# — Water Quality Report —

# Q & A on Koi

t June's Yacht Club Board meeting, there was some discussion as to the desirability of some koi (goldfish) in Birch Lake. As a result, the Water Quality Committee (WQC) did a little preliminary research and then questioned the DNR's Fisheries Biologist (FB) responsible for the lakes in Southwest Michigan counties, including those in Cass County.

Following is a summary of our questions and his responses.

WQC: A number of years ago, maybe 3 or so large koi were dumped in our lake. They are now some 2-3' long ... Some folks are saying they are bad, eat the eggs of other fish, and, being invasives, will soon take over the lake and crowd out the other, more desirable, species. Therefore, they say, the koi gotta go. A quick check of the internet doesn't yield much cause for concern Your thoughts please?

FB: ... Koi are definitely nonnative and can cause issues in areas they invade. They are very closely related to common carp and were considered subspecies until recently. The impact is similar and usually related to the density. If you see a handful of koi especially during the spring when they are highly visible while spawning, it shouldn't be a major concern. Those few fish will not cause a problem and likely will not reproduce excessively. When densities explode, they can create ecosystem damage. Most notably they root up vegetation while feeding and suspend sediment. This results in shifts toward algae dominated systems that are highly turbid. They have the reputation for eating fish eggs, but mostly they eat invertebrates, but can destroy fish nests while rooting around for prey in the sediment or covering and suffocating eggs ... However, because it seems like you are seeing the same limited number of fish, I don't

think you have anything to worry about.

**WQC:** Three (3) large koi do not constitute an invasion, correct?

FB: I am not considering 3 koi a major invasion. (They are) likely incidental release. If you start seeing young fish or higher numbers, they could start having an impact. Hopefully their reproduction will be limited and they will slowly die off.

**WQC:** Are carp then also considered as non-native..?

FB: Carp are also nonnative.

**WQC:** Should carp then ... be removed when and however possible?

*FB:* Carp have become naturalized and removals are very difficult. It is unlikely casual removal will do much to help ... there have been some ... targeted take attempts, but there are few success stories.

**WQC:** What might we consider as an explosion of density of Koi?

FB: It is hard to say, but we usually determine what portion of the biomass they take up. In populations where carp are a huge problem, they can easily exceed 60 percent of total fish biomass.

**WQC:** Would allowed methods of removing nonnative fish include shooting at them with a gun?

*FB:* No. Taking fish with a gun is not legal. Any gear you have on the water has to be legal ... You must also abide by any local ordinances (e.g. some townships or cities do not allow archery gear).

**WQC:** Are carp regulated as sportfish?

*FB*: No, they are considered a rough fish and can be taken in any number with no size limit if captured by legal means or special permit ...

**WQC:** Any other questions I should have asked?


FB: You are asking the right questions. Generally, we don't get too worried about koi because we already have carp. Managing for fewer nonnative rough fish will improve sportfishing. Ironically, rainbow trout are also not native to Michigan, but because they are valued as a sport fish, they are commonly stocked. It can be all about perspective.

In review of the above, at this time the Water Quality Committee is not a proponent of the killing or removal of koi from our lake.

# THE "SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY"

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues

### Chicken salad with bacon, lettuce & tomato

his chicken salad has a creamy dressing and is best served over crisp lettuce leaves.

Yield:

6 servings

#### Ingredients

- 5 slices bacon
- 3 cups diced cooked chicken
- 1 cup chopped fresh tomato
- 2 stalks celery, thinly sliced
- ¾ cup mayonnaise
- 2 tablespoons minced green onion
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 dash Worcestershire sauce
- 1 pinch salt and ground black pepper to taste
- 12 leaves romaine lettuce
- 1 large avocado, sliced

#### **Directions**

• Step 1

Place bacon in a large skillet and cook over medium-high heat, turning occasionally, until evenly browned, about 10 minutes. Drain bacon slices on paper towels; crumble.

• Step 2

Stir chicken, bacon, tomato, and celery together in a bowl.

• Step 3

Whisk mayonnaise, parsley, green onions, lemon juice, Worcestershire sauce, salt, and black pepper together in a bowl until dressing is smooth. Pour dressing over chicken mixture; toss to coat. Refrigerate until chilled, at least 30 minutes.

• Step 4

Stir chicken mixture and serve over romaine lettuce leaves; garnish with avocado slices.

Bradyen, age 11: "My favorite is meeting new friends.'





# FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- **4. South Shore**, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

### IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
