





— Water Quality Report —

'Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves'

aves and wakes (man made waves) not only threaten smaller boats and swimmers but also tend to erode shorelines and scour nearby and other shallow lake bottoms. The maintenance and protection of all shorelines (preferably natural) is critically important and further discussed in another article.

While we cannot control the waves made by God, we can hopefully limit some of the wave damages caused by us. Boat waves are deeper and have far more energy than surface waves.

When we stir up the lake bottom we free up and raise into the water column one of its most undesirable possessions – phosphorus – that was previously attached to decaying organic material at the bottom. That newly suspended phosphorus enhances turbidity (makes the water more cloudy) and increases the phosphorus loading in the lake. Phosphorus is also further discussed in a different article. Stirring up the lake bottom can also cause the destruction of

native aquatic plants by breaking them off at, or pulling them out by, their roots.

So please refrain from making large waves and/or accelerating or going fast wherever your prop wash will result in disturbance of the lake bottom. This applies to both shoreline, and any other shallow, areas of the lake.

Particularly when water levels are high (as they are now), consider trying to make no waves (wakes). If you must make waves, please try to minimize their effect by limiting their



height and keeping them to the center, deeper part of the lake.

Always drive your power boat in a counter-clockwise rotation, and constantly plot your course to assure you stay the required 100' (Reminding boaters that "You are responsible for your wake," the Water Sports Industry Association recommends at least 200') minimum from all shorelines and other objects on the water, allowing for where any upcoming craft may be headed and for each vessel's towed skiers, tubes, etc. (which are typically 60' – 75' or more behind and/or along side of the boats towing them).



Beef BBQ

From the 2004 Birch Lake Ladies Luncheon Recipe Collection*

by Le King - Northside

- 6 lbs chuck roast
- 2 medium onions chopped
- 1 large green pepper chopped
- 28 oz Heinz Ketchup
- 2 bottles Heinz chili sauce
- 2 teas. dried mustard
- 4 teas. sugar
- 4 teas. vinegar
- 1 bag pickling spice (about 2 Tbls. wrapped in cheese cloth and tied)

Cook the roast as usual. After it's cool, remove the fat and cut the meat into small pieces. Mix all the other ingredients in a pot and add beef. Simmer 1 hour or more until onions and peppers are tender and flavors are blended. Remove the spice packet and serve on hamburger buns.

This recipe is from the late 30's and early 40's and her mother made it for the Lincoln School Fall Festival in South Bend.

Flashback to 12 years ago ...

have a Birch Barker Flashback this week! Last week when I was writing my Barker article, I accidentally clicked on an old Barker article I had written years ago. I was so amazed by how different things are now from how they were 12 years ago that I decided to share part of that old article this week. This Barker article was written on July 31, 2007, which was the second summer that I was Camp Director.

It's the last week of camp already. Can't believe how fast this summer has flown by! On Friday night around 9 to 9:15 pm we will be having our annual end-of-the-summer candlelight serenade down on the pier. Come on out in your boats to hear us serenade the lake and see the beautiful candles floating on the water!

This week's theme is On the Loose Week (also known as Wilderness Week). Each of the cabins will be camping out in tents at least one night this week. We only have 35 kids this week, so it's a very small group. In total we ended up with 370 kids for the summer, 8 short of our total from 2006, and well short of our goal of 450 kids. Next year we need to get more kids up here!

This was a really great summer up here at camp. We had a fantastic group of staff members who all got along very well together, and had a great time up here at Tannadoonah. It was a huge staff in comparison to last year (we had 23 cabin staff this year, compared to only 11 last year!). We added a lot of great new programs, and had lots of kids trying new things at camp. It was also a young camp this year (camper-wise), which bodes well for next year. More than 90 percent of the kids up at camp this summer were going into the seventh grade or younger! I don't think Morris Lodge has ever been so empty! So hopefully next year many of those kids will return, and bring lots of friends with them.


To contrast that with this year.... We currently have 985 campers registered for camp this year, and I'm still hoping we will get to 1000 before the end of the summer. That's a 615 camper increase! And we have 303 NEW campers this year – so nearly as many kids coming to camp for the first time this year as we had total campers the entire summer in 2007. Unlike 2007, Morris Lodge has been completely full every week, and we have had

13 and 14 year olds in other cabins as well, because there are so many older campers.


This year we have 30 cabin counselors, 5 program volunteers, 5 kitchen staff, a nurse, a photographer, a CIT director, a facilities manager, and 5 admin staff, for a total of 49 staff here all the time, plus other volunteers and staff who are here for certain big weeks.

In other news, we'd like to extend a huge thank you to everyone who came out for the Pancake Breakfast this weekend. We had 406 total guests at the breakfast, and a great group of volunteers helping make pancakes, serve food, and clean up. Thank you to board members Sharon Hayward. Andrew Roche, Patrick Welch, John Michel, Michael Lacognato, Karen Delledonne, Lauren Wills, and Cindy Krupp for volunteering. And to spouses Maggie Michel, Yoli Roche, Chas Grundy, Jeannie Welch, and Rich Krupp. And to Corrinne Roche, Avery Grundy, and Elyse Grundy for being runners and extra helpers!



FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- **4. South Shore**, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
