Fifth AED installed, 6th coming soon!

The Birch Lake Homeowners Association has reported that a 5th Automatic Electric Defibrillator (AED) has been installed at the garage of Scott and Holly Troeger, 63696 Birch Rd., just north of the public landing. The garage is on the east side of the road, across the road from the Troeger home.

The Homeowners Association also announced that the sixth (and final)

AED will soon be installed at the DeYoung home (formerly the home of Jack and Marty Miller) at 63255 Storey Hill St. That unit will be installed on the north face of the garage.

All Birch Lake residents are invited and encouraged to attend the Annual Meeting of the Homeowners Association on Saturday, Aug. 11. In addition to the regular annual business, the meeting will feature a demonstration and training on the new Birch Lake AEDs (automatic electric defibrillator) as well as a CPR (cardio-pulminary resuscitation) training session.

The Annual Meeting will begin at approximately 11 am (after the Birch Lake Yacht Club Board meeting).

There are currently five (5) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake.

The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.

Ingredients:


- 1 pound fresh strawberries, hulled and halved

appy 4th of July! We just wrapped up our "Super Week" Session and our entire get a nice long holiday weekend. I know our counselors were all looking forward to a 5-day break, and many of them were going to take a trip into Chicago for a few days.

This past week and a half was quite an adventure with the heat up here at camp. We had to change up our schedule a bit to make room for additional water activities, made a giant slip-n-slide, played sprinkler soccer, and had extra water stations at several locations in camp. When we come back from our 4th of July holiday break on Sunday, we welcome our largest group of campers yet this year, with 139 kids registered! Our capacity, with day


campers included, is 150, so it will be a big week for sure! All of our beds for girls will be full, and we have a few open spots left for boys.


