I'd like to thank Caroline Cotton for



How to dispose of unwanted medication

In today's world, almost everyone has a cabinet full of medications. Whether they be prescription drugs, or over the counter medications, there will come a time when you realize that you may no longer need a medication, or that medications you have stockpiled have already expired. You may find, however, that cleaning out the medicine cabinet brings on new questions: Can I throw this medicine in the trash? Should I flush it down the toilet? Will it get into the water supply?

Rest easy, because I'm here to tell you that it's much less complicated than you might think.

The absolute best way to dispose of your old medication is through a medication "take-back" program.

The relatively nearby Elkhart Police Department, for example, maintains a drop box provided by the Elkhart County Drug-Free Partnership. This drop box works like a library book return. You can also dispose of your medications at the Household Hazardous Waste Drop-Off Days held on the first Saturday of every month from 8-3 at the Elkhart County Correctional Facility off of County Road 7.

These are the two ongoing programs that I am most familiar with, but I have also heard the Cass County Sheriff's Office maintains a permanent medication drop box.

If you are unable to dispose of your medication through a take-back program, most medications can be safely disposed of in the regular trash. All you need to do is mix the medication into something undesirable like cat litter or used coffee grounds. Once mixed with something undesirable, nobody will want to ingest your medication and it is safe for disposal into your regular trash.

If you are worried about the medication ending up in the water supply, place the medication in a sealed container before throwing in the trash. This prevents the drug contents from leaching out into waste removal byproducts. Importantly for your personal privacy protection, be sure to remove and shred labels from any medication bottles that are being disposed of.

Controlled substances are medications that have a high risk of being abused or addictive. Because of this, we have to be much more careful in how we dispose of these medications. These are the ONLY medications that should ever be flushed down the toilet. The reason that flushing these products is advised is primarily because of safety concerns — by flushing controlled substances down the toilet, we



guarantee the immediate disposal of a medication that could be fatal if found by an animal or child.

I would only recommend flushing, however, as a "last ditch" option if you cannot find a nearby take back program. While trace amounts of medication can be found in the water supply, the FDA and Environmental Protection Agency have concluded that there have been no adverse human health effects from drug residues in the environment.

That said, in order to keep water such as Birch Lake pristine and beautiful, I recommend going the "extra mile" and finding a take back program where controlled substances can be safely disposed of.

To summarize, unwanted medications should be disposed of through a medication take back program or mixed with something undesirable and placed in your regular trash. Never dispose of medications by flushing them down the toilet, with the exception of a few controlled substances as a "last ditch" practice.







Grilled Chicken with Rosemary and Bacon

makes 4 servings **Ingredients:** 4 teaspoons garlic powder 4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves salt and pepper to taste 4 sprigs fresh rosemary 4 thick slices bacon **Directions** Preheat an outdoor grill for medium-high heat, and lightly oil the grate. Sprinkle 1 teaspoon garlic powder on a chicken breast and season with salt and pepper. Lay one rosemary sprig on the chicken breast. Wrap the bacon around the chicken to hold the rosemary on. Secure the bacon with a toothpick or an additional thick rosemary stem.

Cook the chicken breasts until no longer pink in the center and the juices run clear, 8 minutes per side. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center should read at least 165 degrees F (74 degrees C). Stay near the grill to combat any flare ups from the bacon. Remove the toothpicks before serving.

Camp Tannadoonah

The start of our camp season is really just a few days away! This year we have a lot going on up at camp, and many changes.

Probably the biggest change is that Miss Sue, my assistant camp director for the past 7 seasons, is not going to be returning as assistant director. I have hired TWO new people to fill her role – she was so amazing that I didn't feel like I could possibly ask a single person to fill her shoes.

Miss Kayla will be one of the assistant directors. Last summer, Miss Kayla was on the camp staff as our photographer. She has recently graduated from IU Bloomington with a degree in Elementary Education, with a focus on reading intervention. She has spent the past 4 months student teaching in a 5th grade classroom in the Elkhart Community schools, and is currently applying for jobs in the Elkhart area. She hopes to teach 1st or 2nd grade next year.

Mr. Shawn will be the other assistant director. Mr. Shawn is new to Camp Tannadoonah. He is coming to Tannadoonah all the way from New Jersey! He worked at Frost Valley YMCA camp in 2010, and has worked at YMCA Camp Mason since 2011, as a counselor, village leader, CIT director, and Outdoor Education Naturalist. He graduated from Montclair State University in 2014, with a degree in Sociology.

We are also introducing a new position at camp this year - unit leaders. In each area of camp (the Birdyard (Cardinals, Wrens, Robins, and Woodpeckers), the Back Cabins (Wallace, Exchange, and Rotary), and the Front cabins (Exchangettes, Luta Koda, and Morris) there will be an experienced counselor who will serve as a unit leader.

We are shaping this position to be similar to an RA in college dorms – they will be the first person that staff can go to if they have a concern in their cabin. We hope it will improve communication among the staff, because they will feel more comfortable talking to a peer rather than a supervisor about minor issues. The unit leaders can provide feedback and advice, and can bring larger issues to the attention of the senior staff.


Another interesting change this year is that we have hired EIGHT international staff! We had trouble filling all of our staff positions, and sought staff from an international staffing agency. It's a great service – they find college students who want to work at American summer camps, interview them, do background checks, help them get their visas, arrange their flights, etc. Then we can search a directory of available candidates, and set up Skype interviews with them! Many of the students are from Great Britain because that is where the staffing agency is based.

It will be fun for the campers and other staff to interact with staff members who come from such varying backgrounds! We have Hugo (from Chile) who will be leading Sports and Games, Yang (from China) who will be at sports and games and archery, Jess (from Wales) will be at the waterfront, Steven (from Scotland) will be the nature leader, Becky (from England) will be the camp photographer, Conrad (from England) will be the sailing instructor, Bethany (from Scotland) will be teaching crafts and drama, and Toby (from England) will be leading the "Sparks" (our youngest campers).

In just a few days (on June 1) my assistant directors will be arriving for training. Unit leaders arrive on June 3, Lifeguards on June 4, and the rest of the staff arrives on June 7! We'll be up and running before you know it!
