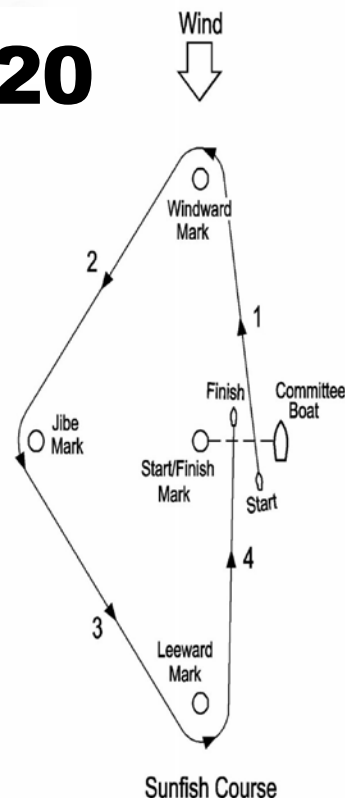
BLYC sailing courses for MC and Sunfish

Note: The Start/Finish line of the MC course is CLOSED EXCEPT TO START AND FINISH THE RACES; sailors MAY NOT cross between the starting mark and the committee boat at any other time during the races.



MC Course
Marks to Port (Mirror Image for Marks to Starboard)
Legs 4 and 5 cannot cross the start/finish line, but they can go around either end of the line.

COMMON SENSE BOATING

- No matter what your speed, always travel in a COUNTER CLOCK-WISE direction
- Go SLOW near other boats, rafts and shore. You are responsible for your wake.
- Take your time and give room - stay 100' from shore, other boats and rafts when you are travelling over wake speed
- When pulling someone on skis or a tube, you MUST have an observer. Watch out for other boats and be sure to add the length of your tow line to the 100' clearance rule
- There must be one USCG-approved LIFE JACKET for every person on board, as well as one throwable device (seat cushion, etc.), a horn, a fire extinguisher, and a valid registration
- PWCs (Jet Skis) must stay 100' away from all boats and other PWCs. Jet skis have many special rules - It is your responsibility to know and OBEY the laws
- Be responsible for everyone on your boat - safety is NO ACCIDENT!

THE SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY

At a Birch Lake Yacht Club regular board meeting during the summer of 2018, a Board member, seconded by others, suggested the Water Quality Committee come up with a relatively simple list of the important do's and don'ts of protecting our lake's water quality, perhaps entitle them the "Ten Commandments," and publish them each week, in every Barker.

What a great idea! Settle on the most important and worthwhile practices which we'd like all to follow. And make them simple, informative, direct (to the point), and repetitive. That way, hopefully, residents and readers would actually come to understand, learn, remember and put into use those practices. At a minimum, they'd be able to easily recall where to find a listing of those practices when needed.

Since then, we've spent a lot of time reviewing past comments made in this space (and elsewhere), trying to find the most pertinent and practical requests we have made of our residents. We have summarized them into the "Six Commandments of Birch Lake Water Quality."

Like all things human, this list is not perfect. We will always be open to reviewing, clarifying, modifying, deleting from, or adding to, this list, and the particulars within. But for now, to start out with, at least we have a list of some of the most important practices to help protect and preserve our lake. As per the original suggestion, our plan is to continue publishing the list of the "Six Commandments" in each issue henceforth.

Each of the six commandments is by definition, in and of

itself, short and simplistic. As such, they all require and deserve further explanation. So, for each commandment we have prepared and will share with you on a rotating basis, that explanation. We will do so at the rate of one/week and only on weeks in which there isn't another worthwhile or more timely or pressing issue to discuss in its place.

Whenever appropriate, we will forgo the next commandment explanation in favor of other pertinent news of recent activities, test results or developments on the lake. Again, feedback is welcome.

So, going forward, in each issue we hope you will find:

- 1) A listing of the Six Commandments
AND
- 2) A report on the current Water Quality happenings
OR

An explanation of, expansion on, one of the Six Commandments.

This restatement of our plan you are now reading will serve as today's report.

