ello Birch Lakers, What a pleasant turn of events with this weather! We have a nice cool breeze going on! So let's get down to the details. I guess I have to make a retraction. I did not know there is no swimming allowed at Birch Lake at Memorial Park. So this means there is no swimming at the landing or the park. If you see someone swimming at the landing you should contact the following people; the Cass County Sheriff's department at (269) 445-2481 or the Cass County Park's Department 269-445-4456. It is a matter of safety when it comes to people swimming at the landing while boaters are trying to launch. Additionally, vehicles are not allowed to park at the landing unless they have a trailer hitched. The landing is designated only as a boat launch. You would also contact the Cass County Park's Department to express your concern about the porta-potty.

Being the Commodore is not an easy task, and I am happy that so far no one has been hurt on the lake this year. I know some of you might have heard about the tragic accident at Diamond Lake. Please be sure to be safe when you are on the lake. I know you probably get tired of me writing about the common sense rules of boating, but I only reiterate the rules as a matter of safety.

According to Boating Safety here are some suggestions from The Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries:

- Always wear your life jacket.
- Alcohol and safe boating operation just don't mix.
- Know how to swim.
- Read the owner's manual for your boat



dinner, with appetizers and deserts all catered by the Skillet in South Bend.





Commandment #5

t's time to review with you our Commandment # 5, "Thou Shalt Not Allow Phosphorus, Nutrients and other Chemical Elements to Enter Our Lake."

Phosphorus is a chemical element required for all forms of life, necessary for every cellular process that uses energy. It is used most extensively in fertilizer. It is the "limiting factor" in many, and particularly in aquatic, ecosystems. This means it is the variable in which a small change directly causes a substantial change in the output (growth) of the system (plants and algae.)

While virtually all nutrients are considered to be undesirable, preventing or the reducing the volume of phosphorus getting into an inland lake is commonly held to be the single most significant factor in preserving, or advancing, the water quality of inland lakes.

Due to its depth and limited inlets and outlets, it takes some 15 years to drain and replenish all the water in Birch Lake. Whatever we let, or gets, into our lake will be there for a very long time. So our need to ward off the entry of phosphorous, and other undesirable elements, is crucially acute. Accordingly, we ask that you:

- 1) Consider not using any fertilizer on your property
- 2) If you must fertilize, please:
- A. Do so only once per year, in as small a quantity, and as far away from the shoreline, as possible.
- B. Make sure the fertilizer con-
- tains no phosphorus
 C. Recall that the other nutrients in fertilizer are undesirable also.
- 3) Shovel and load out ashes.
- 4) Don't allow leaves or other vegetation to get into the lake.
- 5) Bear in mind that anything left on the surface within our watershed will eventually get into the lake.
- 6) Pick up and properly dispose of animal waste.
- 7) Don't feed any wildlife, particularly not ducks, swans, or geese.
- 8) Between your lawn and shoreline plant a barrier strip, as wide as possible, of deeply rooted native plants at least 12" 24" tall to minimize erosion and catch



undesirable elements from entering the water.

- 9) Consider not using any weed killer or other chemicals on your property. If you must, please do so in limited quantities, away from the lake and not on a windy day or before a rain event.
- 10) Recall that natural shorelines are one of our very best bets at limiting phosphorus in our lake.




Description: Although it looks like a higher vascular plant, starry stonewort is a macro-alga in the same class as native Chara. The plant is light green. Like Chara, the plant has whorls of leaf-like branches around its stem. Unlike Chara, starry stonewort produces a very small, star-shaped, creamy-white reproductive structure called a bulbil. The presence of bulbils, which may appear at any time during the year, is one way to distinguish starry stonewort from Chara.

Habitat and distribution: Unlike the beneficial Chara species, starry stonewort forms dense mats and can reduce native species and interfere with recreation. It has been found to form a physical barrier along the lake bottom, impeding access to the substrate where fish may nest and eliminating spawning activity

where it is growing. waters than Chara and can grow to greate heights, as much as 7 feet. Starry stonewort is native to Europe and western Asia and was first found in the St. Lawrence River in 1978 and then in the Lake St. Clair/Detroit River system in 1983. It was not positively identified in any Michigan inland lake until 2006. By 2011, it had been reported in 119 water bodies in 31 counties.

— Camp Tannadoonah —

Lights, Camera, ACTION!

e're in our Fifth full week session of camp for the summer already! This week's theme is "Big Screen Action," and our committee for this week has been planning a lot of fun and creative ideas to fit the theme.

Sunday night, because it was raining, we had an exciting game of "Name that Tune," with lots of emphasis on movie themes. Monday night was cookout and cabin night. Tuesday night the committee planned an "Amazing Race" around camp, with challenges, songs, and skits to be performed. And Wednesday evening's activity was a Variety Show, with performances by campers and staff.

Sunday afternoon, we had to completely rearrange our check in day schedule because of the thunderstorms that came through right at 4pm when we were getting ready to start the swim test. This is the first time in at least 10 years that I can remember us having to cancel the Sunday swim test because of weather! I guess we've been really lucky on Sunday afternoons! This Sunday, because of the storms, we had to delay the swim test until

Monday morning, which then threw off our whole schedule for Monday.

Every Sunday, we check in a group of between 100 and 150 kids, and we have a pretty tight schedule to follow. The campers arrive between 2 and 4 pm, and are greeted at our welcome center by the counselors and other staff. They check in at the welcome center with Miss Amber to find out their cabin assignments and confirm their activities for the week. Then they go inside and get their heads checked for lice, and their temperature checked to make sure no one comes in with a fever.


After that, a counselor helps them carry their stuff to their cabin and get set up. Then they go to the camp store to get their camp t-shirt and make a deposit for their store account. And finally, they go see the camp nurse to turn in any medications, complete any remaining health paperwork, and discuss any medical concerns with the nurse.

As as soon as a cabin has all of their campers present, they can radio down to the waterfront to say that they're ready to take the swim test. The cabins come down to the lake and a counselor goes over all the rules of the waterfront, including showing them how the buddy system works, explaining the different zones where they can swim, and reviewing safety procedures.

Then they line up to take the swim test. In order to take a boating class (canoeing, kayaking, sailing, paddleboarding, waterskiing, or wakeboarding), campers have to earn either a green or a purple wristband. To get a green wrist band, they have to swim 50 yards (25 on their front and 25 on their back); and to get a purple wrist band, they have to swim 75 yards (25 on their front and 25 on their back and another 25 of their choice). If they are taking swim lessons, they have to show which strokes they can do, so we can place them in the correct level.

We're just 2 weeks from the end of the summer already! It's hard to believe how fast it all flies by each year!



FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- **4. South Shore**, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
