





Regatta Scoring: This regatta was scored using the Low Point System as specified in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016, Appendix A.

For this Regatta all races are counted. For each race, a boat's finishing place is her race score.

A boat which did not compete or did not finish in a race is given a score equal to the number of boats competing in the series plus one.

The Sunfish on the other hand only completed two races due to the absence of wind power! The winds on Saturday and Sunday, or rather lack of winds, caused us to cancel both days of racing.

We will try again this weekend to complete our usual three races, hopefully the winds will be to our favor!

Lactose in Medication

n the United States, 25 percent of the Caucasian population and **-**75-90 percent of African American, Native American, and Asian American populations have lactose intolerance.

Lactose intolerance is a condition in which the small intestine is unable to digest lactose, a sugar found commonly in milk and dairy products. If lactose is ingested it leads to gastrointestinal symptoms (bloating, cramping, diarrhea) that usually subside after removal of milk products and other lactose containing products from the diet.

While lactose is primarily thought to be found in food, lactose also exists within medications!

Lactose is frequently utilized in medications as an inactive ingredient. All medications contain inactive ingredients that work to hold the pill together. While the inactive ingredients do not affect the mechanism of the medication, they may aggravate

disease states, particularly those with lactose intolerance.

Luckily, the amount of lactose found in 1 pill is usually rather small in comparison to the amount of lactose it takes to trigger an unpleasant reaction.

However, considering the average 65-69 year old consumes 14 pre-

scriptions per year and the average 80-84 year old consumes 18 prescriptions per year, you could see how it would be possible to experience symptoms of lactose intolerance due to medications

To check for hidden sources of lactose in medication, you could either check the package insert or call your pharmacist. To view the package insert online, go to http://dailymed.nlm. nih.gov/dailymed/ and type your medication name into the search

From there, select the manufacturer (found on your Rx label), and scroll down to the section labeled "Ingredients and Appearance."

Summer sky in full splendor

he Fourth of July is a time for beautiful lights in the evening sky. If you didn't make it to a big fireworks display last weekend though, Mother Nature offers some lights of her own; a sprinkling of bright stars and planets across the night sky.

A couple of those lights are in good view well before the color of twilight drains from the west. The planets Venus and Jupiter stand side by side. They're the brightest objects in the night sky after the Moon, so you just can't miss them. Venus is the brighter of the two. And Regulus, the heart of Leo, stands not far to their upper left.

By the time the sky gets good and dark, the golden planet Saturn stands well up in the south. And Antares, the heart of the scorpion, is down to its lower left.

And the dazzling Summer Triangle is high in the eastern sky. Its brightest point is also its highest with the star Vega, in Lyra, the harp. Deneb is to its lower left, at the tail of Cygnus the swan. And Altair, in Aquila, the eagle, is farther to the lower right of Vega.

The Big Dipper's familiar shape lies high in the northwest as darkness

falls these July evenings. One of the summer sky's finest binocular double stars marks the bend of the Dipper's handle. Mizar shines at second magnitude, some six times brighter than its fourth-magnitude companion, Alcor. Even though these two are not physically related, they make a fine sight through binoculars. (People with good eyesight often can split the pair without optical aid.) A small telescope reveals Mizar itself as double and these components do orbit each other.

And perhaps the most spectacular nightlight of all arcs through the Summer Triangle: the glowing band of the Milky Way. It's not nearly as bright as all those fireworks displays, so you need to be far away from city lights to see it. Thankfully, here at the lake we are. Yet in its own way, it's much more impressive. It's the combined light of millions of stars outlining the disk of our home galaxy; a special kind of fireworks display in the summer sky.

More next week. Maybe.







The days are flying by up here at Camp Tannadoonah and suddenly it's July! We're in the middle of our 4th session of camp already. It was great to see so many lake folks and their friends and families at the pancake breakfast this weekend. It's always a fun morning, and the food was great as always. Thank you all for coming out to support Camp T! And a big thank you to the crew who organized the event, cooked, cleaned, and did dishes. Your hard work is much appreciated.

It was such a beautiful weekend to be here at Birch Lake! Many of our counselors this year are from far-away places so a number of them got to experience the holiday weekend on the lake. Six of them got to join us on the boat to watch the fireworks as well, including three international staff who experienced the 4th of July Holiday for the 1st time!

This week is Pirate Week at camp, and our counselors have been planning fun pirate-themed activities. On Sunday night we had Capture the Treasure (aka Capture the Flag). On Tuesday we played "Island Hopping" – a series of stations with different games at each station, and on

Wednesday we had cardboard "pirate ship" races in the lake.

This next week we have our American Camp Association
Accreditation visit, which means that's what I've been working on for most of the past few weeks! There are 7 different areas that the ACA visitors look at: (1) Site and Food Service, (2)
Operational Management, (3) Human Resources, (4) Program Design and Activities, (5) Aquatics, (6)
Transportation, and (7) Health and Wellness. Each area has a binder of standards that we have to comply with in order to stay accredited by the ACA.

Our ACA accreditation is something that is really important to us at camp. The process may be stressful and time consuming, but it means that we're setting a high bar for ourselves and making sure that we run a quality program here at Camp. I always tell parents that when they're choosing a camp, they should choose one that is accredited.


When the ACA visitors come next Tuesday, they will look through all of the documentation we have put together, walk around camp and observe our activities in progress, and interview campers and staff about various things we do at camp. They look at everything from how food is stored and dishes are cleaned, to whether our campers and staff are wearing lifejackets at the waterfront. Plus several hundred pages of documents that we have to show!

We're looking forward to some busy weeks ahead here at camp. We have 96 campers here this week, and it's the smallest week we have left this summer! The remaining weeks have 113, 124, 109, and 114 campers each! We're around 840 total campers for the summer, which is about 20 ahead of last year's total. I'm hoping we can get to 850 but that may be a stretch because there are so few slots left. It's sure keeping our staff on their toes! This week we had a number of new staff joining us, so it's been fun seeing all the new energy and hearing their excitement about the rest of the summer. It's hard to believe that we're a week into July already, and in just 4 short weeks we'll be wrapping up another summer here at camp. It goes by too quickly!
