

## FLEET CAPTAIN'S CORNER



### Fleet Captain's Jibe #15, Aug. 31

e had a great day for the sailboat races on Sunday with winds pretty steady all day with gusts up to 15mph which gave us all a significant challenge. The races were lively and quick, with only one crash when Bill Luecht and I rounded one of the marks together in the second race and I was on the inside and called "Bouy Room" in front of me he unexpectedly slowed to a snails- pace crawl causing me to ram into his rudder and transom. In other words I rear ended him. Because we do not have brakes on our sailboats I was told by Sailor Phil Vitale, in the boat behind that he had witnessed the whole incident and that I had in fact fouled Mr. Bill, so I did my 360 penalty turn, as required and the race continued as normal. No damage was suffered by either boat.

That was Barb's first win of the season which made her a happy camper for the rest of the day. Jeff additionally, took two 2nds with Sailor Phil Vitale in his boat named The Pickle picking up the other 2nd. Bill Luecht got one third and yours truly captured two 3rds which made us both

THE "SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY"

- I. THOU SHALT PREVENT THE SPREAD OF AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES (AIS).
- II. THOU SHALT MINIMIZE SURFACE RUNOFF.
- III. THOU SHALT MINIMIZE THE EFFECTS OF WAVES.
- IV. THOU SHALT PROTECT AND EXPAND NATURAL SHORELINES.
- V. THOU SHALT NOT ALLOW PHOSPHORUS, NUTRIENTS, AND OTH-ER UNDESIRABLE CHEMICAL ELEMENTS TO ENTER OUR LAKE.
- VI. THOU SHALT REMAIN INFORMED AND ACTIVE ABOUT OTHER WATER QUALITY ISSUES.



## WQ Report - End of Summer

ou might have noticed over the summer the listing and presenting of what we call the 6 commandments. These are issues and concerns and activities that we as lake dwellers should keep in mind as we further develop our properties and use the lake. We want to maintain this lake in as pristine and safe condition as we can, and believe that attention to these commandments will help permit this. Articles, explaining one each of the 6 commandments, can be found in six of this summer's previous Barkers. Further questions or comments can be directed to Paul Fallon.

2. In addition to the commandments, we have talked about the shoreline extensively as it is both a buffer to what happens on the land as well as the ecological contact between water and earth. The buffer part is to keep things we do not want to get into the lake out of the lake and the ecological contact part is that a lot of the animals both large and small rely on a shoreline habitat for reproduction, early development, food sources, and shelter. Please look at the two attached web sites as you think about what you might do to enhance your shoreline next year etc. (www. mishorelandstewards.org and www. mishorelinepartnership.org).

3. As we tidy up this fall some may want to do a little burning by the side of the road or (horrors) close to the lake. Should you feel absolutely compelled to do this, and we would encourage you to not do it, please after the fire goes out sweep up the ashes and bag them for the trash. The alternative is during the next rain you will see them head to lake as ready to use fertilizer and minerals that will enhance extra plant growth.

4. Our role on the Water Quality Committee is somewhat simple in premise. (A) Survey the lake for invasive species and if something can be done about them to advertise this to the lake and set the proper procedures in motion. This is most evident for the Eurasian milfoil that would be clogging many acres of the lake in the absence of this. Sorry there is nothing we can do about zebra mussels, but they have declined on their own the

past few years. They can just as well rebound. We are closely monitoring both starry stonewort and hydrilla, two truly nasty invasives should they get into the lake. Tell friends you know that bring their boats from other lakes to make sure they properly clean them before launching them here. Also, should you take a boat or kayak to another lake. please properly clean it before placing in back in Birch. (B) Monitor the lake for evidence of increasing levels of nutrients that will age the lake prema-turely and report on this to the lake community. (C) Ascertain the safety of the lake waters for the recreational activities we all enjoy and wish to have our children and grandchildren enjoy now and in the

5. In the future, just take some time to truly try and be aware of the lake. Especially in the spring when the water is clear, cruise around the shallows and drop offs and look at the diversity of plant life that exists in different parts of the lake. Keep pathways for the turtles to come ashore and lay their eggs. Provide cover at the shoreline for small fish to hide in, insects to come to, and frogs to lurk when the insects are around. Grab some decaying material from the bottom and put in a white pan and watch the life that springs from this. Have your kids try to learn the names of some of the aguatic plants. Hopefully, you can think of even more ways to become better aware of, and learn more about, our lake.

