





Regular season kicked off with nice wind, good racing

he BLYC Sailors enjoyed a really nice Sunday of races on June 4. starting with the celebrated return of the "Voice of the Nightingale," Bad Patty Luecht, and her Com-

mittee Boat crew of Commodore Deb Hall and Good Patti Russwurm. A big "Thank You!" to them, and also to course-setting Boat Captain Tom Cassady and First Mate Vic Jones, all of whom make Birch Lake sailboat racing possible.

It looks like we are in for an exciting season of racing in both of our fleets. In the MC Fleet, Barb Cassady scored a second

and two firsts to Scott Troeger's first and two seconds, putting Barb in a tie with Scott for first place in season point average at 1561 points each. They are followed closely by Patrick Welch who went 3-3-4 in his season opener, putting him in third place with a season point average of 1419. Not far behind the leaders is the tight group of Bob King in fourth place with 1394 average points, Phil Vitale in fifth place with 1382, and Bill Luecht in sixth place with 1345.

And in the Sunfish Fleet, Rick Russwurm went 1-1-2 and holds a narrow lead

for the season at 1574 average points. Close behind is Stewart Spratt, who made his season entrance with a 3-race series of 2-2-1, putting him at 1547 average points. Pat McGann took 3rd in the last race and is in third place for the season at 1446 average points, trailed by Bob Niezgodski, who won 3rd place in the first two races, and has a season point average of 1419.

At this writing, the weather for next Sunday looks good, and we hope it stays that way so the fun can continue! ~F.C. Steve

— Water Quality Report — Comments and observations

he full annual report from the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program which we participate in. We hope you will actually sit down and read this educational document. It not only summarizes the data from our participation in the monitoring program but provides some description, definitions, and meanings of the various monitoring parameters.

As was stated we had a negative bump in the sum of the parameters indicating some potential nutrient loading to the lake. Likely, only time and future seasons will determine the slope of this trend and the level of concern we should have. It should be noted that other than the invasive species, we are seeing a nutrient issue and not a pollution issue.

This does not mean that pollutants are not entering the lake, just that we are currently not measuring them {we typically do so later in the season and have not, in the last decade or so ever encountered a worrisome amount} and so have no basis for considering this an issue at this time. However, we would like to make a few comments at this time relevant to the health of the lake and things we might see and be concerned about.

Each spring we have a number of annual hatches and this year was not different. The annoying ones are the black midges in early spring and the mayflies in mid to late May. Although irritating, these are actual signs of a healthy lake. Thus, they may be bothersome but enjoy them for what they say about the lake. The larval exoskeletons do make a mess for a few days following hatches.

A second and longer lasting phenomenon is the coating of the lake in tree seeds and pollen as the different species go through their reproductive cycle. On quiet mornings especially, the pollen will look like a gray coating on the lake, as various seeds (example cottonwood) float onto the lake they can serve as a magnet for pollen and algae on the surface. With sun and warm days the filamentous algae will surround the seeds or any attachment site (insect parts) producing floating rafts which can look somewhat unsightly. They will float during the day because the algae generate bubbles of oxygen that keeps them afloat. Wind, waves, and time will see the end of this. But it is not necessarily a short season.

The relatively mild winter seems to have permitted a bumper crop of seeds and pollen this year due to healthy tree stock. As pollen and seeds are carried to the lake (these add to the nutrients in the lake), we also get nutrients and potential pollutants carried into the lake from snow melt and rain in the lake ba-




sin. We are in a basin and have shallow lawns for slowing down runoff. Thus, as we add more impermeable surfaces runoff is more prominent especially since we do not have room or the will to create 10 to 20 foot natural vegetation barriers between our lawns and the lake. Do try to limit runoff and create some barrier at the waters edge.

Additionally, a continued reminder not to accelerate your boats in shallow water. The prop wash can be very powerful and especially with the larger heavier more powerful wake boats. Prop wash can be 20 feet in depth re-suspending sediment and elevating nutrient levels in the water column. Thus get to the drop off before pushing the throttle. Everything counts.




1. Make marinade: Whisk together honey, soy sauce, oyster sauce, brown sugar, ginger, ketchup, garlic, parsley, onion powder, cayenne pepper, and cinnamon in a medium bowl; pour into a resealable plastic bag.

2. Place pork tenderloins into the bag; coat with marinade, squeeze out excess air, and seal the bag. Marinate in the refrigerator for at least 1 hour or up to 24 hours.


Preheat the grill for medium heat and lightly oil the grate.
 Remove pork tenderloins from marinade; shake off excess.

Discard remaining marinade.

5. Cook pork tenderloins on the preheated grill until no longer pink in the center, 20 to 30 minutes, turning occasionally.

Campers will come this weekend!

e will check in our first group of campers on Sunday, with 96 campers attending week 1. We're up to 1120 for the summer, with a goal of 1200. We still have openings for most overnight weeks, but our day camps are full or close to full for the summer.

I wanted to introduce you to our Camp Director, Miss Gabby. This is her second year as Camp Director. Gabby was named the new Camp Director for Camp Tannadoonah at our 100th Anniversary Event in September 2021. Previously she served as the School Year Programs Director. She has been involved with Camp Tannadoonah since 2010 as a camper, counselor, and assistant camp director.

Gabby graduated from Purdue University in December, 2019 with a Bachelor's degree in Psychology. Prior to working for Camp Fire, she worked at a child care center. In her free time, Gabby enjoys spending time with her family which includes two golden retrievers, Stella and her new puppy Rudy.

Every day at camp, we are on the go non-stop from 7 am to 10 pm, and staff are usually up far past 10 doing work for the next day. They're long days for everyone, but we also know the impact we have on the kids, and how important the work we do is. But we're definitely ready for a long rest in August when camp is over!

For many of us on staff, we were campers here at Tannadoonah before working at camp. IN AN EMERGENCY:

7/14/2018

1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately. 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE **PATIENT** and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom. 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.

4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