THE "SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues

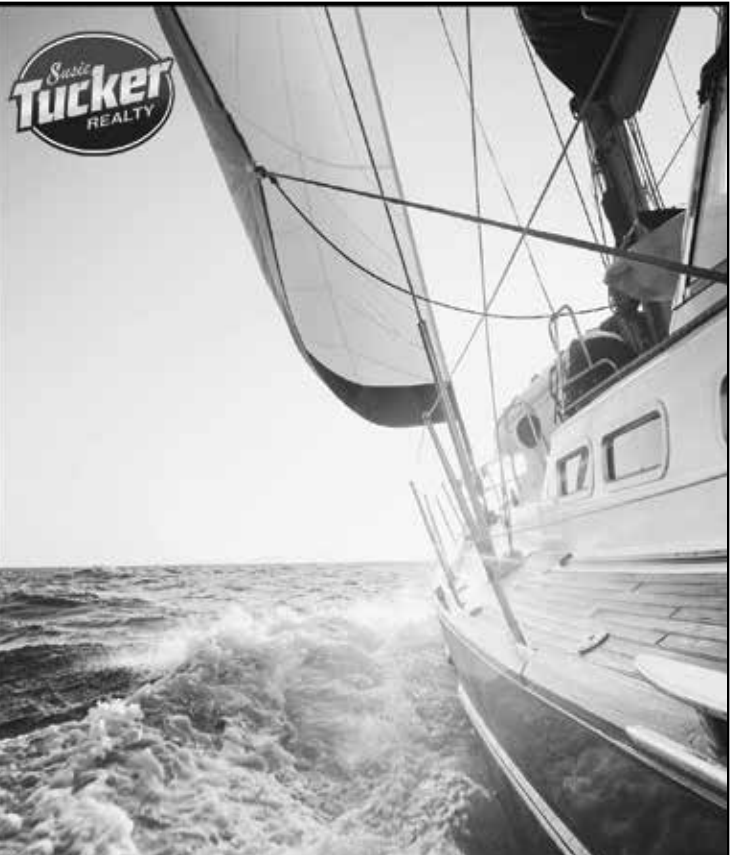

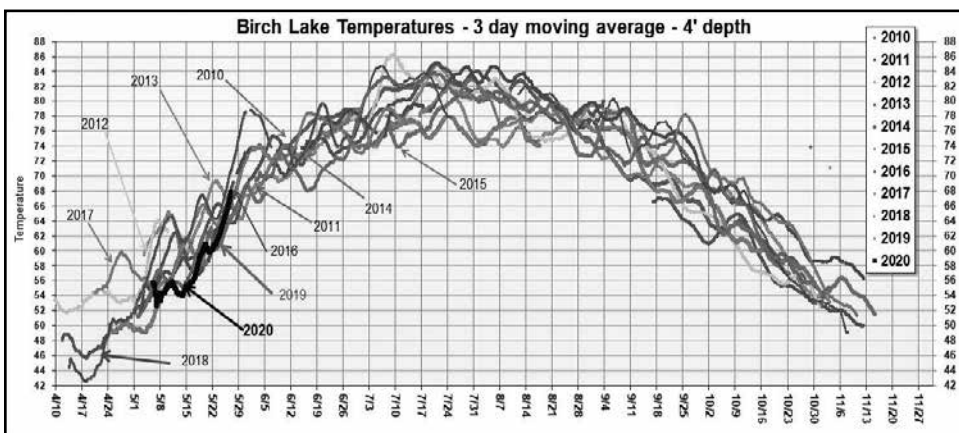
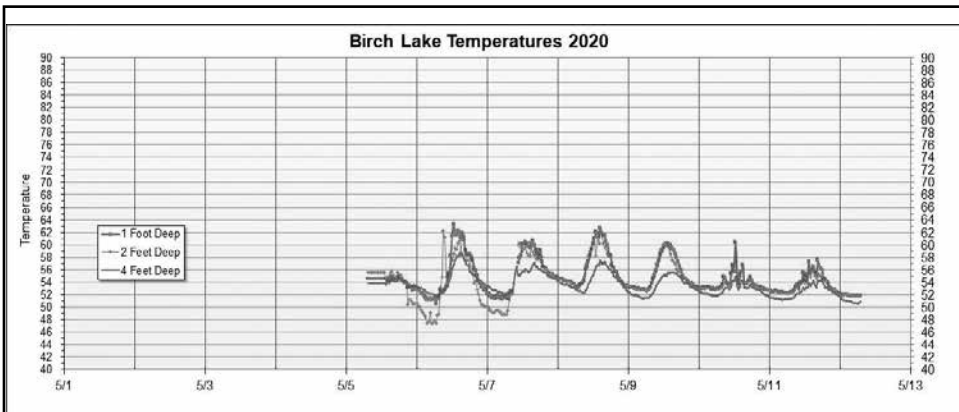

