

This year, we will again sponsor a food drive for the Food Bank of Cass County. Please contribute with non-perishable foods. Let's help our community!





FLEET CAPTAIN'S CORNER

No wind, sailing canceled yet again, but afternoon sailing beckons

Last Sunday morning, sailing was canceled yet again, because the wind was only 4 mph at our start time of 11 am, and not forecast to improve much for several hours. When a great wind did come up about 3 pm, with no sailboats anywhere to be seen, I knew to expect some good-natured ribbing the next morning from the guys at Monday golf. And the guys didn't disappoint. I always try to explain that a lot of us have family or work responsibilities, so the best time to get all of us together on the starting line has been 11 am for as long as I can remember. But my golf buddies have a valid point: The wind doesn't care about our schedules, and the best wind usually happens in the afternoons. It's a fact of nature. And it's why Camp Tannadoonah holds sailing classes in the afternoon,

Camp Eberhart holds light wind classes in the morning and bigger wind classes in the afternoon, and our neighbors at Eagle Lake Yacht Club hold their races in the afternoons.

Here at BLYC, we may be on pace for a record bad year with our morning starts. We have raced only 12 out of 32 scheduled races so far, and have a cancellation rate of 62 percent. But I'm happy to report that thanks to the generosity of course-setting Captain Tom Cassady, course-setting First Mate Vic Jones, and Committee Boat Captain Ron Niezgodski, who have stepped in to help address this problem, we now have the option of offering our sailors starting times as late as 1 pm if necessary to get sailable wind. In other words, we are now dipping our toes into the waters of afternoon sailing. We'll still do our best to start races at 11 am as per tradition, but we'll have early afternoon starts as an option.

We'll see how this works out. If it makes some races happen that otherwise wouldn't happen, that will be a good thing. \sim FC Steve

Water Quality Report —

LUE GREEN ALGAE -- Found throughout our environment is an organism referred to as blue green algae (also referred to as cyanobacteria). In truth it is not algae but a bacteria that has photosynthetic pigments (chlorophyll among them) that can convert sunlight into useful chemical forms of energy and give off oxygen as a byproduct just like algae and plants. It is believed that these are some of the oldest life forms on earth and responsible for the initial generation of oxygen in the atmosphere. They are a part of the ecological web and can be used in some industrial processes. Their mere presence is not an issue in bodies of water, but if their numbers increase dramatically they can cause a problem, especially forms that produce toxins.

So, the question is "do we have an issue at Birch Lake?" The answer is essentially - no, but that does not mean we do not have to be alert and watch for signs of a "bloom" of these blue green algae. On our lake "blooms" are rare, very localized, and very time-limited events. However, this year Terry Dugan has seen signs of blue-green algae the day after a Wednesday night storm the night before, and strong sun on a calm lake the following morning. One was also reported by the Kuhn's during the same time frame from the west side.

Normally, in bodies of fresh water, blooms are associated with high nutrient lakes, which we are not. However, under

the right conditions mini blooms can occur. It may present as a sort of fluorescent or shiny surface scum with bluish or greenish tints, early in the morning as the sun shines causing the blue green algae to float to the surface as they become surrounded by bubbles, most commonly after a storm or relatively high winds followed by dead calm in the morning sun. It can also look like streaks of greenish algae on the surface.

Please differentiate this from the common mats of decaying residues of the multiple hatches we get of mayflies, midges, and other insects which have larval forms in the water.

Also, we get lots of tree seeds and pollen, but these are usually in the spring and early summer, along with little mats of very green algae. With waves and wind, the bloom will disperse. Should you see something like this as you arise in the morning adjacent to the shoreline, do not let your dogs drink from the lake in the area and avoid walking or wading in that area until it has been dispersed.

Again, only a very few have been seen or reported over the years. The few seen, have been on the south or west side where the sun shines in early AM on a still lake. A reason for the fortunate lack of any blooms lately may be related to the almost disappearance of zebra mussels. These invaders had coated all hard surfaces for a number of years, but have

been very, very dramatically reduced in number recently. Does not mean gone but sort of in an ecological hibernation. Researchers at MSU have done studies



that correlated zebra mussel infestations with increased blue green algae numbers in low nutrient lakes like Birch. It is believed that the zebra mussels filter out normal algae and effectively spit out blue greens, altering the algae landscape. However, the zebra mussels are more abundant this year and this may portend some increase in small blooms of blue green algae.

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff. III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.

IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural

- Shorelines. V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues







Caesar grilled chicken wings

hese Caesar chicken wings add a tangy twist to a barbecue favorite!

Prep Time: 10 mins Cook Time: 30 mins Additional Time: 4 hrs Total Time: 4 hrs 40 mins Servings: 6

Ingredients

- 1 (8 ounce) bottle Caesar salad dressing
- ¼ cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese
- 3 pounds chicken wings, cut apart at joints, wing tips discarded
- 1 tablespoon lemon pepper

Directions

- 1. Combine Caesar dressing and Parmesan cheese in a bowl.
- 2. Place wings in a large resealable plastic bag; pour in dressing-cheese marinade. Seal bag; toss to coat and refrigerate at least 4 hours.



- 3. Preheat grill for medium heat (300 to 350 degrees F, 150 to 175 degrees C), and lightly oil the grate.
- 4. Remove wings from bag; discard marinade. Heavily sprinkle all sides of wings with lemon pepper.
- 5. Place wings on grill. Cook, covered, turning several times, until cooked through and internal temperature reaches 165 degrees F (75 degrees C); 20 to 30 minutes. Transfer wings to a platter.

— Camp Tannadoonah —

End of season is coming fast!

he end of the camp season is coming up fast! Next week is our last week of camp, and this year it's a special one. Every five years we have a tradition called "the Patteran." It dates back to the 1940s, and happens in years ending in 3 and 8. There is a time capsule containing records from all of the previous Patteran years, with logs of what the campers did while they were at camp, stories from their weeks here, signatures, and sometimes small items that campers added to the jar.

The word Patteran means a sign or indicator to point the way or give direction to other travelers. Throughout the week, we will give clues to the campers about the location of the Patteran, and on Thursday we will go on a hunt throughout camp to find it. Then we take it back to Morris Lodge and open the jar, and read to them from the logs and records that are contained inside.

In the past, we called this session of camp "Gypsy Week." However, the term "gypsy" is actually a derogatory and offensive descriptor used to refer to individuals who are from the Romani or Roma culture. As a result, we have decided to stop using the term and are just referring to it as Patteran Week.

One of the traditions that goes along

with Patteran Week is that each cabin is given a color, and they tie-dye bandanas in their color, and write a song to represent their group. We also have special songs that we only sing during this one week every five years. Sometimes it's hard to teach them because only a handful of us know the songs! We tell special stories and legends around the history of the Patteran, and it's an exciting week for campers who have been here in the past to see the logs from their prior Patteran weeks.

Next Friday (August 11) will also be our end-of-the-season closing campfire. Throughout the summer, campers have been working towards earning their "Order of the Birch" award. 

EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake

There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
