
We are keeping with the off-site parking this year, so please carpool, or come on foot or by golf cart. Look for the signs on where to park if you need to drive.

Water Quality Report —

t is not unusual at this point in the summer to see a change in the clarity of the water on our lake. By this we mean the transparency, or how clearly we can see the bottom of the lake at different depths. This is measured on a weekly basis by the water quality committee (Jennifer Ball now) using what is called a secchi disk and recorded weekly from May until September. The highest transparency is seen usually in late May to potentially early June. With the warming of the water, enhanced sunlight, and increased lake activity transparency degrades. So, while a secchi disk may be visible at anywhere from 25-40 feet in the spring it may only be possible to see it a 7-10 in mid and late summer. There are three somewhat interrelated causes for the degradation of transparency. Transparency is also a part of the measuring stick used to ascertain the health of the lake and changes with

1. Suspended sedimentary materials. Disturbance of the lake bottom results in sediment being brought into the water column and depending on size some of these particles may remain for extended periods of time. In the spring with little boat traffic this will be primarily due to wind from storms. When the lake has not yet developed a thermocline (a tenuous barrier between the warmer lighter water and the heavier colder water) storm disturbance can extend deep into the lake. With the development of the thermocline this storm effect is reduced and we can

reach maximum transparency before extensive boat traffic. However, starting especially during the Memorial Day weekend, boat traffic increases and prop wash can extend 20-25 feet deep into the lake washing up clouds of sediment. We cannot eliminate this but we can reduce this. Watch yourself on the east side of the lake as there is a shallow area that extends 400 + feet into the lake. Speeding in that area can suspend considerable sediment. Also, wait until past the drop off to accelerate a boat pulling a skier, tuber, etc. This can reduce some prop wash sediment. Additionally, on high boat traffic days, wave action on the shoreline will cause scouring of the lake bottom increasing sediment suspension. Suspending sediment has a secondary affect on the next topic as phosphorous tends to be trapped in the sediment. Suspending it can release additional quantities of phosphorous, a primary nutrient in the lake.

2. Algal Growth. As the water warms and sunlight is abundant, algae responds in the presence of nutrients with a growth spurt. The higher the nutrient level the more algae reproduce, increasing algal density and thus decreasing transparency. Decreasing sediment suspension can have an affect by decreasing nutrient levels and thus the amount of algae which grows. We have modest levels of phosphorous, and algal growth as measured by chlorophyll levels is usually modest as well. However algal growth is a significant factor in reducing transparency. Nu-

trient levels can be affected by fertilizers, road runoff, runoff from firepits, etc.

3. Calcium Carbonate precipitation. We are a spring fed lake. A lot of the spring water percolates through limestone and brings with it some dissolved calcium carbonate. As the water warms calcium carbonate tends to precipitate (come out of solution) forming microscopically small but light scattering particles. This can have a real effect on transparency. This is why the lake takes on a slightly grayish cast rather than just green due to algae. As the year progresses this calcium carbonate precipitate finds its way to the bottom forming marl. Yes, we are a marl lake and some of us have more than oth-

So please think about the causes of change in water clarity as you use and enjoy the lake. Prop wash, fertilizers, and runoff

The Six Commandments of Birch Lake Water Quality

- I. Thou shalt prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).
- II. Thou shalt minimize surface runoff.
- III. Thou shalt minimize the effects of waves.
- IV. Thou shalt protect and expand Natural Shorelines.
- V. Thou shalt not allow phosphorus, nutrients, and other undesirable chemical elements to enter our lake.
- VI. Thou shalt remain informed and active about other Water Quality issues





Homemade Peri Peri Chicken

his peri peri chicken recipe features a great spicy marinade for an African dish that's great for a barbecue. Nice with salad and fries, but I like adding it to a pita with salad and garlic Greek yogurt (3/4 cup Greek yogurt and 3 cloves of crushed garlic with finely chopped chives). Ingredients

- 1 cup fresh lemon juice
- ¼ cup paprika
- · 2 tablespoons hot chili powder
- · 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 ½ teaspoons chopped fresh ginger
- 1 ½ teaspoons salt
- 4 bone-in chicken breast halves

Directions

- 1. Stir together lemon juice, paprika, chili powder, garlic, ginger, and salt in a large bowl until well combined. Add chicken; rub until well coated and marinate in the refrigerator for 3 hours.
 - 2. Preheat a grill for medium heat and lightly oil

the grates.

3. Place chicken onto the preheated grill; discard marinade. Cook, turning occasionally, until skins are slightly charred and the juices run clear, about 30 minutes. An instant-read thermometer inserted into the center of chicken should read at least 165 degrees F (74 degrees C).

— Camp Tannadoonah —

Half way through already!

e've reached the halfway point of the summer – we're currently midway through Week four, and have four weeks left with campers! It goes so fast every year.

It's hard to believe that this is the point of the year where we start planning for next summer already. We've tentatively set the camp dates for 2024, and I've started building out the budget for next year. A lot of people ask Gabby and I what we do "the rest of the year." While the off-season is certainly not as intense as summer is at camp, we definitely stay busy throughout the year.

Camp Tannadoonah is owned and operated by Camp Fire River Bend. In addition to Camp T, we operate two before and after school programs at local schools. Miss Carmen, our CIT director during summer camp, is our School Year Programs Director, and oversees the staff, students, and curriculum at each of these programs.

At Sam Adams Elementary in Cassopolis, we have before school programming every morning (Monday through Friday, every day of the school year) from 7:15 to 8:45 am when school starts. And every afternoon from 3 to 6pm after school lets out. That program typically has 30-35 kids every morning, and averages 12-15 students every afternoon.

We also have after school at Good Shepherd Montessori School in South Bend. That program is only after school, and runs from 3:15 to 5:30 every afternoon of the school year. And for both schools, we offer all day programs on scheduled days off school (like teacher professional development days, or President's day).

Our Camp Fire council also runs the National Camp Fire store online. Our basement at the Welcome Center is FULL of Camp Fire clothing, books, and emblems. In Camp Fire programs, kids can earn "emblems" for their accomplishments – similar to scouts earning badges. We get orders from the other 47 Camp Fire Councils across the country, and ship them out to them.

EMERGENCY HEART DEFIBRILLATOR (AED) locations on Birch Lake

There are six (6) automated external defibrillator units on Birch Lake. The boxes that contain these devices are located at the following locations (see map):

- 1. West Shore, Sheffieck home, 62875 Birch Lakeview Dr.
- 2. North Shore, Smitley home, 14859 Birch Northshore Dr.15046
- 3. East Shore, Vitale home, 63174 Birch Rd.
- 4. South Shore, Eberhart home, 15046 Birch Lakeshore Dr.
- South/East Shore, Troeger home, 63696 Birch Rd.
- 6. Southwest Shore, DeYoung home, 63255 Storey Hill St.

All units are on the ROAD SIDE of the property and accessible by vehicle or on foot.

IN AN EMERGENCY:

- 1. CALL 911 and report the emergency and the patient's location immediately.
- 2. Pull the box open, remove the orange-colored unit, TAKE IT TO THE PATIENT and open the device by pressing the white lever at the bottom.
- 3. An automated voice will guide you through the setup and use of the defibrillator. Follow the instructions as they are given.
- 4. Continue to follow the instructions as given, and stay with the patient until help arrives.