6. Commandment #6, explained in the August 3d Barker, referred to the need for adequate donations to fund our Water Quality [WQ] program. As stated, should we ever run meaningfully short, likely our only option would be to request the township establish a Special Assessment District [SAD], which, once in place, the township would run with our TAX dollars. Virtually all other Michigan lakes that are treated for invasive species [like Birch Lake is] are financed by SADs, the costs for which are arbitrarily added to the tax bills of ALL property owners in that district. It is a huge blessing indeed that we have, ever since we started incurring substantial expense fighting invasives in 2007,

survived on donations alone. So, how much should people donate? In truth, no one knows. We don't know when the invasives we have will hybridize, when the next invasives will arrive, which one[s] it will be, or the costs of timely and appropriate treatment. When Eurasian Milfoil [EM] first hit 12 years ago, our treatment costs alone were higher than the average sum of our current annual expenses. Lately our annual expenses for professional surveys and treatment, testing and education have totaled in the neighborhood of \$4500.00 per year. Typically, we have about that much in the bank, which is good, should our expenses stay flat. BUT THEY WON'T STAY FLAT! Our treatment costs the first year for EM were some \$6,000. Our most likely next visitor, Starry Stonewort[SS], is considered to be tougher to treat than EM. Shouldn't our reserves allow for this and be increased to say 11000., 12,000. or even more? To do so, each of us now contributing would have to minimally double their current annual donation. What are the typical annual donation amounts? Since the typical balance on hand never goes much below or above one year of expenses, it seems fair to assume two things about that amount: it is more or less the result of cumulative abnormal [fund raising type ] contributions, AND it is the approximate total of regular annual donations. An educated guess is that around 100 families donate annually to the WQ fund. This means that: the average donated amount is around \$45. [Thanks to those that do so.], and that less than half of those here donate. [Shame on those that don't. You don't have to be a member of the Yacht Club or the Homeowners' Association to donate to the one cause that ALL of us, undisputedly, have in common and benefit from.] To double our reserves [a modest, reasonable goal], requires that those now giving will have to double the amount they now give [to say \$90./ yr.], or that double the amount of people will have to donate the same average [ say \$45. /yr.], or that some combination of the two increases must occur simultaneously. Come on everybody, write a [bigger] check. Let's get this thing done!

# — Barker Plant of the Week —






Description: Water hyacinth is a free-floating plant that can grow to 3 feet in height. Leaves are glossy, nearly 6 inches wide and round to oval. They curve inward at the edges. The leaves are attached to a spongy and inflated-looking petiole. The plant produces large purplish flowers with six petals on a terminal spike. The roots are thick, branched and dark-colored.

Habitat and distribution: Water hyacinth is often described as one of the worst aquatic weeds in the world. The plant reproduces through both vegetative means and seed. It forms dense mats that impede recreational activities, clog waterways and irrigation channels, hamper flood mitigation operations, interfere

with wildlife and increase siltation rates. The plant cover prevents sunlight from penetrating into the water, thus impeding growth of submersed plant species. It is easily distributed by water currents, winds and boats. A popular water gardening plant, water hyacinth America in the 1880s and has invaded much of the southern portion of the United States. It has been found in only a few lakes in southeastern Michigan, including Lake Erie Metropark, where it has persisted for years even though it should not have been able to survive cold Michigan winters.



Control / management: Control mechanisms for water hyacinth include mechanical harvesting, herbicide treatment and biological control. Biological control, which has met with limited to substantial success, has included two species of weevils, a moth species and a water mite. Adult weevils and larval moths feed on the petiole and leaves; the mite sucks juices from the plant. The combination of biological control and herbicide treatment has produced mixed results, in part because of the reduction in the insects' food supply. When water hyacinth was grown in controlled pots, the herbicide imazapyr resulted



in reduction in biomass and complete control. Further studies have been suggested for identifying more compatible methods using a combination of herbicide application and biological control agents. Care should be taken to dispose of the plant properly and not transfer it from water gardens or aquaria into water bodies.



### FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- **4. South Shore**, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

### IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
