

DNS (Did Not Sail) does not count against season score, however sailor must complete 2/3 of races to qualify for season.

DNF (Did Not Finish), DSQ (Disqualified) scores as one place worse than last place (if 5 boats finished, you would have finished 6th, will be scored as 7th place); DNF, DSQ not counted toward minimum number of races needed CB - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total.

Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.)

Season Place = total season points/number of races attempted Crew - Counted toward completed races, Points go to skipper of boat

## Water Quality Report Commandment # 6

ast but not least, let us together explore Commandment #6: "Thou Shalt Remain Informed About Other Important Water Quality Issues"

1.) Midsummer decreases in water clarity are usually the result of;

a) Higher clarity earlier in the year, which allowed more plants to grow at deeper depths, thus increasing the subsequent volume of nutrients and algae (which later decreases clarity).

b) The water from the springs at the bottom of our lake emanating from and laden with the limestone below forming calcium carbonate (marl) as it comes in contact with the warmer lake water. This marl is initially suspended in the water column and eventually settles to the bottom, but it becomes suspended again every time the settled marl at the bottom is disturbed, typically by increased boat traffic and waves.

2.) None of the samples tested for e-coli in Birch Lake over the last 10 or more years have shown any dangerous or worrisome amounts of e-coli in Birch Lake.

3.) The term "seaweed" has a negative connotation. At Birch, we are blessed to have numerous aquatic

plants growing in the lake. Should you cut or find any cut vegetation, please remove it from the lake.

4.) Avoid swimming in, ingesting, or letting your pets drink from, water in or nearby an algae bloom.

5.) The effects of alcohol and certain medications are increased while on the water due to added stress factors such as sun, heat, wind, wave motion, and engine noise.

6.) 85 percent of drowning victims in the United States were not wearing a life jacket.

7.) Should the present method of financing common interests (donations) like water quality become inadequate, our only option will be to ask our local governments to create, control, and ultimately make all decisions for, a special assessment district (S.A.D.) The costs for same will be added to all our tax bills. Thanks for everyone's past generosity. Let's pray that it continues and even grows (because our expenses do).

8.) Although we have some pretty good ideas (Starry Stonewort has already been discovered in the mill pond), we do not know for sure when, exactly where or in what form, the next invasive species will arrive in Birch Lake. But we do know for sure



that it will arrive. Probably sooner than later. Let's hope we have the money on hand to react quickly.

9.) Except for the people living here, the lake is the most significant feature of our homes. The lake is our home, Take care of it.


10.) The lake is a shared possession and a shared responsibility. Make sure to contribute your time and talent to its maintenance and betterment.

11.) The majority of the current WQ members have both served and lived for lengthy periods. Fresh blood, if only for smooth future transitions, would be welcomed.







# **Barker Kids of the Week –**







#### Ingredients:

- 1 cup olive oil
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup chopped fresh parsley
- 1 lemon, juiced
- 2 tablespoons hot pepper sauce
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 2 teaspoons dried oregano
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 2 pounds large shrimp, peeled and deveined with tails attached
- 6 skewers


#### **Directions:**

• In a mixing bowl, mix together olive oil, parsley, lemon juice, hot sauce, garlic, tomato paste, oregano, salt, and black pepper. Reserve a small amount for basting later. Pour remaining marinade into a large resealable plastic bag with shrimp. Seal, and marinate in the refrigerator for 2 hours.

· Preheat grill for medium-low heat. Thread shrimp onto skewers, piercing once near the tail and once near the head. Discard marinade.

· Lightly oil grill grate. Cook shrimp for 5 minutes per side, or until opaque, basting frequently with reserved marinade.

# **Camp Tannadoonah** —

# By the numbers

e are happy to report that we made it to the end of the 2020 camp season with no illness at Camp Tannadoonah.

Some stats for this summer:

• 10 weeks of Day Camp (June 1 – August 7)

● 5 weeks of Overnight Camp (July 5 – August 8)

- 510 total camper sessions
- 300 overnight sessions
- 210 day camp sessions
- 300 individual campers
- 8 Counselors in Training
- 36 Summer Staff
- 9 Volunteers
- 1 COVID Nurse

• 0 Cases of COVID at camp

• And many, many gallons of disinfectant!

The camper numbers this year were most similar to the numbers we had in 2009, when we had a total of 491 camper sessions for the summer. Last year, in 2019, we had 1001 camper sessions, so just about double what we had this year. This year was also much heavier on the day camp numbers than we have seen in the past. In a typical year, we have about 100 day camp sessions over the course of the summer.

I realized this week that we didn't

have a fall camp OR a spring camp this past year. Spring Camp was canceled due to COVID, of course, and Fall Camp was canceled due to the EEE outbreak that happened in September last year. What a crazy year it has been.

Our year-round staff took it easy this past week, getting some sleep, finishing up cleaning around camp, and catching up on paperwork. But this week we just right back into the chaos! One of the schools we work with for After School programs (Good Shepherd Montessori School in South Bend) decided to push back their start date from August 10 to August 24. So they asked us to run a week-long day camp at the school this week.

We started Monday the 17th with 16 kids; we have between 14 and 20 kids each day, and we're following many of the same policies we did at Tannadoonah this summer. We have two groups, with seven-10 kids in each group, and try to keep the groups separated as much as possible. Everyone – staff and campers – is required to wear a mask this week, all the time except when we're eating. We're trying to be outside as much as possible, and are using a tent that the school set up for us. And just like at camp, we have lots of breaks for hand washing and sanitizing surfaces!

The staff for day camp this week is made up of our core year-round staff (four of us) plus two of our summer staff who haven't gone back to school yet. Good Shepherd plans to go back to school next Monday, on a regular fiveday-a-week schedule, and we will switch from day camp to doing the After School program when they start their regular school days.