— Camp Tannadoonah —

Wow, hard to believe it will be June on Monday. Somehow, this spring has managed to feel like it's lasted forever, while at the same time flying by.

This Sunday, May 31, was supposed to be the start of our staff training for the summer. Unfortunately, because we've pushed back the start of camp (fingers still crossed for July and August), we've pushed back the start of staff training to June 21.

In the meantime, we've gotten approval from the State of Michigan to offer a Disaster Relief Childcare Program starting June 1. It's a provisional

childcare license designed to provide childcare options to families who are going back to work. Right now, we're only allowed to serve kids whose parent(s) are allowed to return to work under the most recent executive orders. But as more and more people are permitted to return to work, we're hopeful to be able to open up the program to more families.

If you or someone you know needs childcare, please send them to Tannadoonah.org/childcare to check it out! We're offering the program Monday through Friday, from 7:30 am to 6 pm, from June 1 through mid-August.

Because of Coronavirus, we've had

to make a lot of new policies and procedures to keep the kids and staff safe. For instance, we will be having parents drop off and pick up in the circle outside the Welcome Center, and parents must stay in their vehicles. We will do a daily screening of each child, including asking questions about symptoms and checking

their temperature upon arrival. We're stepping up our cleaning procedures, and adding some outdoor hand-washing stations.

Campers will be in stable "cohorts" that won't change throughout the week – so groups of 10-15 campers will be together with 2-3 staff, and they'll be with the same group throughout the week. And we're changing a lot of our meal time procedures – no family-style meals and no salad bar / buffet. Staff will be asked to wear masks when we're doing indoor activities, as well.

