ps - the moral: go ahead, lie about 60 being 40 but ... don't try to play with the 20-somethings.


Eurasian Milfoil Updates(s)




- its second survey of the year on our lake and found that:





STU'S STAR STUFF



Answering the really big questions ...

pday's big question - Where do astronauts leave their space craft?

We'll get to that shortly. But first... A meteor shower is a spike in the number of meteors or "shooting stars" that streak through the night sky.

Most meteor showers are spawned by comets. As a comet orbits the Sun it sheds an icy, dusty debris stream along its orbit. If Earth travels through this stream, we will see a meteor shower. Although the meteors can appear anywhere in the sky, if you trace their paths, the meteors in each shower appear to "rain" into the sky from the same region.

Meteor showers are named for the constellation that coincides with this region in the sky, a spot known as the radiant. For instance, the radiant for the Leonid meteor shower in November is in the constellation Leo. The Perseid meteor shower is so named because meteors appear to fall from a point in the constellation Perseus

"Shooting stars" and "falling stars" are both names that describe meteors — streaks of light across the night sky caused by small bits of interplanetary rock and debris called meteoroids vaporizing high in Earth's upper atmosphere. Traveling at tens of thousands of miles an hour, meteoroids quickly ignite from the searing friction with the atmosphere, 30 to 80 miles above the ground. Almost all are destroyed in this process; the rare few that survive and hit the ground are known as meteorites.

When a meteor appears, it seems to "shoot" quickly across the sky, and its small size and intense brightness might make you think it is a star. If you're lucky enough to spot a meteorite (a meteor that makes it all the way to the ground), and see where it hits, it's easy to think you just saw a star "fall."

The best way to see meteors is to get away from the glow of city lights, (here at the lake is good) and look toward the constellation from which the meteors will appear to radiate.

The brightest meteor shower of the year is coming up, and it should be very easy to see.

The 2015 Perseid meteor shower will happen from July 13 to August 26, with activity peaking next week around August 12 and 13.

The Perseids are typically the brightest of the year. And this year should be an especially good year since the moon will not come out until after sunrise, avoiding the pesky bright light it gives off.

Professionals estimates that at its peak, Perseids will produce up to 100 meteors per hour (Yeah, right. How many times have we heard that one before?) streaking across the sky at 37 miles per second. The best time for viewing is after midnight, when the meteors will pick up steam until the wee hours before dawn.

Here are some tips to help you get the most out of your meteor shower-watching experience:

- Find an open location away from bright city lights and other light pollution. Here at the lake is ideal.
- Bring something comfortable to sit or lie down on and try to fill your entire peripheral vision with the night sky. If it's cool, dress warmly.
- Give your eyes time to adjust to the darkness. This can take up to 20 minutes and can be disrupted by looking at a bright cell phone or tablet screen. If you need to shine a light on something, use a flashlight

with a red filter, the easiest color on your eyes.

- Be patient. Give yourself anywhere between 30 minutes and an hour, and the streaking meteors should be easily spotted against the still night sky once your eyes are fully adjusted.
- Don't worry about using telescopes or binoculars. Those devices may actually make it harder for you to see meteors, since they only cover a small portion of the sky. You should be able to easily see the show, and more of it, with just your own two eyes.

— Dana on Drugs —

Is your blood pressure med making you cough?

By **Dana Soldato**, PharmD igh blood pressure is the most significant risk factor for cardiovascular disease. Your risk of stroke, heart attack, heart failure, kidney failure, or early death has a direct correlation with your blood pressure. High blood pressure ruins your eyes, your kidneys, your brain, and your heart. For this reason, there are multiple medications and multiple mechanisms that are utilized to reduce high blood pressure. Most people with high blood pressure are on multiple medications to lower their blood pressure.

To lower blood pressure, doctors commonly prescribe a medication known as an "ACE Inhibitor". ACE inhibitors are inexpensive, well studied, and proven to lower morbidity and mortality! Examples of ACE inhibitors are lisinopril, ramipril, enalapril, captopril, quinapril, moexepril, trandolapril, perindopril, fosinopril, and benazepril (ACE inhibitors always end in "pril"). Anybody with diabetes or a history of heart attack, heart failure, or stroke will be on an ACE inhibitor (unless contraindicated).

ACE inhibitors work to block a step in the "Renin-Angiotensin-Aldosterone-System (RAAS)". Your kidneys are the major player involved in this mechanism. Cells within your kidneys release a substance called "renin". Once renin is released by the kidneys, a "Rube Goldberg-like" reaction occurs resulting in elevated blood pressure. ACE inhibitors were designed to block a step in this pathway! The exact step that is blocked is the conversion of Angiotensin I to Angiotensin II. This step utilizes a catalyst called (I bet you can guess it)..."ACE". By blocking ACE, you block essential steps for raising blood pressure. However, ACE is not solely used to catalyze the reaction used for increasing blood pressure. ACE is also needed for the metabolism of bradykinin. This is significant because elevated bradykinin levels make you cough.

The cough that results is a dry, tickly, persistent cough that occurs anywhere from a few days to a few months after initiation of the drug. This bothersome cough occurs in 1-10 percent of people on ACE inhibitors

and is more common in women, African-Americans, Chinese, and those with a history of heart failure. The cough will disappear 4 days to 4 weeks after stopping the medication.

If you experience a cough while on an ACE inhibitor, do not stop the medication—just be sure to let your doctor know! Your doctor can prescribe a different medication known as an ARB (Angiotensin Receptor Blocker). "ARB's" directly block angiotensin II (see above), leaving ACE available for bradykinin metabolism. ARB's end in "-sartan" and before 2010, none were available generic. Now, we have 5 generic ARB's (valsartan, candesartan, irbesartan, telmisartan, losartan) making these drugs affordable!

To summarize, ACE Inhibitors are medications that are used to lower blood pressure. They work by blocking an enzyme called ACE which is involved in the blood pressure pathway. However, by blocking ACE, ACE Inhibitors interfere with the metabolism of bradykinin. Elevated bradykinin results in a persistent dry, hacking cough. To stop the cough, stop the medication, but tell your doctor first!






