Water Quality Report —Commandment #5

It's time to review with you our Commandment # 5, "Thou Shalt Not Allow Phosphorus, Nutrients and other Chemicals to Enter Our Lake."

Phosphorus is a chemical element required for all forms of life, necessary for every cellular process that uses energy. It is used most extensively in fertilizer. It is the "limiting factor" in many, and particularly in aquatic, ecosystems. This means it is the variable in which a small change in the quantity of phosphorus DIRECTLY CAUSES A SUBSTANTIAL CHANGE in the output (growth) of the system (plants and algae.)

While virtually all nutrients are considered to be undesirable, preventing or the reducing the volume of phosphorus getting into an inland lake is commonly held to be the SINGLE MOST SIGNIFICANT FACTOR in preserving, or advancing, the water quality of inland lakes

Due to its depth and limited inlets and outlets, it takes some 15 years to drain and replenish all the water in Birch Lake. Whatever we let, or gets, into our lake will be there for a very long time. So our need to ward off the entry of phosphorous, and other undesirable elements, is crucially acute. Accordingly, we ask that you:

1) Consider not using any fertilizer on your property

2) If you must fertilize, please:

A. Do so only once per year, in as small a quantity, and as far away

from the shoreline, as possible.

- B. Make sure the fertilizer contains no phosphorus
- C. Recall that the other nutrients in fertilizer are undesirable also.
- 3) Shovel and load out ashes.
- 4) Don't allow leaves or other vegetation to get into the lake.
- 5) Bear in mind that anything left on the surface within our watershed will eventually get into the lake.
- 6) Pick up and properly dispose of animal waste.
- 7) Don't feed any wildlife, particularly not ducks, swans, or geese.
- 8) Between your lawn and shoreline plant a barrier strip, as wide as possible, of deeply rooted native plants at least 12" 24" tall to minimize erosion and catch undesirable elements from entering the water. [This barrier strip may also help discourage geese from entering, and making deposits upon, your lawn area.]
 9) Consider not using any weed killer
- 9) Consider not using any weed killer or other chemicals on your property. If you must, please do so in limited quantities, away from the lake and not on a



windy day or before a rain event.

10) Recall that natural shorelines are one of our very best bets at limiting phosphorus in our lake.


THE SIX COMMANDMENTS OF BIRCH LAKE WATER QUALITY

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues












Barker delivery







Simple BBQ Ribs

his BBQ ribs recipe may be different than others you've tried, but for super tender ribs, give it a try! Lean, country-style pork ribs are boiled in seasoned water until tender, then finished up in the oven under a blanket of your favorite barbecue sauce as they bake to perfection. That's it! Back to simplicity, back to country life.

Prep Time: 5 mins Cook Time: 1 hr 45 mins Total Time: 1 hr 50 mins

Ingredients:

2 ½ pounds country-style pork ribs 2 tablespoons kosher salt 1 tablespoon garlic powder 1 teaspoon ground black pepper 1 cup barbeque sauce

Directions

Place ribs in a large pot and cover with water. Stir in kosher salt, garlic powder, and pepper, and bring water to a boil over medium heat. Continue to boil until ribs are tender, 40 to 45 minutes.

While the ribs are boiling, preheat the oven to 325 degrees F (165 degrees C).

Remove ribs from the pot, and place them in a 9x13-inch baking dish. Pour barbeque sauce over ribs. Cover the baking dish with aluminum foil.

Bake in the preheated oven until the internal temperature of the pork has reached 160 degrees F (70 degrees C), 1 to 11/2 hours.

Serve hot and enjoy!

ur third annual grown up camp event – also known as a gathering of friends – is coming up at the end of September! This event is open to anyone 21 and older – you don't have to be a Camp alum to participate. We hope to keep offering this laid-back, fun weekend for adults for years to come. Registration is open and you can find all the information at tannadoonah.org/gathering

There are three options for participating: you can sign up for the full weekend (Friday morning through Sunday morning), or just come out for the day on Saturday, or join us for dinner and cocktails and a fun activity on Saturday evening. You can choose to stay in a cabin at camp, or you can sleep at home if you choose. The weekend is very relaxed and flexible. You can choose to participate in as many planned activities as you like, or you can hang out by the campfire and spend time with friends.

On Friday, we will have a continental breakfast, time to move into cabins and walk around camp to see all the projects we've been working on the past few years, and traditional camp activities like archery, nature hikes, canoeing, kayaking, tennis, basketball, and crafts.

We will serve lunch and dinner, and will have evening pontoon cruises

around the lake. After dinner there will be an evening activity similar to what we do with campers during the summer – but probably no capture the flag! After evening activity the past two years, many participants chose to hang out by the campfire and sing camp songs and share stories late into the night.

Saturday we have a full breakfast, followed by more camp activities for the morning. Saturday's schedule includes yoga in Morris Lodge, camp stories and history with Miss Toody, and more crafts, archery, and boating. 



EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake



CALL 9-1-1



FOR EMERGENCY USE ONLY ALARM WILL SOUND



There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- **6. Southwest Shore**, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