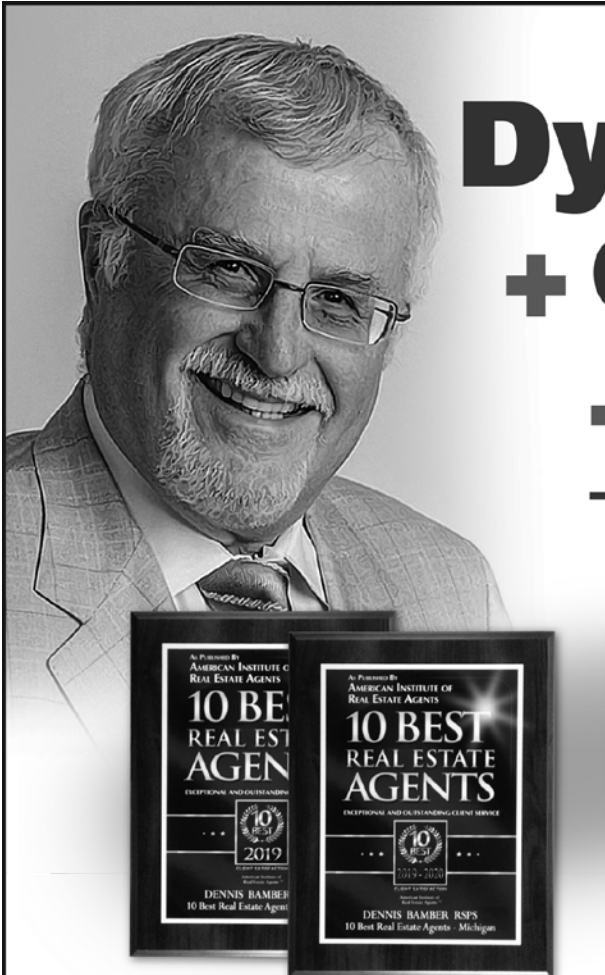

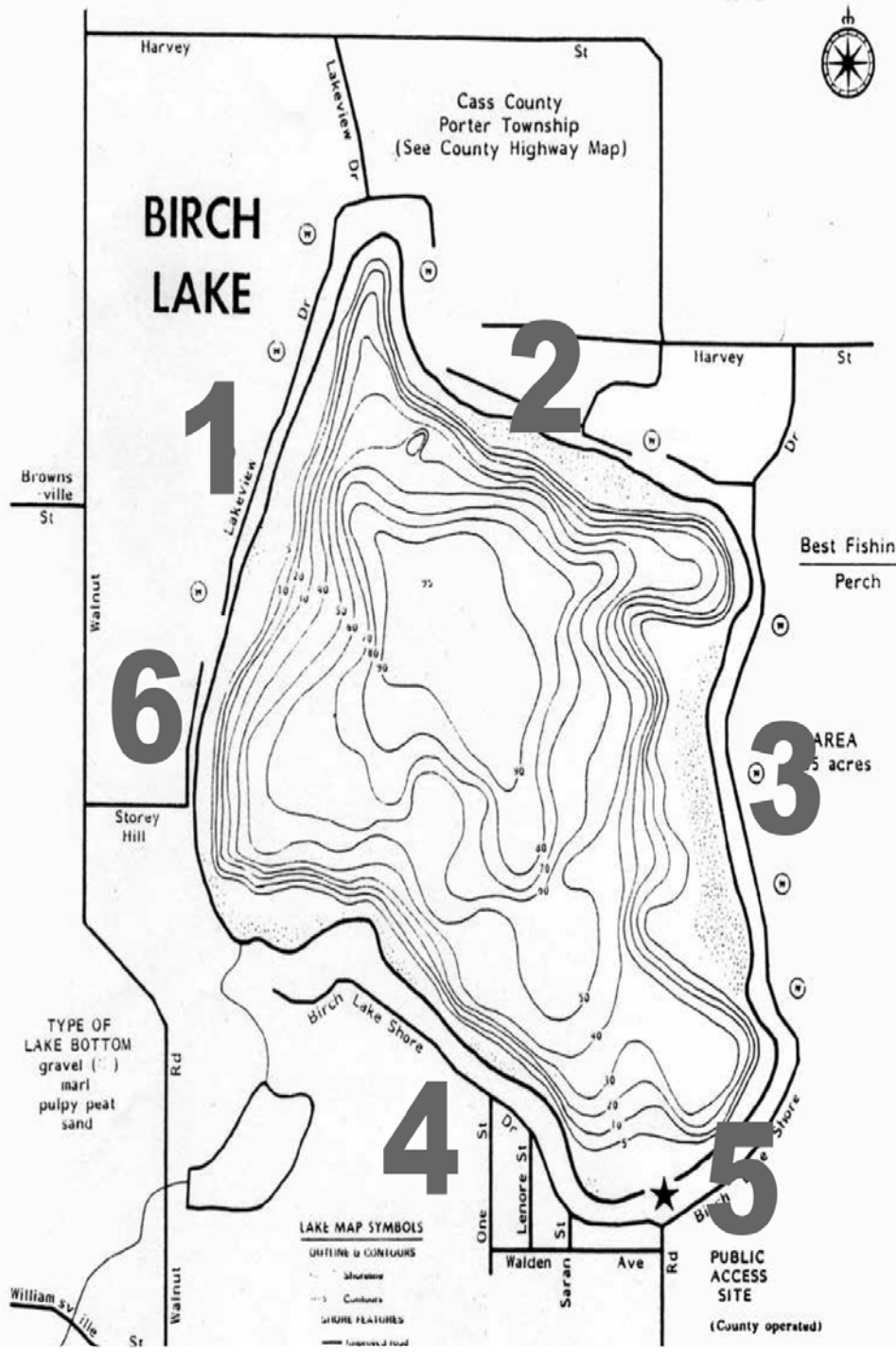

There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
5. South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
