
Well," she said (did I mention her middle name is Precocious?), "Mamie, there is something called 'middle-age,'





Zucchini Patties


excellent way to use up that abundance of zucchini from the garden.

Ingredients

- 2 cups grated zucchini
- 2 eggs, beaten
- ½ cup all-purpose flour
- ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese
- ½ cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- ¼ cup chopped onion
- salt to taste
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil

Directions

- Step 1 Combine zucchini, eggs, flour, Parmesan cheese, mozzarella cheese, onion, and salt in a medium bowl. Stir well enough to distribute ingredients evenly.
- Step 2 Heat oil in a skillet over medium-high heat.
- Step 3 Working in batches, scoop tablespoonfuls of zucchini mixture into hot oil and fry until golden brown, about 2 minutes per side.

Winter Olympics at summer camp

t's Winter Olympics week at camp this week, and it's been very un-winter-like with hot and humid temperatures. Sunday afternoon we had thunder during the time we usually do our swim tests, which threw our whole schedule for the afternoon into a muddle.

On Sunday afternoons after they check in, each cabin goes to the waterfront to take their swim tests. The waterfront is divided into three different areas – beginner, intermediate, and advanced. Usually we run swim tests from 3:30-6 pm every Sunday.

Campers who are non-swimmers, or who choose not to take the swim test get a red band and are in the beginner area, which is enclosed by the pier. When I was a camper and staff member, that enclosed area was called the "crib." In order to get an intermediate (yellow) band, campers must be able to swim 50 yards continuously (the length of the waterfront pier and back). And in order to get an advanced (green) band they must swim 75 yards continuously (down and back and down one more time).

If campers want to take a boating class of any kind, or do waterskiing or wakeboarding, they have to have either a yellow or green band. While we do require all campers to wear life vests on all boats (which is a State of Michigan licensing rule, too), we also want to be sure they

are capable and confident in the water. If something happens while they're out in the middle of the lake (e.g., they fall out of their kayak or tip their canoe), we want to be sure they're not going to panic in the water, or that they have the ability to swim themselves to safety.

This week we have two Birch Lake residents helping with our boating classes at camp – Tom Kuhn has been helping drive one of the waterskiing boats and Patrick Welch is helping with the youth sailing program. Last week we had Pat McGann and Steve Frew helping with the youth sailing program. The sailors were planning to set up a junior-sized course for a race on Thursday or Friday, but unfortunately the weather did not cooperate on either of those days!

We also offer Red Cross swim lessons at camp, which campers can sign up for each week. There are 6 levels, and if they sign up for swim lessons they get tested to determine the appropriate level and then have a 45-minute lesson with one of our waterfront staff each day.

Our waterfront is a busy place! At any given time during the day, there might be 50 or more campers at a time doing waterfront classes. There are waterskiing, wakeboarding, canoeing, kayaking, stand up paddleboarding, sailing, fishing, and swimming classes going on throughout the day every day.



We also have 2 free swim periods — one in the morning and one in the afternoon, which are open times for campers to come swim each day. They last for 30 minutes, and on really hot days we might even have the whole camp down there to cool off all at the same time! If the temperature goes over 90 degrees (F), we call for a mandatory swim time, and send all of the campers and staff to the lake for a dip!

Next time you see us at the lake be sure to wave!



EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR

(AED) locations on Birch Lake



CALL 9-1-1



FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
