



### COMMODORE'S COMMENTS

Commodore's Comments #2 June 4, 2022 emorial Day Weekend turned out to be beautiful: sunny, hot, and extremely windy. There was lots of lake activity with skiing, wake boarding, swimming and many boat rides. And out walking, I noticed lots of cars parked in people's drives and the landing was full of fishing boat trailers. Birch Lake was happening!

Those of us that competed in the Memorial Day Weekend Regatta had some crazy sailing. The first race of the season is always a bit nerve-wracking. and if you haven't properly taken the time to test your boat under sail you really don't know what surprises might pop up. Mine was a disconnected outhaul that I jerry-rigged on the boat in the windy conditions. Prior to that incident, back at my pier, I had barely gotten the sail run along the boom when I hit the traveler on the boat and had an immediate goose egg on my front calf which is now a huge bruise. Then before the start of the first race I tipped the boat. I have no idea why the boat tipped but all of the sudden it reached that point of no return when it is going over and there is nothing you can do to stop

it. With the boat tipped I had to jump into the water, and the coldness took my breath away. I got help getting the boat righted, got back in the boat, got the lines all set and got my crew and the races began. Not the smooth pre-race routine for which I had hoped.

The Sunfish and MC sailors sailed three races Sunday and on Monday we finished up with two more races. The last MC race I just had to jibe (a maneuver that can be tricky in very windy conditions) my sail, round the mark and head for the finish line. But not so fast, I had another tipping of the boat on my hands. I fell into the water on top of my crew/husband Tom, and we scurried to right the boat and get back into the race and finish. After that my husband looked at me and said, "Well, that was an adrenalin rush!" And that it was. The sailing was extremely fast, a bit out of control now and then but very fun and even exhilarating.

Thanks to our race committee boat captain Bad Patty Luecht and her trusty crew and to Tom Cassady and Vic Jones for setting and adjusting the course and for Vic doing rescue duty when boats tipped. After races on Monday, Steve Frew invited the sailors to come down to his beach to meet U.S. Sunfish Class Midwest Regional Rep Gail Turluck. 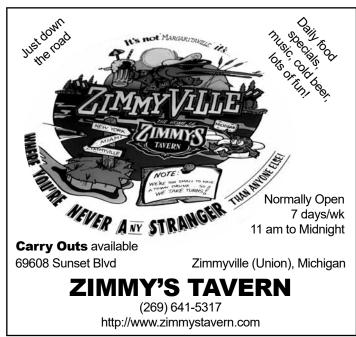

DNS (Did Not Sail) does not count against season score, however sailor must complete 2/3 of races to qualify for season. DNF (Did Not Finish), DSQ (Disqualified) scores as one place worse than last place (if 5 boats finished, you would have finished 6th, will be scored as 7th place); DNF, DSQ not counted toward minimum number of races needed CB - sailor who serves on Committee Boat receives their season average place as of that date - counted toward season total. Season Points are awarded on Square of 40 system (1st = 40 squared = 1600, 2nd = 39 squared, etc.)

Season Place = total season points/number of races attempted

Crew - Counted toward completed races, Points go to skipper of boat



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# Water Quality Report

### The six commandments of Water Quality

t a Yacht Club board meeting in 2018, it was suggested, and supported, that the Water Quality Committee come up with a relatively simple list of the important do's and don'ts of protecting our lake's water quality, perhaps entitle them the "Ten Commandments," and publish them each week, in every Barker.

Thank you for such a great idea! Settle on the most important and worthwhile practices which we'd like all to follow. And make them simple, informative, direct (to the point), and repetitive. That way, hopefully, readers [residents and visitors] would actually come to understand, learn, remember and put into use those practices. At a minimum, they'd be able to easily recall where to find a listing of those practices when needed.

Thereafter, we spent a lot of time reviewing past comments made in this space (and elsewhere), trying to find the most pertinent and practical requests we [and others] have made of our community. Choosing to focus on six [not ten] key precepts, we summarized them into the "Six Commandments of Birch Lake Water Quality."

Like all things human, this list is not perfect. We welcome input, and remain open to reviewing, clarifying, modifying, deleting from, or adding to, this list, and the particulars within. But for now, at least we have a simple summary of the most important practices to help protect and preserve our lake. As per the original suggestion, our plan is to continue publishing the list of the "Six Commandments" in each issue henceforth.

Hopefully you'll find each of the six commandments to be relatively brief and easy to understand. As such, they all require and deserve further explanation. So, for each commandment, we have prepared and will share with you on a rotating basis, that explanation. We will do so at the rate of one/week and only on weeks in which there isn't another worthwhile or more timely or pressing issue to discuss in its place.

