



Oh rats ... at Birch Lake?

For some reason several rats have been seen in the last two weeks at Birch Lake (and one has been seen squashed in the road on the east side). In the interest of safety, here are some things you can do if you see a rat:

■ Keep children and pets away: Keep

the rat away from children and pets.

- Use poison or traps: If you use poison wear protective clothing and put the poison in places other animal can't access; humane traps can help catch rats without killing them.
- Remove food sources: Rats move to areas with food, water and shelter.
- Store food in airtight containers.
- Use repellents: Try peppermint oil, hot pepper flakes, garlic, clove oil, ammonia, or instant potatoes.
- Clean the area: Clean thoroughly, especially if you've seen droppings.
- Close entry points: Rats can enter through small gaps in walls, foundations, and basements.
- Get a cat: Cats are natural enemies of rats and can deter them from seeking shelter in your home.

Theft Alert!

We have been notified of two thefts in the area in recent days; a pontoon boat trailer was stolen from the Cove, and a pickup truck was stolen from the driveway of the farm south of the lake. During the holiday weekend be especially alert, safeguard your belongs, lock your house and car, and don't leave items lying outside. — Water Quality Report —

Start by seeing the bottom

ho doesn't enjoy a lap around the lake and seeing the bottom through crystal clear water? That's one of the many qualities of Birch Lake that most other lakes in our area simply can't offer. Known as one of the cleanest lakes in the lower peninsula, Birch Lake is unique in its natural beauty, depth, and spring fed water quality which is ultimately reflected in its ever-increasing property values. Your Water Quality Committee wants to keep it that way.

This year, the committee will be submitting articles to the Barker that not only educate but analyze things like water transparency, chlorophyll-a testing, phosphors testing and oxygen levels – all important trends that impact our lake. We'll do that using data from the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program (CLMP), an agency sponsored by the State of Michigan and Michigan State University. Look for the State of The Lake article coming soon.

Other important topics this year will include an update on two peren-

nial menaces of the lake: Eurasian watermilfoil and curly-leaf pondweed, which were found last year (again). These exotic aquatic plants are on the most wanted list to contain and/ or eliminate. You'll learn about our efforts to do just that and how we are constantly on the lookout for two other nasty weeds: starry stonewort and hydrilla which haven't shown their ugly leaves yet. Constant monitoring and lake-friendly treatment have kept them at bay so far.

We'll also be discussing topics that we do have some control over. Things like lake-friendly seawalls, farm and surrounding area fertilizer runoff, our testing procedures, the fish stocking program being studied by the DNR, even helpful suggestions to responsibly operate wake boats on Michigan's inland lakes – information from the Fisheries Division we'll share to hopefully minimize any damage to the lake bottom or shoreline.

Finally, we'll continually ask for 100 percent participation of the lake community to donate to the Water Quality/Invasive Species Fund. To



donate, go to birchlakeyachtclub.com and follow the links. Without your help, our beautiful lake could degrade quickly. So please, donate to the fund. We'll do the testing, the treatment and the education – we need you to do the funding.



Several of us raced last year at the Corey Lake Regatta, and learned that a tractor is far more agile and faster that a car or truck for this purpose.

So last Saturday afternoon before the Spring Dinner, Ben Wozniak generously volunteered his time and his tractor, and the sailors pitched in to get the job done. In less than 2 hours, masts were raised on 3 MC's boats launched, and with the experience gained, we should be able to process more boats even faster on August 17. Thank you, Ben!!!

August 18. Raising masts can be tricky and can require up to five people per boat, as depicted below. We'd like to be able to raise more than one mast at a time. No experience is needed, and both sailors and non-sailors are welcome, so if you would like to help, just let us know! Thank you!







— Birch Lake Memories -

My family's love affair with Birch Lake began nearly 90 years ago and continues to this day. It's an understatement to say I was fortunate to grow up spending each of my summers at Birch from 1955 until 1969 when college came calling.

The day school was out in Ohio we moved to our cottage on the NE side named Wit's End. In those days nearly every cottage had a name. We stayed until the last minute of summer, returning with only enough time to buy new Levis for the upcoming school year.

I often say I had an idyllic "Tom Sawyer like" childhood and the Birch Lake experiences, adventures, and memories that lend credence to that statement have resided with me through the decades. It's difficult to believe these memories go back nearly 70 years...some seem like yesterday.

So here we go with a few memories, in random order.....

- At a very young age "going exploring" by learning to row a boat while it was tethered to the pier. We were small enough then that two of us sat side by side on the middle seat, each manning one oar.
- Going so often to the ice cream parlor in the lower level of Lazy Lodge that I became the only kid I knew who didn't like ice cream anymore.

