If you have a lake question or if you merely need additional phone books just ask any of them. And if you should see any of them, please give them a hearty "thank you.





Purple Loosestrife on Birch Lake

he Birch Lake Water Quality Committee started the Purple Loosetrife Management Program in 2000. The program has been very effective. In 2000 we had ten sites located on all shores of the lake, some of which were very dense. We continue to monitor for Purple Loosestrife each year and remove the plants that we find. The plants bloom from late June / early July until about the end of August. In early September they begin to drop their dried seeds. Hopefully all blooming plants have been removed by this time to prevent future growth next season.

If you see or suspect you see the plant, please call Bruce Wagner, our Water Quality Committee Purple Loosestrife Specialist (cottage 269-476-2090 or cell 574-286-7183) or any member of the Water Quality Committee to have it checked out. This year Purple Loosestrife was removed from four sites by Bruce's crew and some of the affected property owners. Thank you! We typically find the loosestrife each year in three or four locations and the volume of plants at each site has diminished.

What Is It?

Purple Loosestrife is a plant that was

accidentally introduced to the United States and distributed as an ornamental. It is most easily identified during the flowering season. This spikeshaped purple-pinkish flower can be seen above the water level in ditches, streams, rivers, and other moist shallow water sites. This plant is an upright hearty perennial 4-8 feet tall and most often found in groups.

Effects

Purple Loosestrife invades marshes, ditches, and lakeshores, quickly replacing native wetland plants. These plants form dense stands that wildlife cannot use for food or cover.

Spread

Purple Loosestrife will grow from the roots of an established plant, however the plants spread mainly by seed. Having up to 300,000 per stalk, these tiny seeds can live in the soil and water for many years and can be transported great distances by humans, animals, and water.

Management (Eradication)

Once the plant becomes easily evident (in mid-July) but before it goes to seed (in early September), Bruce will slowly tour the lake in his pontoon



boat and with binoculars searching for Purple Loosestrife, usually about four times per season. You will recognize his pontoon boat by the "Purple Loosestrife" banner hanging on the side. If seen, a volunteer will pull each plant (by its roots), bag, and properly dispose of it, and the Water Quality Committee will be notified as to the plant's location.

If you are interested in helping, either with the survey and/or actual removal, please give Bruce a call. The more the merrier!

THE "SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY"

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues






Birch Lake History -

Seventy five years at Birch Lake

Sometime in the latter months of the summer of 1944 my Grandfather, Charles Partridge, and family, purchased property on the northwest side of Birch lake and started building a cottage, soon afterwards to be named "WeeWood."

My Grandfather purchased, for \$165, a small building in South Bend near Leeper Park, to have lumber and materials for the cottage. He brought it to the lake in four side pieces, taken apart board by board and then re-assembled on lot #17.



There is a unique way of accessing the loft using a drop-down handmade eight foot ladder, pulleyed to the rafters. With space such a premium, my grandfather's ingenuity still amazes me!

The bathroom door is original with the inside decoupaged with Post magazine picture covers, added by my Mother in the early 60's.

Through the year our families our have made several additions with a sun room, deck, enlarged loft space, garage, and more modern conveniences

Summer's over but still busy

ummer 2020 may be over, but up here at camp we're still keeping busy! This week is the first week of school for Good Shepherd Montessori where we run the after school program. We're hoping to average about 10 kids per day at the after school program this fall.

Ranger Mike is busy working on projects all around camp. He's been cleaning brush and weeds, painting buildings and repairing siding, and organizing the sheds so that all the tools and materials are easy to locate. This fall he'll keep busy cleaning up the rest of the tree tops from last year's timber project, clearing trails, and taking care of all the leaves when they start coming down.

Other projects slated for this winter include updating the cook's cabin, with new screens and shutters, and putting pine carsiding on the interior walls to give it a more finished look. We also want to update the bathroom in the nurse's cabin.

This spring we had planned on doing the next phase of our Morris Lodge restoration project, but it had to be postponed due to Covid. Our goal was to completely re-wire and update the electrical and lighting throughout the

building, and also re-do all the plumbing and expand the bathrooms. We had set aside funds for the project from our cash reserves, but ended up having to use those funds for operating expenses instead.

Unfortunately, it's looking like we'll have to put this project off for another year, because things are still so up in the air for the coming year. It's hard to plan for 2021 when we don't know what the situation with Covid is going to be in the spring and summer.

The eventual plan for Morris includes the plumbing and electrical upgrades, finishing the interior walls that are currently open studs, building a deck and fire pit on the lake side of the building, re-finishing the floors, and replacing all of the furniture. When it's completed, it will still have the rustic feel and character it has now, but will be updated and feel more finished.

Other facilities projects that we hope to get done over the next few years include a major renovation of the kitchen in the dining hall, improvements to the boat shed at the waterfront, and eventually building a pole barn for storage of all of our maintenance equipment and to give Ranger Mike a workshop during the winter months.


We have so many idea for things we'd eventually like to see at camp, but many of them are probably far down the road! Someday, we'd like to build a high ropes course and climbing wall, replace the concrete seawall with a stone rip-rap wall, build an outdoor pavilion, and replace some of the old "adventure" cabins with updated buildings. And someday I'd love to have a few winterized cabins and a big lodge, so that we could offer programs throughout the year, instead of just April through October!

We've come a long way in the past 14 years, since I started as camp director in 2006, but we still have many improvements we want to make.



FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- **4. South Shore**, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
