If you've never seen it before, definitely come out on your boat and float in front of camp to see the campers and staff come down the stairs with their candles! We will gather on the camp pier and sing to those gathered on the lake.

I wanted to say a huge thank you to Michelle Seyfarth for organizing this year's house walk. The house walk raised \$2,375, which will be used for scholarships for kids to attend camp. I know that a lot of time and energy went into this event! Thank you to all of the families who opened their homes to visitors, and all of the volunteers who shuttled people around in their boats, and everyone who helped with ticket sales, collecting tickets, and getting everything put together for this event. And, of course, to everyone who participated in the house walk.

We are excited to be able to provide more campers with the opportunity to attend Camp, both this summer, and next summer. This year, we provided full or partial scholarships to a total of 76 campers, and raised over \$35,000 for camperships!

We finished out the summer with a grand total of 962 campers, which is 2 more than we had last year. It's a little short of our goal for the year, but we're happy to have served so many kids! It's a long way from the 351 we had in 2006!

Next week we have a rental group at camp for the week. It's a church from the Detroit area, and this is the 2nd year they've done a week of camp for their youth. They'll be here from Monday afternoon through Saturday midday. Last year they just did a two-day camp, so they're expanding this year and have more kids coming with them for the week. The past few years we have been able to utilize camp more and more during the "shoulder season," or the months that we don't run our own camp programs. It's great to be able to bring more people out here, and introduce more kids and families to Camp Tannadoonah! This year, we have this church group, two weddings, a birthday party, a sorority retreat, and our own fall camp and family camp weekend planned, in the months of August, September, and October.

As we bring the camp season to a close, I want to say thank you to all of the people from the Birch Lake community who support camp, by volunteering, making donations, attending the pancake breakfast, serving on our Board, sending their children and grandchildren to camp, and helping spread the word about camp to others in the community. We truly appreciate everything that the Lake Community does to help us be successful!