- Playing, at various times, baseball, football, golf and Frisbee in a large field behind Lazy Lodge, and then cooling off with water from a pump we had to prime to get started. We all drank from a tin cup hanging from the pump ... best tasting water I have had to this day.
- Walking everywhere barefooted. Everywhere. Even completely around the lake, which became an almost nightly event. Even the two miles up to "Billyville" for penny candy from Lanky when it was so hot on the road you had to walk on the white line which was just cool enough not to burn your feet.
- Picking wild raspberries and trying to sell what we didn't eat to get some money for that penny candy.
- There is still nothing as tasty as a fully ripe mulberry.
- Learning NOT to stand barefoot too near the electric prod you pushed into the ground to bring the night crawlers out for bait.
- · Fishing with really long bamboo poles.
- Sleeping on the ground under a simple canvas tarp staked out over a rope between two trees deep in the woods behind the cottage. We called it a tent.
- Using car wax to polish the inside of large clam shells to sell as ash trays. Surprisingly profitable as everyone smoked back then.
- Liberating apples from the trees in an orchard along Harvey street behind Tannadoonah (still barefooted).

- Sitting on the front deck of rowboats and jumping in to catch turtles and eventually collecting a \$1 prize for first place in the turtle race at an annual festival in Jones
- · Playing king of the raft.
- Covering ourselves in baby oil and laying in the sun for hours to get tan (who knew back then) and rubbing lemon juice in our hair to help the sun bleach it out. It was, after all, the era of the Beach Boys.
- Diving off the dock and seeing who could go the furthest underwater. When we tired of that we stacked benches at the end of the dock and ran the full length to see how many we could dive over.
- My mother told me she swam across Birch at age 16 and I felt I had to beat that so I swam across and back at 15 with my father rowing in front as my safety boat.
- Landing the ultimate job for a teenage boy...handyman at the all girls Camp Kiloqua, then discovering the campers were too young and the counselors too old to preclude any imagined summer romances.

For many years we didn't have a telephone or a TV; and I never missed them. I hope the young "lakers" today will put down their screens long enough to make similar memories. I can assure them it's worth it.

Start of a new year at camp

t's the start of another summer at the lake, and with it the beginning of another summer of camp. This summer is the 19th summer since I accepted the job of Camp Director for the 2006 season. We've seen so many changes at camp in those 19 years.

This winter we had several very exciting projects happening at camp. We created a new entrance into camp off of Harvey St, which will serve as the main entrance on Sundays during check in, and Saturdays during check out. Traffic will come in the new gate, into the sports field to park, and then exit through the old driveway. This will alleviate a lot of the difficulties with traffic on Harvey St during our check in and check out times, and will make it a lot easier for families to get in and out of camp.

We also tore down four cabins that were built in the 1930s and constructed four brand new buildings in their place. Rotary, Exchange, Exchangettes, and Luta Koda were four of the original cabins that were built in the late 30s when camp moved to Birch Lake. They housed up to 10 campers and 2-3 staff, and we called them the "adventure cabins" because they were quite primitive.

The new buildings are in the same basic locations as the old adventure cabins, but are raised up off the ground and have a large deck connecting each pair of buildings to provide space for campers to hang out, play cards, and talk to friends. The new cabins are named Sassafras, Tamarack, Firefly, and Lotus. The new cabins give us 16 additional beds in camp each week. They will be finished next week, just in time for the start of our season!

We're about 3 weeks away from the start of camp, and we currently 996 campers registered for the summer, with a goal of 1200 for the year. Our staff have already started arriving, and this week our leadership team is at camp preparing for the arrival of the rest of the staff.

The leadership team consists of our Camp Director (Gabby), two head counselors, the waterfront director, and the kitchen manager. In addition, we have a new assistant camp director this year, but she will be arriving a little late, after she wraps up a year of teaching in London. Meghan will be joining our year-round team, as assistant camp director in the summer, and the program lead at one of our After School programs during the school year.

On Sunday (Memorial Day weekend), the rest of our staff will arrive for two weeks of staff training before the first group of campers come on June



9. This year we have 14 staff members traveling from overseas to be a part of our camp team! They are from India (2), France (2), Scotland (1), Ireland (1), Nigeria (1), Colombia (3), Mexico (1), and Great Britain (3). We also have staff and volunteers from 9 different US states. It's exciting to be able to bring such a diverse group of counselors to camp to work with our campers!

We'd like to give a big thank you to Tom Mosier, who donates his time every spring to inspect our wells, make any necessary repairs, and chlorinate the wells before we do our water tests. Thank you, Tom, for helping us get camp ready to open each year!






