activities. As it was we had a nice breeze an hour before and an hour after the time we had to make the call, and had we delayed we could have raced.

The Skippers & Crew meeting last Saturday at my house went really well, I thought. The new air-horn start-warning change seemed to work very well. Just as a reminder if you missed it last week, the Committee Race Boat blew the air horn two short blasts just before they called out the prestart five-minute mark for MCs and at the three-minute mark for the Sunfish fleet. At the start the air horn was blown for a longer blast. All the skippers thought this was a good addition. Here are the rules and other things we talked about:

- 1.) Be kind and have fun, and don't crash into anybody.
- 2.) The penalty for an infraction like hitting a mark or a foul is one 360 degree turn (including a jibe and tack), and must be done on the same leg as soon as you are clear from other boats. You do not need to around the mark again.
- 3.) If you are rounding a mark (buoy) the boats must be on the same tack and overlapped within three boat lengths to call for "Buoy Room." If one boat is on a starboard tack and another on a port tack, even if overlapped within three boat lengths of the upwind mark, the starboard tack boat ALWAYS has the right of way on the UPWIND mark. Rights of buoy room are established and continue for the full rounding of the mark even if there is a break in the overlap within the circle. However, on DOWNWIND marks room may be

claimed by a port tack boat against a starboard boat on which it has an inside overlap at the three-boat length circle.

- 4.) The Fourth of July Regatta Races will include three races on the Sunday before, and two races and make ups on Wednesday the Fourth.
- 5.) If you have the Right of Way over a boat that fails to yield you must avoid hitting that boat and call "Foul."
- 6.) In deciding to continue racing on a day that the wind is too windy or not windy enough sail over by the Fleet Captain, ME, and let ME know your opinion on continuing or going in, please. Also, the opinion of people on the Race Committee boat will also be considered before the decision is made to run the second and third races. Moreover, if you want to, call or text me before we go out and let me know your opinion.
- 7.) We had lots of discussion on the scoring season system we use and other systems that may available and varying ideas of the double points for regattas this year but could not agree on whether to keep it as is or to change it, so at this point we are going to leave it alone for now
- 8.) To promulgate the future of sailing here at Beautiful Birch Lake we are asking everyone to encourage their kids, grandkids and neighbors (adults and kids) on your shore to attend the free upcoming sailing lessons. Get them off the screens and motors and into sails.
- 9.) A reminder of "Barging" at the start was talked about, and in some cases it is a legitimate starting technique however, other times it may create a foul of another boat or boats. So be careful on this.
- 10) It was agreed to change the "one worse than last place penalty for DNFs." DNF will now simply be scored as last place.




11) The procedure for when a boat crosses the starting line early is to simply dip back below the starting line and cross again.



Easy beef enchiladas

5 servings

Ingredients:

1 lb. lean ground beef (at least 80 percent lean)

2 cans (10 oz. each) Old El Paso enchilada sauce

 $1\ \mathrm{can}\ (4.5\ \mathrm{oz.})$ Old El Paso chopped green chilies

1 package (8.2 oz.) Old El Paso flour tortillas 1 1/2 cup shredded Cheddar cheese Fresh toppings, as desired

Directions:

Heat oven to 375 degrees. Spray 13x9 baking dish with cooking spray.

In a nonstick skillet, cook beef over medium-high heat 5-7 minutes, stirring occasionally, until thoroughly cooked; drain. Stir in 1/2 cup of the enchilada sauce and the chilies.


Spread 1/2 cup of the enchilada sauce evenly in baking dish. Spread 1/4 cup beef



mixture down center of each tortilla; sprinkle with 1 Tbsp. cheese. Wrap tortillas tightly around filling, placing seam side down in baking dish. Top with remaining enchilada sauce. Sprinkle with remaining cheese.

Bake 20-25 minutes or until hot and bubbly. Let stand 5 minutes before serving. Add fresh toppings (salsa, green onions, avocado, etc.)

First week of camp complete

t's the first week of camp! Actually, by the time you receive this, our campers from the first session will be heading home. We had a total of 107 campers this week, and it was the first time we've done check in at our new Welcome Center!

Thank you to the West side residents who did the spaghetti dinner on Saturday evening! Our camp staff loved the food and enjoyed talking to many of our neighbors from the lake. And Miss Cindy, our cook, was excited about the leftover spaghetti that was donated to camp. Thank you!

We kicked off the week with two very hot days. Sunday evening we did our opening ceremony for the summer, with a visit from Princess Tannadoonah to light our first camp fire of the season. We all wished we could take a dip in the lake when the ceremony was over! Our first full day of the summer (Monday), we had a mandatory all-camp swim in the afternoon to make sure everyone had a chance to cool off.

This week's theme has been "Secret Agent Adventures." To fit the theme, we added some special programs, including CSI where the kids

worked all week to solve the Mystery of the Missing Bugle. We also did a Codebreakers class where the kids learned about ciphers, puzzles, codes, and on Friday we set up a mini escape room for them to figure out! 
extra boards means we can open up 16 additional spots for campers to do paddle boarding every week!



CALL 9-1-1

ALARM WILL SOUND



There are currently four (4) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake.

The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- Call 911 and report the emergency and the location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, take it to the patient and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrilator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