Whenever appropriate, we will forego the next commandment explanation in favor of other pertinent news of recent



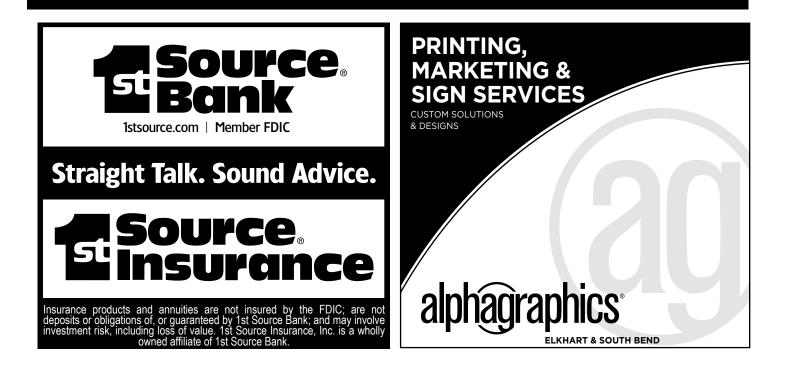
activities, test results or developments on the lake. Again, and as always, feedback is welcome.

Going forward then, in some issues you'll find an explanation of a specific commandment, but in each issue you'll be treated to a reminder/reprint of the Six Commandments listed below.

The "Six Commandments of Birch Lake Water Quality" are:

## THE SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues

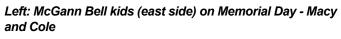

### **Corn salad with creamy Italian dressing**

orn Salad with Creamy Italian Dressing

### Ingredients

Dressing:

RECIPES

- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup mayonnaise <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup red wine vinegar
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup olive oil
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 2 teaspoons water
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon white sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 1 pinch cayenne pepper, or more to taste
- olive oil
- 1 (16 ounce) package frozen sweet corn, thawed
- 1 cup diced roasted red peppers
- salt and ground black pepper to taste
- 5 fresh basil leaves, thinly sliced, or more to taste
- 1 pinch cayenne pepper, or to taste

#### **Directions**

Step 1 - Whisk mayonnaise, vinegar, 1/4 cup olive oil, garlic, water, 1/2 teaspoon black pepper, sugar, 1/4 teaspoon salt, Italian seasoning, and a pinch cayenne pepper together in a bowl until dressing is thick and creamy. Cover dressing with plastic wrap and refrigerate, 8 hours or overnight.

Step 2 - Heat 1 tablespoon olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Cook and stir corn in hot oil until light golden brown and toasted, about 15 minutes.

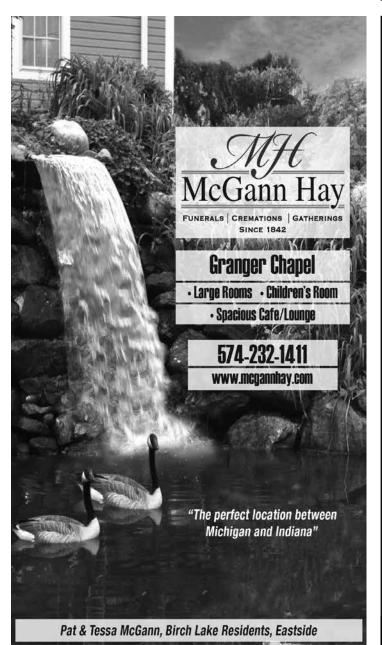


Step 3 - Mix corn and red pepper together in a bowl. Pour enough dressing over corn mixture to coat completely. Season with salt and black pepper.

Step 4 - Stir basil and a pinch cayenne pepper into corn mixture; toss.

We haven't been able to bring any staff over from overseas for the past two years, so we're really happy to have them back this year. We have counselors this year from Scotland, Jordan, England, France, the Philippines, and the Dominican Republic. Plus, US staff from Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Ohio, Kentucky, California, and Arizona.

We are still looking for more cabin counselors and kitchen staff, if you know of anyone 16 and older still looking for a summer position! We are very excited to report that we have found a kitchen manager and she started on Sunday. "Big Momma" Deb will be in the kitchen this summer. She is a former Tannadoonah counselor who is thrilled to return to camp to feed our campers and staff this summer. This week and next week you'll see us down at the lake in the afternoons doing lifeguard training. Don't be alarmed if you hear whistles and the air horn which are our emergency signals – but don't worry, we're just practicing! We train all of our lifeguards on site



each year, to make sure that everyone is trained to our standards for safety, and know all of the facility-specific rules and guidelines for keeping our kids safe at the lake.

This year we will have nine of our summer staff who are certified lifeguards, and will be responsible for guarding during swim times, and teaching our waterfront classes, which include swimming lessons, canoing, kayaking, stand up paddleboarding, sailing, fishing, waterskiing, and wakeboarding! We're also really excited to have some of our sailors from the BLYC sailing group helping teach our sailors this summer. We're looking forward to seeing everyone out on the water!

## IN AN EMERGENCY:

7/14/2018

1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately. 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE **PATIENT** and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom. 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.

4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
