AED operation clarification

We are working on getting a training session set up to teach basic CPR and to show people how to use the new AEDs that have been installed around the lake.

In the meantime we would like to clear up a misconception that has come to our attention. If you are dealing with someone who may have had a heart attack, it is not necessary to take that person to the AED.

The first thing to do in such a situation, even before you go to get an AED to bring to the person in distress is to call 911 and get emergency help on the way.

Then go to any of the AEDs on the lake (see the map of AED locations new are back of any Birch Barker) ... the units are very easy to get to. Simply open the box it is stored in, remove the AED (an alarm will sound ... let it go!), and take the AED to the person in need of assistance. Once you are back beside the person in need of assistance, open the AED -- a voice will immediately begin guiding you through the procedure to use in an emergency.

Remember, always call 911 first and give them the location of the person who needs help!

Water Quality Report

as that absolutely the best Spaghetti Dinner ever, or what? Upon sampling the food I knew it was great, the service and staff dedicated and highly efficient, and the spirit and atmosphere (as always) were wonderful.

Frankly, over the years I've been spoiled and this year expected nothing less. However, when I found out that all of the proceeds went to the Water Quality Fund and that the total contribution amount was some \$1900, my appreciation of all things to do with this year's Spaghetti Dinner grew exponentially. I can't realistically imagine a better outcome from this wonderful event. For perspective, please consider that the \$1900 donation ought to cover somewhere around one third of Water Quality typical current annual general expenditures (of say \$5000 - \$6000).

Fortunately, ever since Eurasian Milfoil was discovered in our lake some ten years ago, combined voluntary donations to the Water Quality Program and Milfoil/Loosestrife Eradication funds have generally met or exceeded our annual expenses. Particularly with this new \$1900 infusion we now have a slight "reserve."

Was/is there still cause for any concern? Unfortunately, yes:

1. Our income is solely dependent on voluntary donations. (Unlike virtually

every other lake in this State that treats for invasives, Birch has not relinquished treatment control to the local government, which then establishes a special assessment district, unilaterally taxing all the affected property owners each year to pay for the treatment.)

- 2. Our expenses do keep rising, if only due to inflation.
- 3. Beyond that, the unpredictable nature of our challenges means we are always exposed to the possibility of huge cost increases with little, if any, notice. For example:
- a. Chemicals currently used may become ineffective or prohibited.
- b Potential cutbacks in State funding could substantially raise the cost of both permits and participation in the CLMP (Cooperative Lakes Management Program that monitors, collects, records and compares all of our lake test data).
- c. Most concerning, in our state alone, there are already over 1,000 known aquatic invasive species. Some of them are very difficult and expensive to get under control, grow quickly and are already way too close to our lake for comfort. The question is not so much "if" but "when" will we be affected. When that reality hits us, we need to be able to respond at once. Our costs for professional assessment and treatment could literally double, triple or more, overnight. We need to be prepared (and therefore make



and eat more spaghetti).

So, wasn't this year's Spaghetti Dinner a delightful event from every perspective? Our heartfelt thanks to all who participated in any fashion, even if only to buy tickets.

Also to help us further build our reserves please consider making a, or increasing your, donation to the Water Quality Program and/or Milfoil/Loosestrife Eradication funds each year - even if you choose not to belong to or participate in the Yacht Club or Homeowner's Association. Thank you. Not only to the Spaghetti Dinner folks for the great meal and wonderful donation, but to all for your past and future financial support.

Cheesy Amish breakfast casserole

- 1 1/2 cups small curd cottage cheese
- 1 1/4 cups shredded Swiss cheese
- Add all ingredients to list

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.



- 2. Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat; cook and stir bacon and onion until bacon is evenly browned, about 10 minutes. Drain. Transfer bacon and onion to a large bowl. Stir in potatoes, eggs, Cheddar cheese, cottage cheese, and Swiss cheese. Pour mixture into prepared baking dish.
- 3. Bake in preheated oven until eggs are set and cheese is melted, 45 to 50 minutes. Let stand 10 minutes before cutting and serving.

t's Outer Space week at camp this week! Our campers have been doing outer space-themed crafts and activities all week. It's also Super Week, which means that some of the kids who are here this week are here for 10 days, rather than just 7. And Saturday starts our Mini Camp, which is a three-day camp for kids who aren't sure they want to do a full week of camp. We have 123 kids here for Session 2 right now, and about 40 of them are staying through the 10-day Super Week. Another 25 will arrive on Saturday morning for Mini Camp.

We've had some fun specialty programs going on this week, including a Sew Your Own Teddy Bear class (using camp t-shirts), an advanced nature activity, volleyball, flag football, guitar and ukulele lessons, and a "magician in training" class. Last week, Mr. Phil (Phil Vitale) volunteered to lead a Creative Communications class. He had one very enthusiastic camper sign up, and they spent the week taking photos, writing, and creating a fun PowerPoint presentation to show the other campers.

Last week was quite wet here at camp, so we've been very relieved to see the sun this week! Our schedules at camp work much better when it's not pouring rain! But even in the rain, we improvise and come up with lots of fun things for the kids to do during the day. Our camp garden was so underwater at one point that our staff was considering grabbing buckets and bailing it out!

We are up to 923 registered campers for the summer, which is 67 short of our goal for the year. We still have openings for most of the remaining sessions, so if you have campers who are thinking about signing up for camp, go to register. tannadoonah.org to get them on our list! It's amazing to think that we're over 900 kids and I'm still trying to recruit more. In 2006, when I first became Camp Director, we had just 351 kids for the entire summer!


Every year we try to think of ways we can improve our programs and facilities. One of the things we've been changing up this year is how we do our end of the week closing ceremonies. In the past, we sang songs, handed out awards, sang some more songs, handed out some more awards, and repeat. That meant that the Council Fire ceremony involved a lot of sitting and listening for the kids. This year we've decided to make it more interactive and fun for the kids. So each cabin has been asked to perform a song,

skit, or dance at Council Fire, and we've cut down on the amount of talking and presenting that we do.

We also changed the awards that the kids receive at the end of each week. Instead of printing awards and participation cards on cardstock and handing them out for each activity that the kids participated in, we created little wooden tags with symbols for each award on them. We found a crafter online who was able to laser etch each cedar tag with the symbols, and we create a string of tags for each camper showing the activities they did for that session. It's a fun new way to honor their accomplishments at camp.

We hope to see everyone at the Pancake Breakfast on Sunday, July 8, from 8:30-11 am! Our board and volunteers are excited to see everyone from the lake community who comes out to join us for a morning of pancakes and sausage. This event is a fundraiser for camp – all proceeds from the breakfast go towards programs and projects to help make camp better for all of our participants! Please come out and support Camp Tannadoonah and enjoy a yummy breakfast with us!



All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- Call 911 and report the emergency and the location immediately.
- Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, take it to the patient and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrilator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
