Just kidding about that last part, Pat ... and all the golfers ... are searching for a new chairman to take run the even for the 58th Annual BLYC Men's Golf Outing!


#### **Birch Lake Book Club**



Crew - Counted toward completed races, Points go to skipper of boat





## — Water Quality Report —

#### Commandment #6

ast but not least, let us together explore Commandment #6::"Thou Shalt Remain Informed About Other Important Water Quality Issues"

Midsummer decreases in water clarity are usually the result of;

a) Higher clarity earlier in the year, which allowed more plants to grow at deeper depths, thus increasing the subsequent volume of nutrients and algae (which later decreases clarity).

b) The water from the springs at the bottom of our lake emanating from and laden with the limestone below0 forming calcium carbonate (marl) as it comes in contact with the warmer lake water. This marl is initially suspended in the water column and eventually settles to the bottom, but it becomes suspended again every time the settled marl at the bottom is disturbed, typically by increased boat traffic and waves.

None of the samples tested for e-coli in Birch Lake over the last 10 or more years have shown any dangerous or worrisome amounts of e-coli in Birch Lake.

The term "seaweed" has a negative connotation. At Birch, we are blessed to have numerous aquatic plants growing in the lake. Should you cut or find any cut vegetation, please remove it from the lake.

Avoid swimming in, ingesting, or letting your pets drink from, water in or nearby an algae bloom.

The effects of alcohol and certain medications are increased while on the water due to added stress factors such as sun, heat, wind, wave motion, and engine noise.

85 percent of drowning victims in the United States were not wearing a life jacket.

Should the present method of financing common interests (donations) like water quality become inadequate, our only option will be to ask our local governments to create, control, and ultimately make all decisions for, a special assessment district (S.A.D.) The costs for same will be added to all our tax bills. Thanks for everyones' past generosity. Let's pray that it continues and even grows (because our expenses do).

Although we have some pretty good ideas (Starry Stonewort has already been discovered in the mill pond), we do not know for sure when, exactly where or in what form, the next invasive species will arrive in Birch Lake. But we do



know for sure that it will arrive. Probably sooner than later. Let's hope we have the money on hand to react quickly.

Except for the people living here, the lake is the most significant feature of our homes. The lake is our home, Take care of it.

The lake is a shared possession and a shared responsibility. Make sure to contribute your time and talent to its maintenance and betterment.

The majority of the current WQ members have both served and lived for lengthy periods. Fresh blood, if only for smooth future transitions, would be welcomed.

## — Barker Weed of the Week —

Hydrilla (Hydrilla verticillata [L.f.] Royle)





Description: Hydrilla is a rapidly growing submersed aquatic plant that has small leaves — about 0.5 to 0.75 inch long — occurring in whorls of four to eight around the stem. The leaves have finely toothed margins and may have one or more teeth or spines along the midrib on the underside of the leaf. The rooted plant has long stems that can grow upward from depths of 20 to 25 feet. Hydrilla looks similar to both native Elodea (waterweed) and non-native Egeria (Brazilian water-

weed), but only hydrilla has spines on the underside of the leaf.

Habitat and distribution:
Hydrilla is an aggressive plant that often outcompetes native species. It can grow under lower light conditions than most natives, so it can grow to deeper depths

during summer in warm climates. Although it does produce flowers, seeds apparently do not play a large role in the spread of hydrilla. Rather, hydrilla mainly spreads by plant fragmentation, turions and tubers. The turions are compact, dark green, spiny dormant buds found in the leaf axils. When they break off, they can drift long distances before they eventually sink and form new plants. Tubers, found on the terminal end of underground root-like stems called rhizomes, can remain in a dormant phase for several years but eventually produce new plants. Two varieties of hydrilla occur in the United States. One has male and female flowers on the same plant. The other variety has male and female flowers on separate plants, but only the female plant is found in the United States. The female flower in both varieties is inconspicuous and has three translucent petals. The male flower has three white or reddish petals, but it is usually seen floating on the water surface as whitish-looking debris.

Hydrilla is widespread across the southern United States and in several states along the east coast. Its origin is uncertain; it may have originated in Asia, Africa or Australia. It has been found in several inland states, including Indiana, Ohio, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania and lowa, but has not been reported in Michigan.

Control / management: Preventing hydrilla establishment is the best approach for dealing with this plant species. Once established in a lake, it is extremely difficult to control because of its many modes of reproduction. Herbicides containing copper, diquat, endothall and fluridone may be used to selectively control hydrilla, depending on the other plants growing in the lake, but the herbicides do not affect dormant tubers in the sediment. Neither the tubers nor turions are affected by winter lake level drawdown. Biological control with several species of insects is currently being studied, and continued field monitoring will help provide more information on their



impact on hydrilla. Harvesting is not widely used, often because of necessary repeated harvesting, sometimes as many as six times during one season. Pond dyes may provide some control, particularly in small ponds with little or no outflow during the growing season. A combination of several management techniques may be the most effective means to treat established hydrilla



## — Camp Tannadoonah —

## Just one week left!

t's week 6 at camp, and that means we just have ONE more session after this week! It's hard to believe how quickly the summer flies by every year. A couple years ago, a group of campers wrote a song about camp, and a line from the chorus comes to mind around this time every year: "The days may fly by, but the memories last forever..."

Next weekend (Friday, August 9) is our annual last council fire and candlelight serenade at the lake! If you want to come up for council fire on Friday evening, it will begin around 7:15 pm at the song circle/stage near the dining hall. We do a really cool torch ceremony in honor of the kids who have earned the Order of the Birch Award. Then we will proceed to the waterfront for our candlelight serenade around 9 pm, so come on out on your boats to watch!

This week I wanted to give an update on the forestry project we are undertaking this fall. I know that there was a post already on the Birch Lake Facebook group asking about it. Many of you have probably noticed that they've cleared an area on Harvey

St, just east of Lakeview Dr.

Approximately every 10 years, we do a forestry evaluation. We review all the trees on the property, and they make recommendations about what needs to be done. This year, they have recommended that we take down quite a few of the old growth trees. When we walked the property, they pointed out that our canopy has grown so thick that it's not allowing a lot of the younger trees to thrive.


We have a lot of trees on the property that were planted all at once, in the mid-1940s. In old photos of camp, if you were standing where the dining hall is now, you could see all the way to Harvey St! So we know that a lot of our trees are approximately 80 years old, and we're starting to see quite a few of them losing branches and/or falling altogether. So both for the health of the forest, and for the safety of our campers and staff, we are taking their expert advice.

They've advised us that it will look noticeably more bare in the forest for a year or two, but that things will rapidly start to fill back in. The last time we did this sort of project was in 2008 or 2009, and we took down a lot of trees then. Now you can't even tell anything was cut! So we know it will all fill back in, but that we'll have a year or two of being able to see more daylight through the trees!

We also have a contract with a timber company to purchase as much of the good timber as possible, so not only does the project address safety and the health of the woods, but it will bring in some income for camp in the process. All of those proceeds will be invested back into camp to help us continue to improve.

Every time we do a project like this, we get lots of questions and sometimes concerns for people around the lake. So I wanted to allay everyone's concerns by addressing it and sharing the plans up front. I promise, we're not clearcutting anything! And no land has been sold, and nothing is being developed. The area that they have cleared on Harvey St is their staging area, and it's the same staging area that was used last time, about 10 years ago.





## FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- **4. South Shore**, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

#### IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
